Budget Information Flow

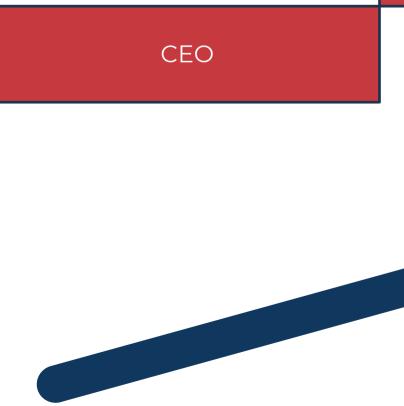
Each of the County's 38 departments gather information, evaluate priorities and present a departmental budget request to the Chief Executive Office and Board of Supervisors.

DEPARTMENTS

CEO staff collaborate with the CIO and A-C on a complete set of recommendations guided by the Board of Supervisors' priorities.

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICE

The CEO presents a fiscally responsible Recommended Budget to the Board of Supervisors for consideration.





THE PUBLIC

The Board deliberates and directs changes before adopting the budget.

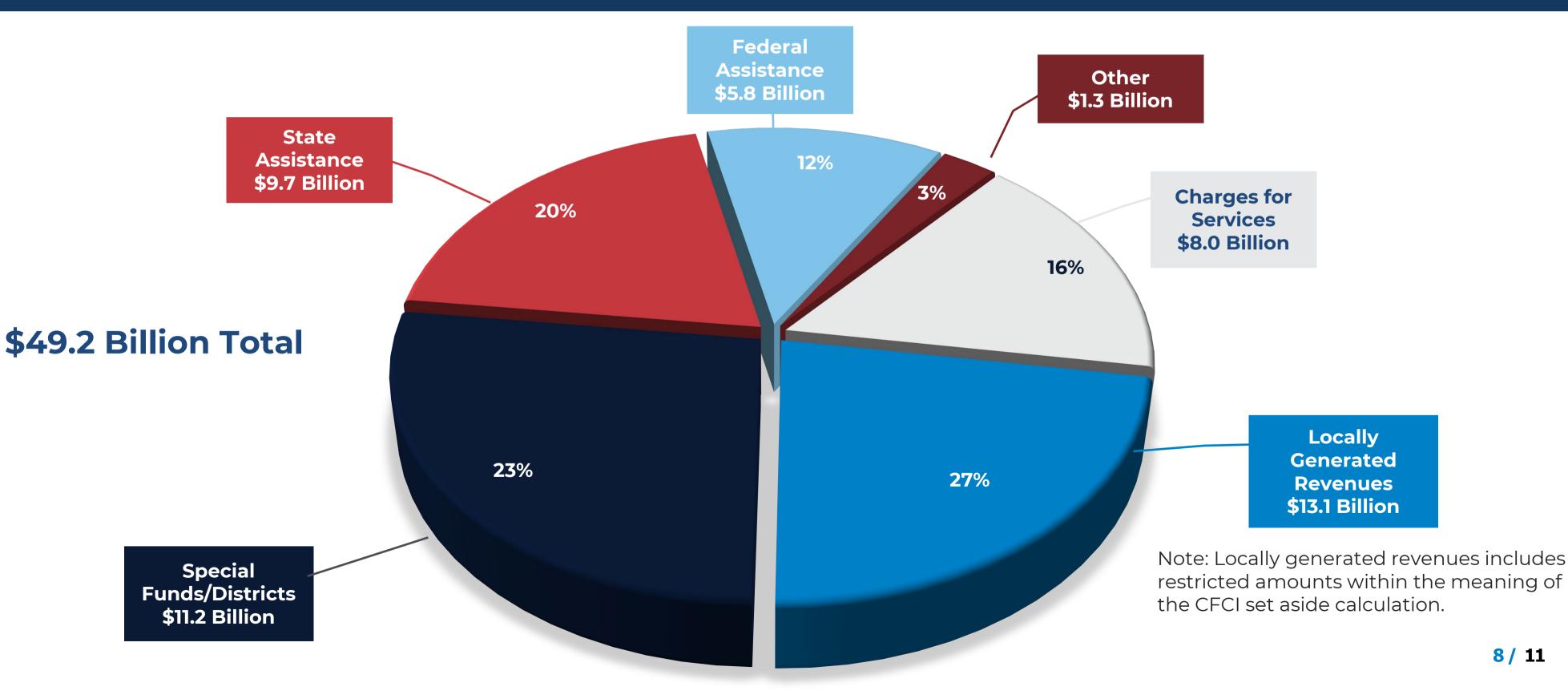

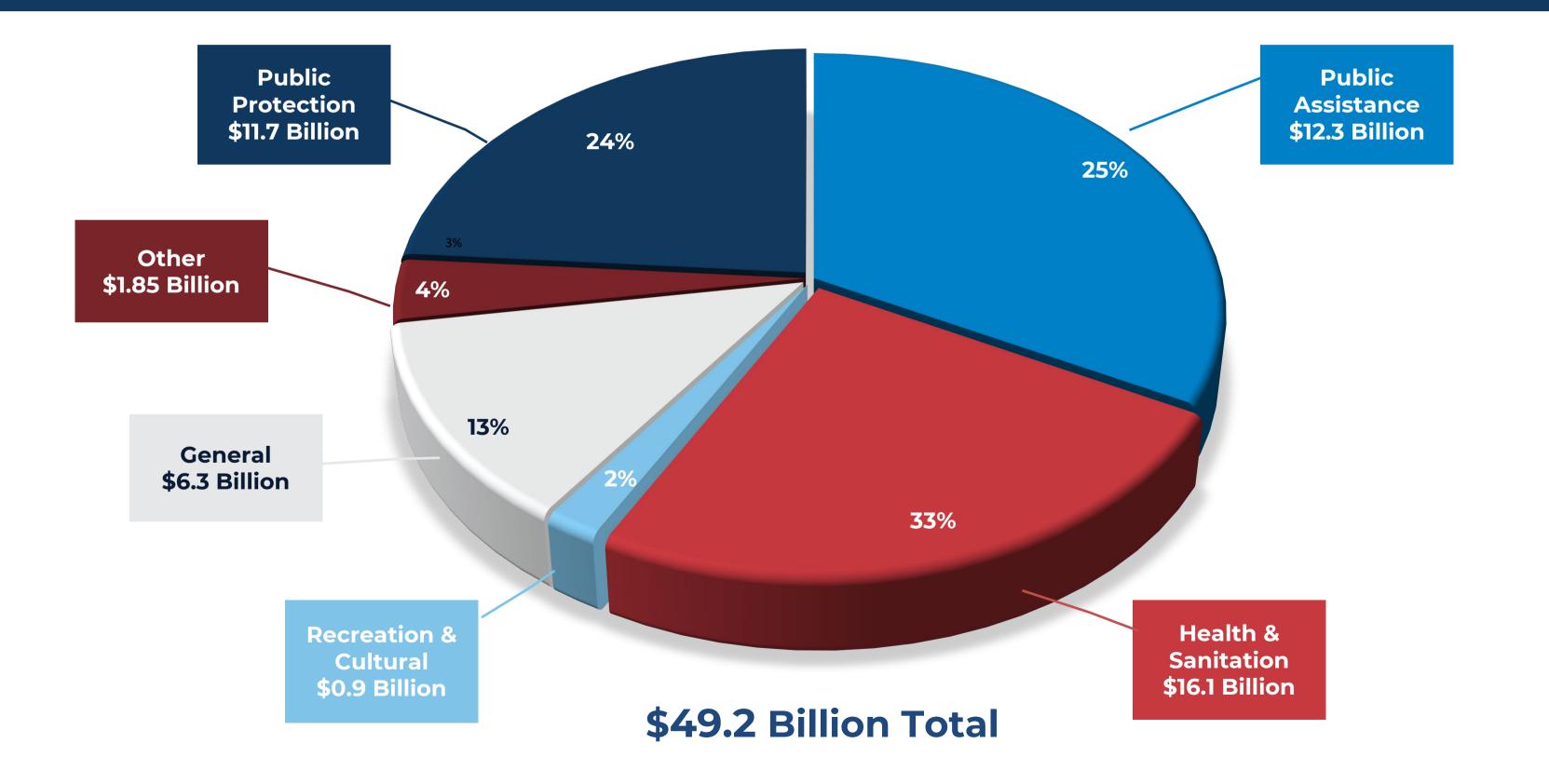

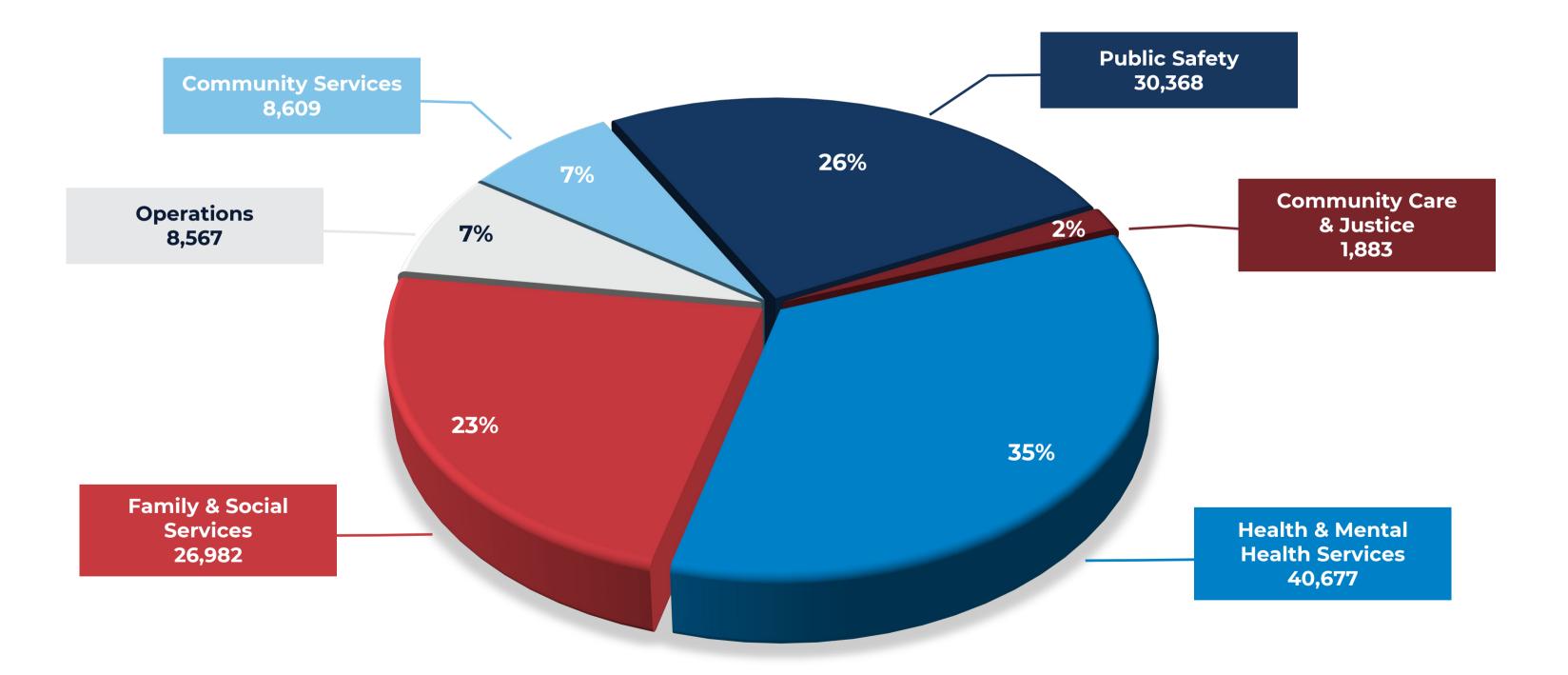
2024-25 Final Adopted Budget Where the Money Comes From

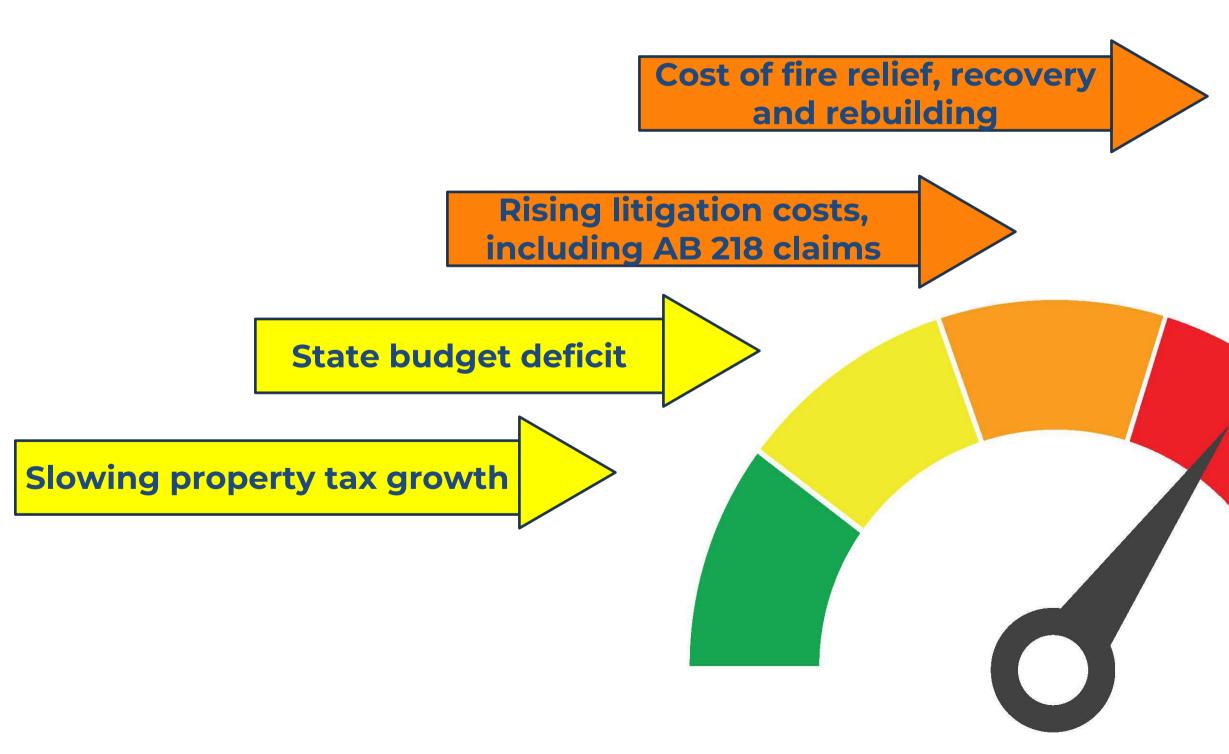
