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1 WHEREAS, revenue generated by this measure can be used to address
2 community identified spending priorities, such as: maintaining high quality transit services,
3 maintaining local 911, police and fire services, preventing and investigating property crimes
4 like thefts and burglaries, keeping fire stations operating at current levels, and maintaining
5 police patrols around neighborhood schools and parks; and

6 WHEREAS, pursuant to Proposition 218 (California Constitution Article XIII C,
7 §2(b)), an election for the approval of a new or increased general tax must generally be
8 consolidated with a regularly scheduled general election for members of the governing body
9 of the local government; and

10 WHEREAS, by adoption of Resolution No. 2026-R076, on June 22, 2026 the
11 City Council called a General Municipal Election for the purpose of electing two members of
12 the City Council, said Election to be consolidated with the Statewide General Election to be
13 held on Tuesday, November 3, 2026; and

14 WHEREAS, the initiative ordinance to be considered by the qualified voters for
15 the amendment of the Municipal Code to increase the TOT are described and provided for
16 in the initiative ballot measure attached hereto as Exhibit "A" (the "Measure") and by this
17 reference made an operative part hereof, in accordance with all applicable laws.

18 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Culver City, California,
19 DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, as follows:

20 SECTION 1. Findings. The City Council finds that all the preceding recitals are
21 true and correct and are hereby incorporated and adopted as findings and determinations by
22 the City Council as if fully set forth herein.

23 SECTION 2. Submission of Measure. Pursuant to California Constitution,
24 Article XIII C, Section 2(b), California Elections Code § 9222, and any other applicable
25

1 requirements of the laws of the State of California relating to charter cities, the City Council
2 hereby orders the Ordinance attached hereto as "Exhibit A" to be submitted to the qualified
3 voters of the City at the General Municipal Election to be held and consolidated with the
4 Statewide General Election on Tuesday, November 3, 2026. The proposed Ordinance shall
5 be in the form attached hereto as Exhibit "A" to this Resolution and is incorporated by this
6 reference as if fully set forth herein.

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8 SECTION 3. The Measure shall be presented and printed upon the ballot
9 submitted to the voters in the manner and form set forth in this Section 3. On the ballot to be
10 submitted to the qualified voters at the General Municipal Election to be held on Tuesday,
11 November 3, 2026, in addition to any other matters required by law, there shall be printed
12 substantially the following:

13 Shall an ordinance to maintain Culver City 14 emergency response/ firefighter/ 15 paramedic/ police staffing; affordable 16 housing/ mental health/ homeless 17 reduction programs; improve streets, 18 sidewalks, public transportation, 19 infrastructure, parks and other general 20 fund services by raising Culver City's 21 transient occupancy tax paid by hotel/ 22 motel guests from 14% to 15% until March 1, 2028, and then to 16%, generating up to approximately \$2,000,000 annually until ended by voters, requiring annual audits, public spending disclosures, with all funds used locally, be adopted?	YES

24 SECTION 4. *Conduct of Election.* The City Council consents to the
25 consolidation of the election on this measure with all other elections being held in the same
26 territory on November 3, 2026, and to hold and conduct the consolidated election in the
27 manner prescribed in Elections Code Section 10418.
28

1 SECTION 5. *Notice of Election.* Notice of the time and place of holding the
2 election is hereby given, and the City Clerk is authorized, instructed, and directed to give
3 further or additional notice of the election, in time, form and manner as required by law.

4 SECTION 6. *Impartial Analysis.* Pursuant to California Elections Code Section
5 9280, the City Council hereby directs the City Clerk to transmit a copy of the Measure as set
6 forth herein to the City Attorney. The City Attorney shall prepare an impartial analysis of the
7 Measure, not to exceed 500 words in length, showing the effect of the Measure on the
8 existing law and the operation of the measure, and transmit such impartial analysis to the
9 City Clerk not later than end of business on August 14, 2026.

11 SECTION 7. *Filing with County.* The City Clerk shall, not later than the 88th day
12 prior to the Special Municipal Election to be held on Tuesday, November 3, 2026, file with
13 the Board of Supervisors and the County Clerk - Registrar of Voters of the County of Los
14 Angeles, State of California, a certified copy of this Resolution.

16 SECTION 8. *Public Examination.* Pursuant to California Elections Code
17 Section 9295, this measure will be available for public examination for no fewer than ten (10)
18 calendar days prior to being submitted for printing in the voter information guide. The Clerk
19 shall post notice in the Clerk's office of the specific dates that the examination period will run.

20 SECTION 9. *Environmental Review.* The City Council hereby finds and
21 determines that the Measure relates to organizational or administrative activities of
22 governments that will not result in direct or indirect physical changes in the environment and
23 therefore is not a project within the meaning of the California Environmental Quality Act
24 ("CEQA") and the State CEQA Guidelines, section 15378(b)(5).

26 SECTION 10. *Severability.* The provisions of this Resolution are severable and
27 if any provision of this Resolution is held invalid, that provision shall be severed from the
28

1 Resolution and the remainder of this Resolution shall continue in full force and effect, and
2 not be affected by such invalidity.

3 SECTION 11. This Resolution shall become effective upon its adoption.

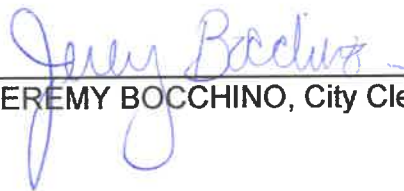

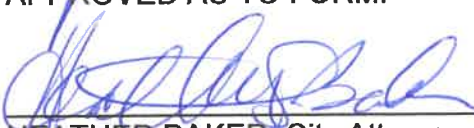

4 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CULVER CITY AMENDING
5 SECTION 11.02.105 OF THE CULVER CITY MUNICIPAL CODE, TO
6 INCREASE THE TRANSIENT OCCUPANCY TAX FROM FOURTEEN
7 PERCENT (14%) TO FIFTEEN PERCENT (15%) UNTIL MARCH 1,
8 2028, THEN TO SIXTEEN PERCENT (16%).

9 THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF CULVER CITY DO ORDAIN AS
10 FOLLOWS:

11 SECTION 1: Section 11.02.105 of the Culver City Municipal Code is hereby
12 amended, effective March 1, 2027, as follows (deletions indicated by ~~strikethrough~~ text;
13 additions indicated by underlined text):

14 § 11.02.105 TAX IMPOSED.

15 For the privilege of occupancy in any hotel, each transient is subject
16 to and shall pay a tax in the amount of ~~fourteen percent (14%)~~ fifteen percent (15%) of the
17 rent charged by the operator. Effective March 1, 2028, the tax shall be in the amount of
18 sixteen percent (16%) of the rent charged by the operator. Said tax constitutes a debt
19 owed by the transient to the City which is extinguished only by payment to the operator or
20 to the City. The transient shall pay the tax to the operator of the hotel at the time the rent
21 is paid. If the rent is paid in installments, or if any amount paid is less than the full amount
22 of the rent and tax accrued to the time of payment, a proportionate share of the tax shall
23 be deemed to have been paid with each such payment or installment. The unpaid tax
24 shall be due upon the transient's ceasing to occupy space in the hotel. If for any reason
25 the tax is not paid to the operator of the hotel, the City Treasurer may require that such
26 tax shall be paid directly to the City.

27 SECTION 2. *Effective Date.* These Sections shall become effective March
28 1, 2027.

1
2 SECTION 3. *Amendment or Repeal.* Section 11.02.105 of the Culver City
3 Municipal Code may be repealed or amended by the City Council without a vote of the
4 people. However, as required by Article XIIC of the California Constitution, voter
5 approval is required for any amendment provision that would increase the rate of any tax
6 levied pursuant to this Ordinance.

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8 SECTION 4. *Severability.* If any section, subsection, sentence, clause,
9 phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable
10 by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall
11 nonetheless remain in full force and effect. The people hereby declare that they would
12 have adopted each section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this
13 Ordinance, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences,
14 clauses, phrases, or portions of this Ordinance be declared invalid or unenforceable.

15 SECTION 5. *Execution.* The Mayor is hereby authorized to attest to the
16 adoption of this Ordinance by the voters of the City by signing where indicated below.
