Los Angeles County Claims Board's recommendation: Authorize settlement of the matter entitled Jamie Lawson v. County of Los Angeles, et al., Los Angeles Superior Court Case No. 24STCV22192, in the amount of \$175,000, and instruct the Auditor-Controller to draw a warrant to implement this settlement from the Sheriff's Department's budget.

Briefly provide a description of the incident/event:	Summary Corrective Action Plan 2025-295 Details in this document summarize the incident. The information provided is a culmination of various sources to provide an abstract of the incident. On April 5, 2024, at approximately 12:35 p.m., the Plaintiff was driving northbound on a roadway in the #3 lane and was stopped at the intersection waiting for the traffic signal to turn green. As the traffic signal turned green, the Plaintiff proceeded straight into the intersection. Simultaneously, Deputy One proceeded into the intersection in the #4 lane of travel and attempted to make an illegal left turn from a non-turning lane and collided with the Plaintiff's vehicle. The Los Angeles Police Department responded to the scene and investigated the collision. A nearby liquor store, had low quality footage of the collision occurring. The footage depicted the patrol vehicle making a left turn and collide with the Plaintiff's vehicle. The investigation determined Deputy One was at fault for causing the collision due to making an unsafe left turn into the Plaintiff's vehicle in violation of California Vehicle Code Section 22107. Los Angeles County Fire Department paramedics responded to the scene of the collision. Deputy One and the Plaintiff were transported to a local hospital for treatment of their injuries.

1. Briefly describe the **root cause(s)** of the claim/lawsuit:

A **Department** root cause of this incident was Deputy One made an unsafe left turn and collided into the plaintiff's vehicle.

A **Department** root cause of this incident was Deputy One was seen using her cellular phone while driving a vehicle.

2. Briefly describe recommended corrective actions:

Traffic Collision Investigation

This incident was thoroughly investigated by the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD). The investigating officers determined the primary collision factor to be an unsafe left turn in violation of California Vehicle code Section 22107.

Administrative Investigation

This incident was thoroughly investigated by representatives at Transit Services Bureau. Executive evaluation of this incident found some of Deputy One's actions were in violation of Department policy. Appropriate administrative action was taken and the deputy attended additional training.

Traffic Collision Assessment Review

In an attempt to improve employee safety and reduce the Department's liability exposure, Transit Services Bureau continually schedules personnel to attend the Emergency Vehicle Operations Center (EVOC) training.

Sheriff Department Announcement - Department Wide Re-brief:

The purpose of this re-brief is to remind Department personnel that the safety of Department members and the public is paramount when engaged in routine driving and Code-3 responses.

Department-Wide Broadcast Announcements - Sheriff's Communication Center (SCC):

In an effort to mitigate Department traffic collisions, Risk Management Bureau has partnered with Sheriff's Communication Center (SCC) to create Department-Wide safety announcements that are broadcast each shift.
