**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HERMOSA BEACH,
CALIFORNIA, CALLING AND GIVING NOTICE OF A GENERAL
MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2026, FOR
THE ELECTION OF CERTAIN OFFICERS AS REQUIRED BY THE PROVISIONS
OF THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA RELATING TO GENERAL LAW
CITIES**

WHEREAS, a General Municipal Election for the City of Hermosa Beach ("City") shall be held on November 3, 2026, for the election of members of the City Council pursuant to the provisions of the laws relating to general law cities in the State of California; and

WHEREAS, the election is to elect three (3) City Council seats; and

WHEREAS, the City consolidates its municipal elections with Los Angeles County ("County") pursuant to California Elections Code ("Elections Code") sections 10401 and 10403, and the County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk administers operational aspects of the election; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to call and give notice of the election and authorize the City Clerk to take all actions necessary to conduct the election in accordance with law.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HERMOSA BEACH, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE, AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Incorporation of Recitals. The recitals above are true and correct, and are hereby incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2. Election Called. A General Municipal Election is called and ordered to be held in the City on Tuesday, November 3, 2026, for the purpose of electing three (3) Members of the City Council for the full term of four (4) years pursuant to the requirements of the laws of the State of California relating to general law cities.

SECTION 3. Election Administration. The ballots to be used at the election shall be in the form and content required by law.

a. Coordination. The City Clerk is authorized, instructed, and directed to coordinate with the County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk to procure and furnish any and all official ballots, notices, printed matter, and all supplies, equipment, and paraphernalia necessary for the conduct of the election; and to take all actions necessary to conduct the election in accordance with the Elections Code.

b. Vote. That the polls and vote centers for the election shall be open at seven (7) a.m. of the day of the election and shall remain open continuously from that time until eight (8) p.m. of the same day when the polls and vote centers shall be closed pursuant to Elections Code section 10242; except as provided in Elections Code sections 14212 and 14401.

c. Conducting Election. That in all particulars not recited in this Resolution, the election shall be held and conducted as provided by law for holding municipal elections.

d. Notice. That notice of the time and place of holding the election is given and the City Clerk is authorized, instructed, and directed to give further or additional notice of the election as required by law).

e. Tie Vote. That in the event of a tie vote, the City Council shall proceed in accordance with Elections Code section 15651.

f. Authorization. The City Council authorizes the City Clerk to administer said election and all reasonable and actual election expenses shall be paid by the City upon presentation of a properly submitted bill.

SECTION 4. Certification. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution; cause the same to be entered among the original resolutions of the City; and make a minute of the passage and adoption thereof in the records of the proceedings of the City Council.

SECTION 5. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HERMOSA BEACH, CALIFORNIA, REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES TO RENDER SPECIFIED SERVICES TO THE CITY RELATING TO THE CONDUCT OF A GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2026

WHEREAS, a General Municipal Election for the City of Hermosa Beach ("City") shall be held in the City on November 3, 2026; and

WHEREAS, the City consolidates its municipal elections with the County of Los Angeles ("County") pursuant to California Elections Code ("Elections Code") sections 10401 and 10403, and the County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk administers operational aspects of the election; and

WHEREAS, in order to conduct the election efficiently and in accordance with law, the City desires to request that the County provide specified election services; and

WHEREAS, the City will reimburse the County for all costs associated with providing such services.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HERMOSA BEACH, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE, AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Incorporation of Recitals. The recitals above are true and correct, and are hereby incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2. Election Services Requested. The City Council requests the County Board of Supervisors to permit the County Election Department to prepare and furnish the following for use in conducting the election pursuant to Elections Code section 10002:

- a. A listing of county precincts with the number of registered voters in each so the City may consolidate election precincts into City voting

precincts, and maps of the voting precincts;

b. A list of polling places, vote centers, and poll workers the County uses for its elections;

c. The voter record of the names and addresses of all eligible registered voters in the City in order that the City's consultant may:

(1) produce labels for vote-by-mail voters;

(2) produce labels for voter information guides;

(3) print rosters of voters and street indexes;

d. Voter signature verification services as needed; and

e. Election equipment and assistance from the County as needed pursuant to state law.

SECTION 3. Reimbursement. The City shall reimburse the County for all services performed pursuant to this Resolution upon completion of the work and presentation of a properly approved invoice..

SECTION 4. Transmittal. The City Clerk is authorized and directed to transmit certified copies of this Resolution to the County Board of Supervisors and the County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk, and to take all actions necessary to effectuate the purposes of this Resolution..

SECTION 5. Certification. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution; cause the same to be entered among the original resolutions of the City; and make a minute of the passage and adoption thereof in the records of the proceedings of the City Council.

SECTION 6. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HERMOSA BEACH, CALIFORNIA, ADOPTING REGULATIONS FOR CANDIDATES FOR ELECTIVE OFFICE PERTAINING TO CANDIDATE'S STATEMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2026

WHEREAS, California Elections Code ("Elections Code") section 13307 authorizes the governing body of a local agency to adopt regulations pertaining to materials prepared by candidates for a municipal election, including the costs associated with candidate statements; and

WHEREAS, a General Municipal Election for the City of Hermosa Beach ("City") shall be held on November 3, 2026, for the election of members of the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to establish regulations governing candidate statements for the election and to allocate the costs associated therewith in accordance with Elections Code section 13307.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HERMOSA BEACH, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE, AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Incorporation of Recitals. The recitals above are true and correct, and are hereby incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2. Candidate Statements. Each candidate for elective office to be voted for at the election to be held in the City on November 3, 2026, may prepare a candidate's statement on an appropriate form provided by the City Clerk pursuant to Elections Code section 13307.

a. The statement may include the name, age, and occupation of the candidate; and a brief description of no more than two hundred (200) words of the candidate's education and qualifications expressed by the candidate personally.

b. The statement shall not include party affiliation or membership or activity in partisan political organizations. The statement shall be filed in the form required by the City Clerk at the time the candidate's nomination papers are filed.

c. The statement may be withdrawn, but not changed, during the period for filing nomination papers and until 5:00 p.m. of the next working day after the close of the nomination period.

SECTION 3. Foreign Language Policy. Candidate's statements will be translated into all languages required by the County of Los Angeles ("County") pursuant to Section 203 of the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965 as amended (Section 10503 to Title 52 of the U.S. Code). The County will print and mail voter information guides and candidate's statements to all voters in English. The County will mail separate voter information guides and candidate's statements in the required languages to only those voters who are on the County voter file as having requested a voter information guide in a particular language. The County will make the voter information guides and candidate's statements in the required languages available at all vote centers, on the County's website, and in the Elections Official's office.

SECTION 4. Payment

- a. Translation Costs. The candidate [shall] [shall not] be required to pay the cost of translating the candidate's statement into any language that is not required pursuant to federal or state law but is requested by the candidate.
- b. Printing Costs. The candidate shall be required to pay for the cost of printing the candidates statement the candidate's statement in English in the main voter pamphlet. The candidate shall be required to pay for the cost of printing the candidate's statement in a foreign language required in the (1) main voter pamphlet and (2) facsimile voter pamphlet.

- c. Estimation of Total Cost. The City Clerk shall estimate the total cost of preparing, printing, handling, translating, and mailing candidate statements filed pursuant to this section, including costs incurred to comply with the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965 as amended; and shall require each candidate filing a statement to pay the candidate's estimated pro rata share in advance to the City as a condition of having the candidate's statement included in the voter information guide.
- (1) The estimate is an approximation of actual costs and may vary depending on the number of candidates filing statements and other election-related factors. Accordingly, the City Clerk may (on a pro rata basis) bill each candidate for additional actual costs incurred or refund any excess amount paid based on the final actual cost of preparing, printing, handling, translating, and mailing candidate statements.
- (2) If the estimated payment is insufficient, the candidate shall pay the balance due upon notice from the City Clerk. If the estimated payment exceeds the actual cost, the City Clerk shall refund the excess amount on a pro rata basis within thirty (30) days after final actual costs have been determined.

SECTION 5. Administration. All translations shall be provided by professionally certified translators. The City Clerk shall allow bold type, underlining, capitalization, indentations, bullets, and leading hyphens to the same extent and manner as allowed in previous City elections. The City Clerk shall also comply with all recommendations and standards set forth by the California Secretary of State regarding occupational designations and other matters relating to elections.

SECTION 6. Additional Materials. No candidate will be permitted to include additional materials in the voter information guide.

SECTION 7. Distribution of Resolution. The City Clerk shall provide each candidate or the candidate's representative with a copy of this Resolution at the time nominating petitions are issued.

SECTION 8. Repeal of Prior Policies. All previous resolutions establishing City Council policy on payment for candidate statements are repealed.

SECTION 9. Applicability. This Resolution shall apply only to the General Municipal Election to be held on November 3, 2026.

SECTION 10. Certification. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution; cause the same to be entered among the original resolutions of the City; and make a minute of the passage and adoption thereof in the records of the proceedings of the City Council.

SECTION 11. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
