

RESOLUTION NO. 26-47

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL, CITY OF LA VERNE, CALIFORNIA, CALLING FOR THE HOLDING OF A GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2026, FOR THE ELECTION OF CERTAIN OFFICERS AS REQUIRED BY THE PROVISIONS OF THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA RELATING TO GENERAL LAW CITIES.

WHEREAS, under the provision of the laws relating to general law cities in the State of California, a General Municipal Election shall be held on Tuesday, November 3, 2026, for the election of Municipal Officers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of La Verne as follows:

Section 1. That pursuant to the requirements of the laws of the State of California, relating to General Law Cities, there is called and ordered to be held in the City of La Verne, California, on Tuesday, November 3, 2026, a General Municipal Election for the purpose of electing three (3) Members of the City Council for a four-year term.

Council Member, District 1 for a four-year term

Council Member, District 3 for a four-year term

Council Member, District 4 for a four-year term

Section 2. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 10002 of the Election Code of the State of California, the City Council requests the Registrar Recorder/County Clerk of the County of Los Angeles to conduct the General Municipal Election.

Section 3. That the notice of the time and place of holding the election is given and the Deputy City Clerk is authorized, instructed, and directed to give further or additional notice of the election, in time, form, and manner as required by law.

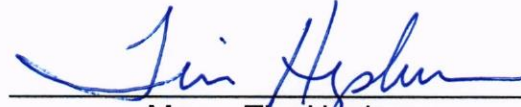
Section 4. That in all particulars not recited in this Resolution, the election shall be held and conducted as provided by law holding municipal elections.

Section 5. That in the event of a tie vote (if any two or more persons receive an equal and the highest number of votes for an office) as certified by the Los Angeles County Registrar/Recorder County Clerk, the City Council in accordance with the Election Code Section 15651(a), shall set a date and time and place and summon the candidates who have received the tie votes to appear and will determine the tie by lot.

Section 6. That the Deputy City Clerk is hereby directed to forward a copy of this Resolution to the Registrar Recorder/County Clerk of the County of Los Angeles.

Section 7. The Mayor shall sign and the Deputy City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and thereupon the same shall take effect and be in force.

RESOLUTION NO. 26-48

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL, CITY OF LA VERNE, CALIFORNIA, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES FOR CONSOLIDATION OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE'S GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2026, PURSUANT TO SECTION 10403 OF THE CALIFORNIA ELECTION CODE AND TO RENDER SPECIFIED SERVICES TO THE CITY RELATING TO THE CONDUCT OF A GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of La Verne called a General Municipal Election to be held on Tuesday, November 3, 2026, for the purpose of electing three members of the City Council in districts 1, 3, and 4 for a four year term; and; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that the General Municipal Election be consolidated with the Statewide General Election, to be held on the same date, and that within the City the precincts, voting centers, and election officers of the two elections be the same, and that the County Elections Official canvass the returns of the General Municipal Election, and that the election be held in all respects as if there were only one election; and; and

WHEREAS, the California Election Code Section 10002 authorizes the City to request by resolution that the Board of Supervisors authorize the County Elections Official to conduct specified election services..

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of La Verne as follows:

Section 1. That pursuant to the requirements of Section 10403 of the Elections Code of the of State of California relating to General Law cities, the City Council has called for an election to be held on Tuesday, November 3, 2026, a General Municipal Election for the purpose of electing three (3) members to the City Council, for a four-year term. One (1) for District 1 and one (1) for District 3, and one (1) for District 4.

Section 2. That the City Council further requests the Board of Supervisors to consent and agree to the consolidation of the City of La Verne's General Municipal Election with the Statewide General Election to be held on Tuesday, November 3, 2026, and that the Los Angeles County Registrar Recorder/County Clerk Election Division take all necessary steps to hold a consolidated election.

Section 3. That the Los Angeles County Registrar Recorder/County Clerk Election Division is authorized to canvass the returns of the General Municipal Election. The election shall be held in all respects as if there were only one election, and only one form of ballot shall be used. The election will be held and conducted in accordance with the provisions of the law regulating the Statewide or special election.

Section 4. That the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors is hereby further respectfully requested to place upon the same ballot as that provided for the Statewide General Election to be held in the County of Los Angeles on Tuesday, November 3, 2026, the names of the candidates for the offices of:

Council Member, District 1 for a four-year term
Council Member, District 3 for a four-year term
Council Member, District 4 for a four-year term

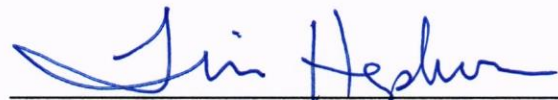
Section 5. That the City of La Verne recognizes that all necessary expenses incurred by the Los Angeles County Registrar Recorder/County Clerk Election Division in performing these services shall be paid by the City of La Verne.

Section 6. That in all particulars, not otherwise specifically provided in this Resolution, the Election shall be held and conducted as provided by law.

Section 7. That the Deputy City Clerk is directed to file an original certified copy of this Resolution with the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors and a copy with the Los Angeles County Elections Official.

Section 8. The Mayor shall sign and the Deputy City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and thereupon the same shall take effect and be in force.

RESOLUTION NO. 26-49

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL, CITY OF LA VERNE, CALIFORNIA, ADOPTING REGULATIONS FOR CANDIDATES FOR ELECTIVE OFFICE PERTAINING TO CANDIDATES STATEMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2026.

WHEREAS, Section 13307 of the Elections Code of the State of California provides that the governing body of any local agency adopt regulations pertaining to materials prepared by any candidate for a municipal election, including costs of the candidate's statement..

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of La Verne as follows:

Section 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS - Pursuant to Section 13307 of the Elections Code of the State of California, each candidate for elective office to be voted for at an election to be held in the City of La Verne on Tuesday, November 3, 2026, may prepare a candidate's statement on an appropriate form provided by the Deputy City Clerk. The statement may include the name, age and occupation of the candidate and a brief description of no more than 200 words of the candidate's education and qualifications expressed by the candidate himself or herself. The statement shall not include party affiliation of the candidate, nor membership or activity in partisan political organizations. The statement shall be filed in typewritten form in the office of the City Clerk at the time the candidate's nomination papers are filed. The statement may be withdrawn, but not changed, during the period for filing nomination papers and until 5:00 p.m. of the next working day after the close of the nomination period. Pursuant to Section 13307(c) of the California Elections Code, the governing body of the City of La Verne authorizes the preparation of candidate statements for nonpartisan elective office for the purpose of electronic distribution. Candidates will prepare statements for electronic distribution pursuant to Section 13307(a) of the Elections Code. A statement prepared pursuant to this subdivision shall be posted on the internet website of the County Elections Official. Pursuant to Section 13307.7(a) of the Elections Code, candidates shall provide payment of the requisite fee to cover the duties and procedures set forth in Sections 13307(b) and (d) of the Elections Code.

Section 2. ONLINE CANDIDATE STATEMENT - Pursuant to Section 13307(c) of the California Elections Code, the governing body of the City of La Verne authorizes the preparation of candidate statements for nonpartisan elective office for the purpose of electronic distribution. Candidates will prepare statements for electronic distribution pursuant to Section 13307(a) of the Elections Code. A statement prepared pursuant to this subdivision shall be posted on the internet website of the County Elections Official. Pursuant to Section 13307.7(a) of the Elections Code, candidates shall provide payment of the requisite fee to cover the duties and procedures set forth in Sections 13307(b) and (d) of the Elections Code.

Section 3. FOREIGN LANGUAGE POLICY - Pursuant to State law, the candidate's statement must be translated and printed (in the monolingual voter's pamphlet for that target language) in any language that is supported by the County.

Section 4. TRANSLATIONS - The Deputy Clerk shall have translated those statements into the languages as requested by the candidate.

Section 5. PRINTING - Print any translations of candidates' statements requested by the candidate in the main voter pamphlet. The main voter pamphlet will be printed in English and Spanish and may include candidate statement translations, as applicable.

Section 6. PAYMENT -

A. Translations:

1. Each candidate shall be required to pay for the cost of translating the candidate's statement into any required foreign language as specified in Section 3 above, pursuant to Federal and/or State law.
2. The candidate shall not be required to pay for the cost of translating the candidates' statement into any foreign language that is not required as specified in Section 3 above, pursuant to Federal and/or State law, but is requested as an option by the candidate.

B. Printing:

1. The candidate shall be required to pay for the cost of printing the candidate's statement in English in the main voter pamphlet.
2. The candidate shall be required to pay for the cost of printing the candidate's statement in Spanish in the main voter pamphlet, if requested. Only English and Spanish candidate statements may be included in the main voter pamphlet.
3. The candidate shall be required to pay for the cost of printing the candidate's statement in a foreign language requested by the candidate per Section 3 above, in the facsimile voter pamphlet.
4. The candidate shall be required to pay for the cost of printing the candidate's statement in a foreign language required by Section 3 above, in the facsimile voter pamphlet.

The City Clerk shall estimate the total cost of printing, handling, translating, and mailing the candidate's statements filed pursuant to this section, including costs incurred as a result of complying with the Voting Rights Act of 1965 (as amended), and require each candidate filing a statement to pay in advance to the local agency his or her estimated pro rata share as a condition of having his or her statement included in the voter's pamphlet. In the event the estimated payment is required, the estimate is just an approximation of the actual cost that varies from one election to another election and may be significantly more or less than the estimate, depending on the actual number of candidates filing statements. Accordingly, the Clerk is not bound by the estimate and may, on a pro rata basis, bill the candidate for additional actual expense or refund any excess paid depending on the final actual cost. In the event of underpayment, the Clerk may require the candidate to pay the balance of the cost incurred. In the event of overpayment, the Clerk shall prorate the excess amount among the candidates and refund the excess amount paid within 30 days of the Election.

Section 7. MISCELLANEOUS

- a. All translations shall be provided by professionally certified translators.
- b. The City Clerk shall allow capitalization, indentations, bullets, and leading hyphens to the same extent and manner as allowed in previous City elections.

- c. The Deputy City Clerk shall comply with all recommendations and standards set forth by the California Secretary of State regarding occupational designations and other matters relating to elections.

Section 8. ADDITIONAL MATERIALS - No candidate will be permitted to include additional materials in the sample ballot package.

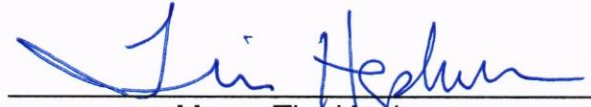
Section 9. COPY TO BE PROVIDED - That the Deputy City Clerk shall provide each candidate or the candidate's representative with a copy of this Resolution at the time nominating petitions are issued.

Section 10. REPEAL OF PRIOR RESOLUTIONS - That all previous resolutions establishing City Council policy on payment for candidates are repealed.

Section 11. APPLICABILITY OF RESOLUTION - That this resolution shall apply only to the election to be held on November 3, 2026, and shall then be repealed.

Section 12. ATTESTATION - The Mayor shall sign and the Deputy City Clerk shall attest and certify to the passage and adoption thereof.
