ORDINANCE NO. <u>2014-0004</u>

An ordinance amending Title 22 – Planning and Zoning of the Los Angeles

County Code related to the permitted and conditional uses of ambulance service

facilities in certain commercial and industrial zones, and the development standards for these uses.

SECTION 1. Section 22.08.010 is hereby amended to read as follows:

22.08.010 A.

. . .

- -- "Alley" means a public or private right-of-way less than 40-feet wide which affords a means of vehicular access to the side or rear of properties abutting a street or highway.
- -- "Ambulance emergency services facility" means a facility operated by a non-public agency where ambulances are located and dispatched for the purpose of responding to emergency calls received from public agencies. Such a facility may operate 24 hours a day and may include sleeping facilities, a locker room, restrooms with showers, and a lunchroom. Ambulances shall not be washed or maintained at any such facility. For purposes of this definition of ambulance emergency services facility, ambulance shall be as defined in County Code Section 7.16.010.B; public agency shall be as defined in County Code Section 7.02.280.
- -- "Ambulance services facility" means a facility operated by a non-public
 agency where ambulances or ambulettes are located and dispatched for the purpose of
 responding to emergency and non-emergency calls from public agencies or any other

sleeping facilities, a locker room, restrooms with showers, and a lunchroom.

Ambulances and ambulettes may be washed and maintained at any such facility. For purposes of this definition of ambulance services facility, ambulance shall be as defined in County Code Section 7.16.010.B; ambulette shall be as defined in County Code.

 - -- Alcoholic beverages, the sale of, for either on-site or off-site consumption, subject to the requirements of Section 22.56.195.
 - Ambulance emergency services facilities.

SECTION 4. Section 22.28.130 is hereby amended to read as follows:

22.28.130 Permitted <u>uU</u>ses.

Premises in Zone C-2 may be used for:

- A. The following commercial uses, provided all sales are retail only and all goods sold, except genuine antiques and items sold at secondhand stores, are new:
 - Services.
 - -- Air-pollution sampling stations.
- Ambulance emergency services facilities, subject to the applicable development standards set forth in Section 22.28.170.

SECTION 5. Section 22.28.170 is hereby amended to read as follows:

22.28.170 Development Standards.

Premises in Zone C-2 shall be subject to the following development standards:

- A. That not to exceed 90 percent of the net area be occupied by buildings, with a minimum of 10 percent of the net area landscaped with a lawn, shrubbery, flowers, and/or trees, which shall be continuously maintained in good condition.

 Incidental walkways, if needed, may be developed in the landscaped area.
- G. Ambulance Emergency Services Facilities. No more than two
 ambulances may be on site at any one time and a designated parking space shall be
 provided for each ambulance on site.

- A. The commercial component of a mixed use development allowed pursuant to Section 22.52.1910, shall not include any of the following uses:
 - -- Air pollution sampling stations.
 - -- Ambulance emergency services facilities.
 - -- Ambulance services facilities.
