DELEGATED AUTHORITY TO DONATE DISTRICT SURPLUS PROPERTY FOR EDUCATIONAL, TRAINING AND PUBLIC SERVICE PURPOSES (ALL DISTRICTS) (3 VOTES)

SUBJECT

The Consolidated Fire Protection District of Los Angeles County (District) is requesting delegated authority to donate District firefighting surplus property and equipment to authorized nonprofit public service organizations and educational agencies for educational, training, and public service purposes, in accordance with State law and County policies.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD ACTING AS THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CONSOLIDATED FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT OF LOS ANGELES COUNTY:

1. Delegate authority to the Fire Chief, or his designee, to donate District surplus property and/or equipment to authorized nonprofit public service organizations and educational agencies for educational, training, and public service purposes, in accordance with State law and County policies.
2. Authorize the Fire Chief, or his designee, to execute any related agreements, transfer documents, receipts, and ancillary documents necessary to implement and complete such donations, subject to approval as to form by County Counsel.
3. Require the District to notify your Board, at least two weeks in advance, of all donations to be made pursuant to this delegated authority and provide the Board with two weeks to respond to the District regarding said donations.
4. Find that the above recommendations are exempt from the requirements of the California

Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15061 (b)(3) of CEQA.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

The District periodically identifies surplus District property and equipment that is no longer needed for operational purposes but may continue to provide value for educational, training, and public service purposes. Approval of the recommended actions will allow the District to efficiently donate surplus equipment to authorized nonprofit public service organizations consistent with Government Code section 25372 while maximizing the beneficial use of District assets.

The proposed donations are intended to support educational, training, and public service purposes.

The recommended delegated authority will streamline the donation process for surplus property that has little or no value to the District but remains useful for educational instruction, firefighter training, and community benefit programs. Donations may include equipment, tools, training materials, and other surplus property determined appropriate for donation in accordance with County procedures.

Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

Approval of the recommended actions is consistent with the County Strategic Plan Goal III, Strategy III.3, Pursue Operational Effectiveness, Fiscal Responsibility, and Accountability, by maximizing the useful life and public benefit of County assets in a fiscally responsible manner.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

There is no impact to net County cost. The proposed donations involve surplus property and equipment determined deemed to be no longer required or useful for District operations.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

Countywide procedures for the disposal and donation of surplus County property authorize the donation of surplus property to Board approved authorized nonprofit public service organizations and agencies.

This request is authorized pursuant to California Government Code Sections 25372, which authorize the Board of Supervisors to donate surplus real or personal property to qualifying nonprofit organizations.

All donations executed pursuant to this delegated authority will comply with applicable County surplus property procedures and will be reviewed and approved as to form by County Counsel where required.

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)

Approval of the recommended actions will not negatively impact current District operations or services. The proposed delegated authority will enhance administrative efficiency and support educational, training and public service programs through the responsible donation of surplus District property.
