GOAL

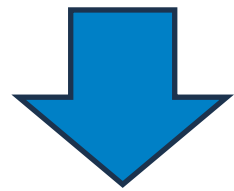
Significantly reduce the illegal street takeovers and racing events

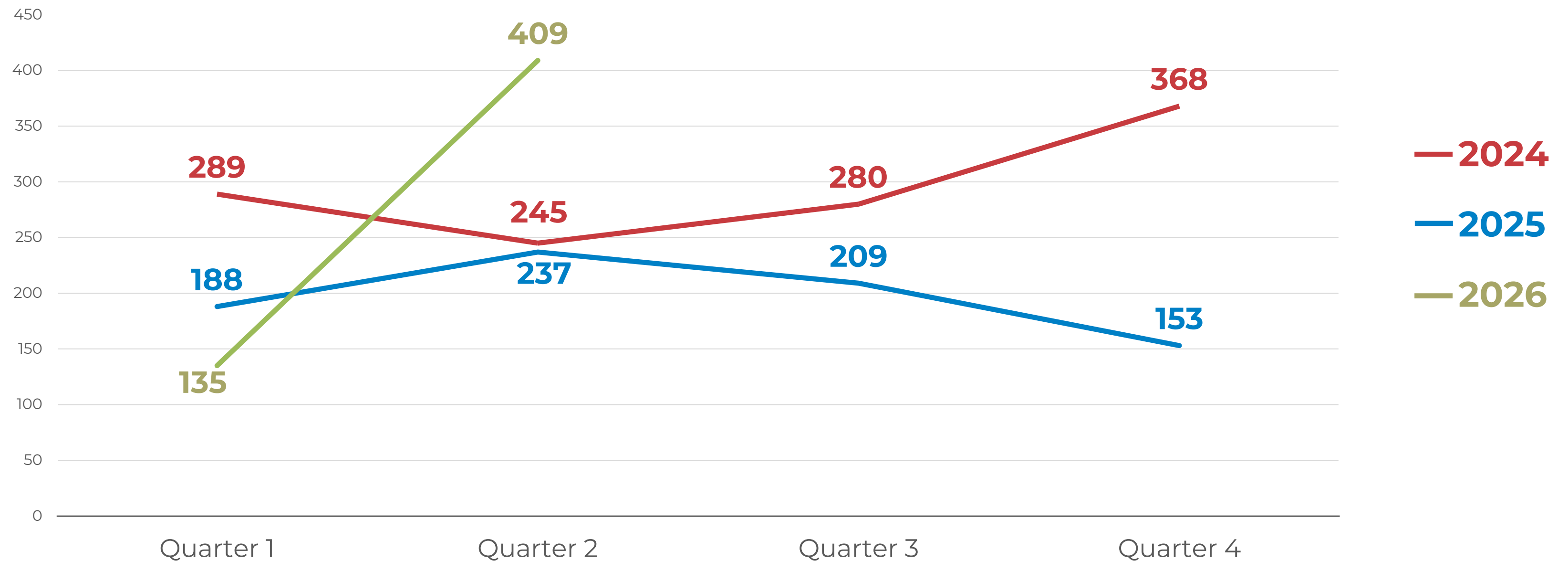

Increase Youth Outreach, Education, and Prevention Programming

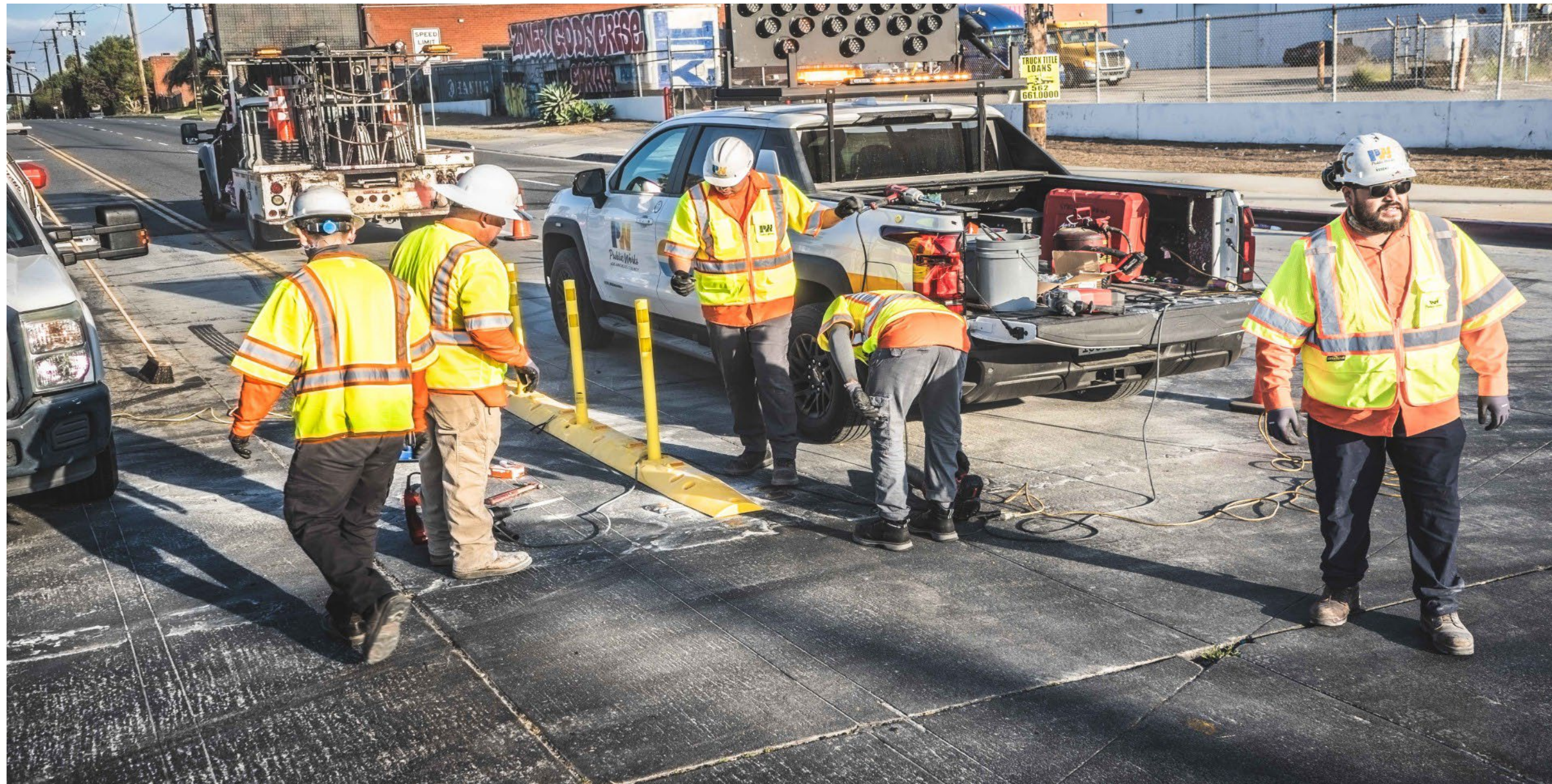
ACTIONS TAKEN	LEAD
Implementing community and school-based prevention programs for youth:	
✓ 3,336 students and community residents participated in 127 workshops on the dangers of street racing across the County ➤ 84% said they were less likely to participate in street racing or a takeover in the future	DYD & SRK
✓ Recent workshop location breakdown: SD1 – 1, SD2 – 12, SD3 – 1; SD4 – 6, and SD5 – 0	DYD & SRK

Expand Enforcement Options

ACTIONS TAKEN	LEAD
✓ Conducted 8 solo agency enforcement operations	LASD
✓ Issued 134 citations, made 46 arrests, and towed 47 vehicles	LASD & CHP
✓ LADA diverted 31 people using Street Racing Kill's diversion program	LADA & SRK
✓ Collected just over \$3,567 in restitution from those participating in reckless driving, etc.	LADA
✓ Pre-trial court dates scheduled for 2 felony cases for alleged organizing of street takeovers	LADA

Engage in Community and Communication Strategies

ACTIONS TAKEN	LEAD
✓ Worked with SnapChat, YouTube, and Meta to remove these posts and identify a point of contact to escalate issues to	CEO
✓ Released a PSA on the dangers of these events that is being shared on social media and airing on LA36: https://youtu.be/F14RZPetSjs ➤ Video significantly outperformed typical channel performance	DYD, SRK, Countywide Comms., & LA36

Identify Safe and Legal Alternatives

ACTION TAKEN	LEAD
✓ Holding a community event on September 19th at Santa Fe Dam that will include an area for youth to go-kart and learn how safe and legal drifting is better than illegal street options	SDRL
✓ Identifying dates for a legal alternative event at the Antelope Valley Fairgrounds and Pomona Fairgrounds, and meeting with potential sponsors interested in covering the costs for these events	SDRL

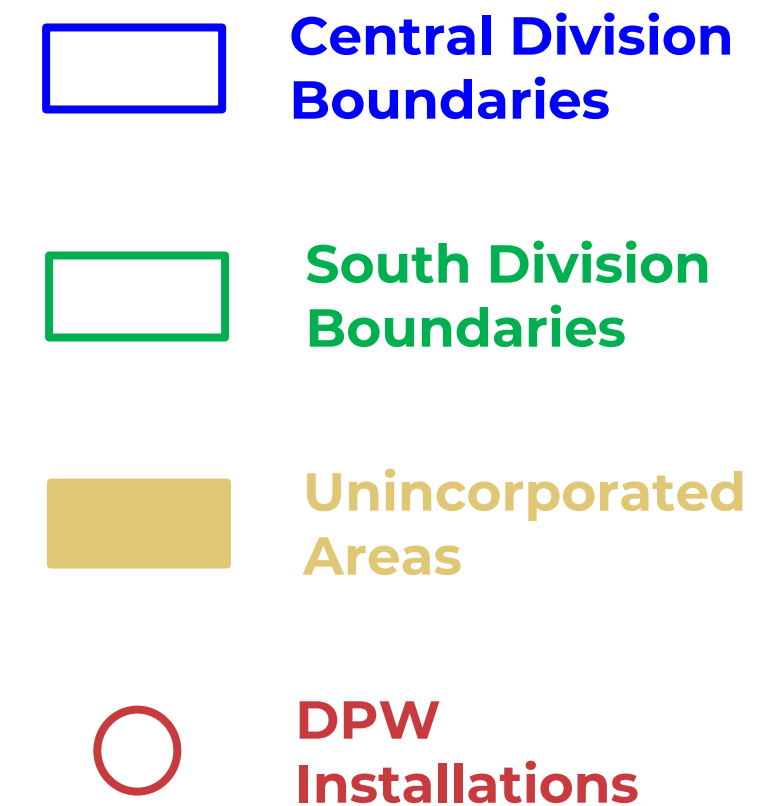

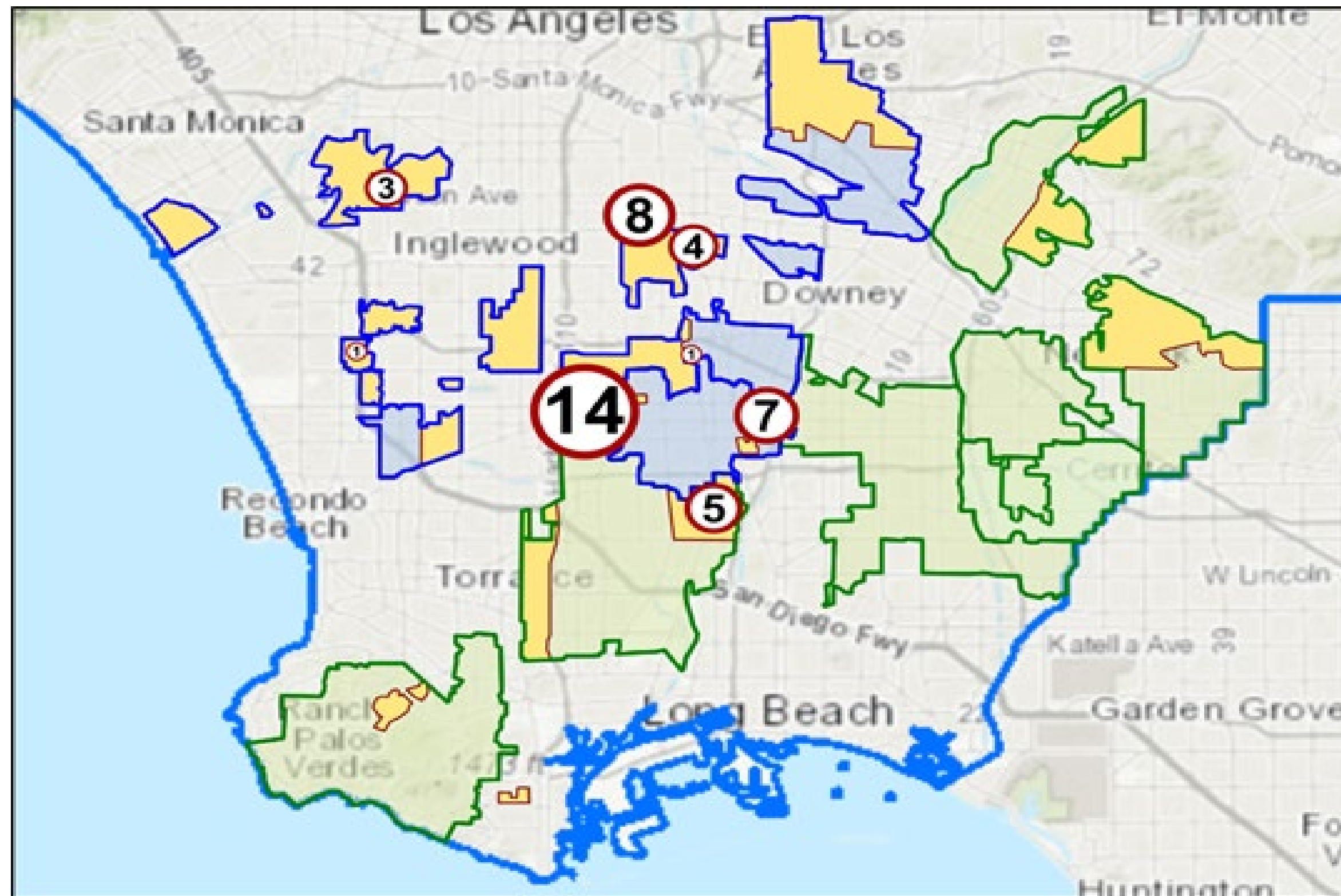

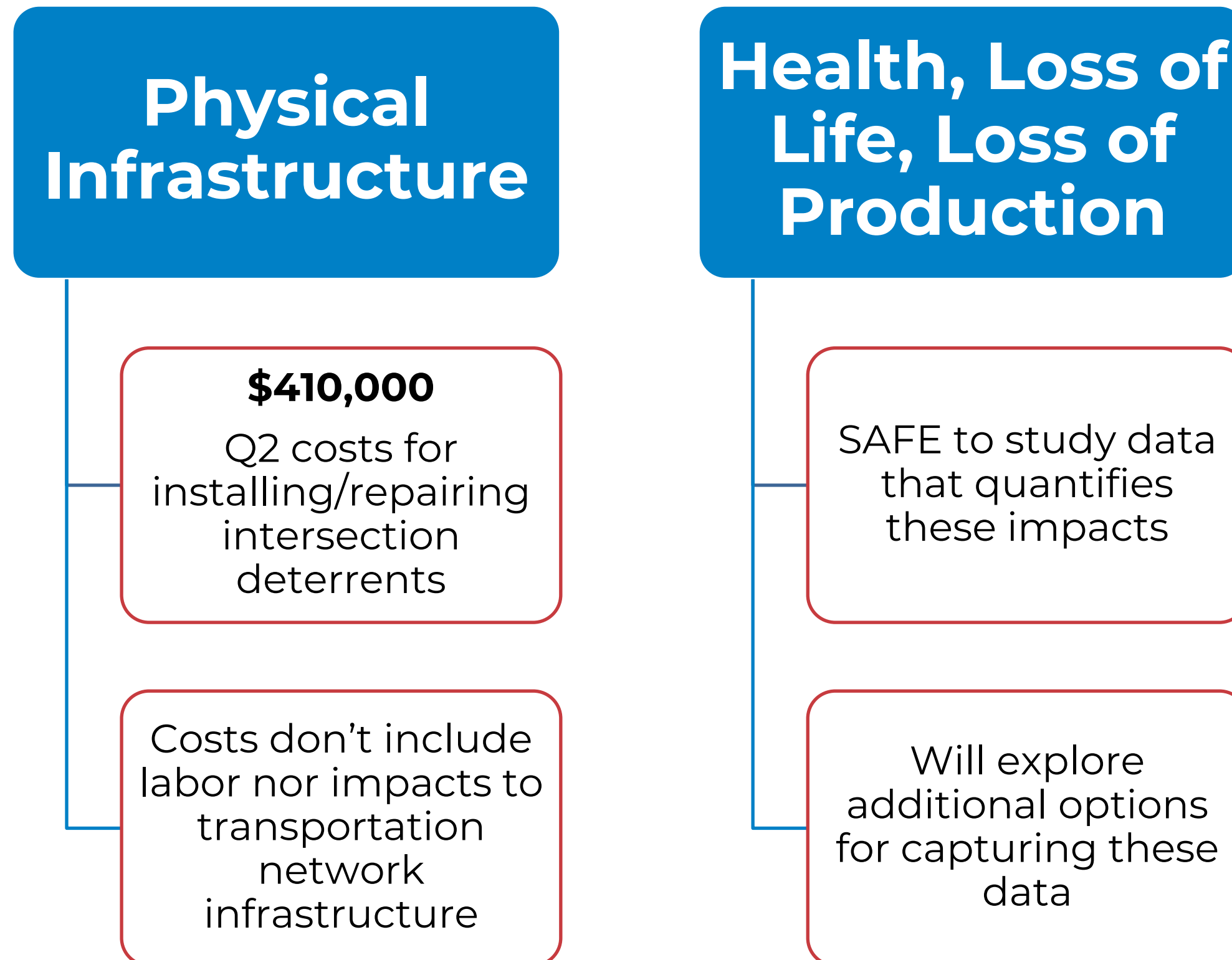


DPW Installations by Q4 – 22 Total



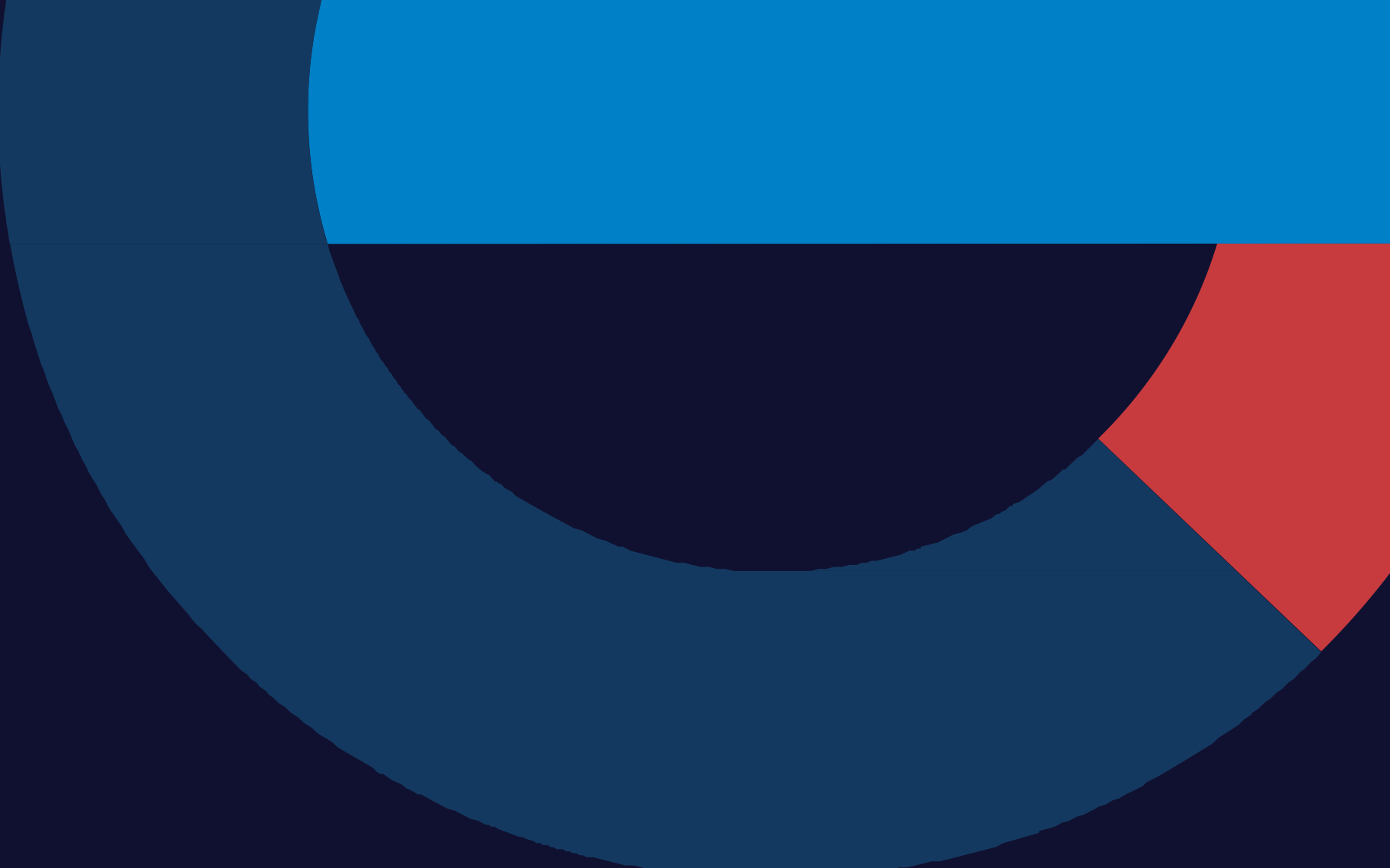
- Central Division Boundaries
