**FISCAL YEAR 2026-27 LEADERSHIP TABLE FOR REGIONAL
HOMELESS ALIGNMENT MEMBERSHIP SLATE
(ALL DISTRICTS) (3 VOTES)**

SUBJECT

Adopt the Fiscal Year (FY) 2026-27 membership slate as confirmed by the Leadership Table on Regional Homeless Alignment (LTRHA) at its annual organizational meeting on June 18, 2026.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD:

Dear Ms. Mahin:

As Co-Chairs of the Leadership Table on Regional Homeless Alignment (LTRHA), we are enclosing the Fiscal Year (FY) 2026-27 LTRHA membership slate as confirmed by the LTRHA at its annual organizational meeting held on June 18, 2026.

The August 8, 2023 Board of Supervisors motion (Board motion) established the LTRHA membership be composed of:

- a) The Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA).
- b) Department heads (e.g., the General Manager of the City of Los Angeles Housing Department; the County's Director of Mental Health, Director of Health Services, and Executive Director of Racial Equity; and the heads of any County or City homeless entities).
- c) Member(s) representing the community of persons with lived expertise.
- d) Member(s) representing services providers.
- e) Member(s) representing philanthropy.
- f) Member(s) representing academia.
- g) Member(s) representing the business community.
- h) Member(s) representing education systems.
- i) Member(s) representing the Faith Community.
- j) Member(s) representing the veteran community.
- k) Member(s) representing the labor community.
- l) Member(s) representing the Metropolitan Transportation Authority.
- m) Member(s) representing public housing authorities.

The LTRHA Bylaws define membership composition in alignment with the August 8, 2023, Board motion. Per the Bylaws, members representing heads of County and City agencies, regional and joint powers agencies, and housing authorities (Public Sector members) shall be appointed by those agencies and will serve as ex-officio officers.

Per the Bylaws, "The Chairs will determine a fair, equitable and transparent process for selecting these members, that may include nomination, application, or some other logical process for identifying members for the community leader member seats." As the LTRHA Chairs we developed a process that identified members who are community leaders representing key sectors that serve people experiencing homelessness and/or possess subject matter expertise relevant to the implementation strategies for regional goals.



In the development of this proposed slate, we first took inventory of existing membership terms. Of the 17 inaugural Community Sector seats, eight had terms expiring in June 2026. In line with the LTRHA Bylaws, we directed an ad hoc Membership Subcommittee to (1) assess all seats with terms expiring, and (2) determine whether the subcommittee would recommend the member extend their inaugural term by 12 months or conduct active recruitment to fill their seat:

With input from the Membership Subcommittee, the LTRHA (1) confirmed that four members (representing the Academia, Business, Lived Experience, and Service Provider sectors) would extend their inaugural terms by 12 months; and (2) conducted active recruitment in April-May 2026 for the four open Community Sector seats representing Business, Labor, Philanthropy, and Service Provider Organizations. Following a comprehensive assessment of applications received for the open seats, we have recommended five new members to serve on the LTRHA representing these sectors.

Aligned with the mandate of the August 8, 2023, Board motion, the enclosed FY 2026-27 membership slate (Exhibit A) includes members representing the categories outlined in the Board motion, including five new Community Sector members with terms expiring in June 2028, existing Community Sector members with terms expiring in June 2027, and Public Sector members who serve in an ex officio capacity.

On June 18, 2026, the FY 2026-27 LTRHA Membership Slate was confirmed by the LTRHA at its annual organizational meeting in accordance with its Bylaws. Co-Chairs Dusseault and Santana presided over the vote of the FY 2026-27 Membership Slate. Per the Bylaws, the LTRHA will present, by letter to the Board, a full membership slate each year. All members of the LTRHA shall serve at the pleasure of the Board.

Member Celina Alvarez (Housing Works) was also confirmed as the new Community Sector Co-Chair at the LTRHA's June 18, 2026 annual organizational meeting, replacing Co-Chair Santana's seat. Celina's 12-month term is set to begin on July 1, 2026.

Upon receipt by the Board, the LTRHA will consider the FY 2026-27 Membership Slate approved.
