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Efforts to reduce the jail population:

LASD continues to utilize various methods to manage the inmate population, such as leaving the misdemeanor bail admitted at 50k, it was raised from 25K, applying accelerated releases for all inmates by 30 days using CA Penal Code 4024.1 PC, keeping the percentage release at 10% of their court ordered sentences, for non-violent, non-serious, non-sexual charges and the short sentences are still being released at 240 days. LASD has been working with CDCR to coordinate the transfer of inmates sentenced to state prison and the number of inmates waiting for transfer has dropped significantly from 1,171 in the beginning of January to 1,048 today with only 233 as SP4 with their paperwork processed and ready to go. We have also been working with the State Hospitals in trying to reduce the number of inmates waiting to go to state hospitals, at the beginning of January it was 593 and we are now down to 353 inmates, almost a 40% reduction. LASD continues to collaborate with the Courts, DA's office, and PD's office on felony bail deviation for the release of medically vulnerable individuals due to COVID-19.

Processing delays and overcrowding issues and efforts to resolve them:

The Inmate Reception Center is currently under a federal temporary restraining order regarding the Rutherford case. The Rutherford TRO limits the stay of an inmate at IRC to 24 hours, excluding temporary housing module 231. Barring extenuating circumstances, all inmates are processed, medically and psychologically evaluated, and housed within 24 hours of entering the IRC. A computer application is currently in the process of being developed to monitor and track any processing delays in real time. The computer application should be in production mode by June 1, 2023, and will be used to ensure compliance with processing time limits, helping to ensure there are no unnecessary processing delays.

Changes in the plan to resolve overcrowding in the jail system:

Ongoing reassessments are conducted to identify appropriate housing and to mitigate any unnecessary operational delays.
