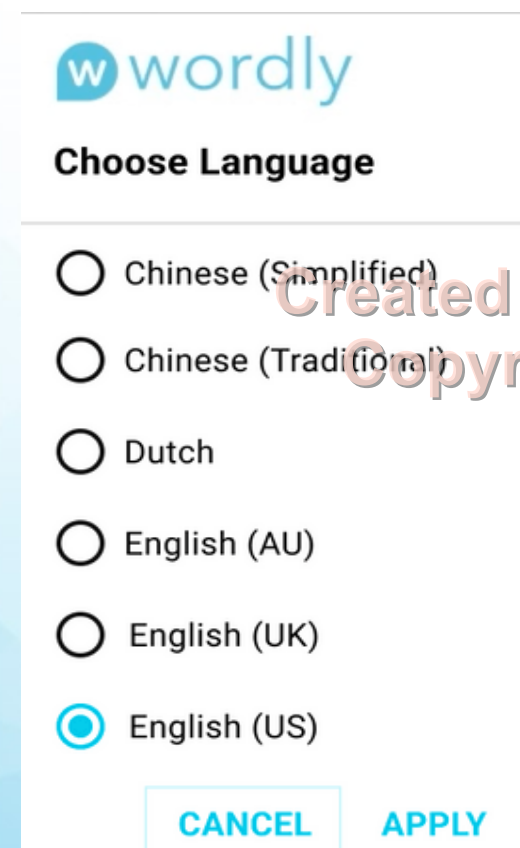

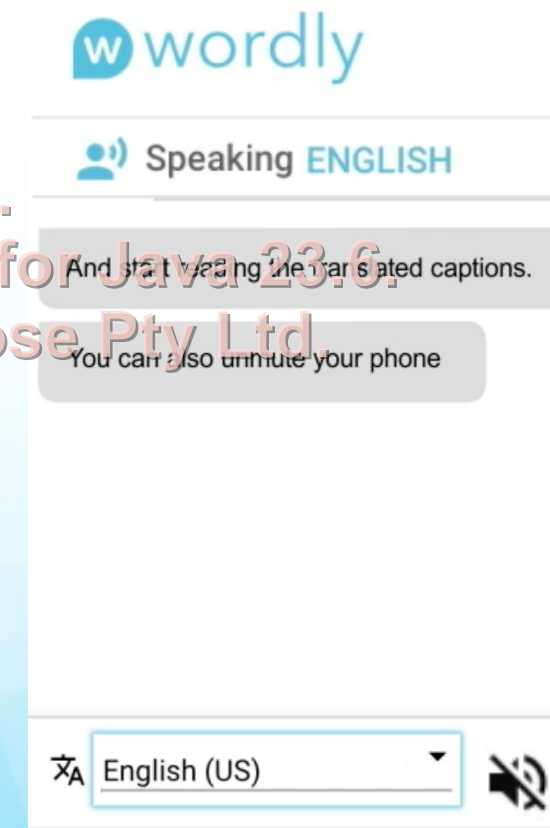

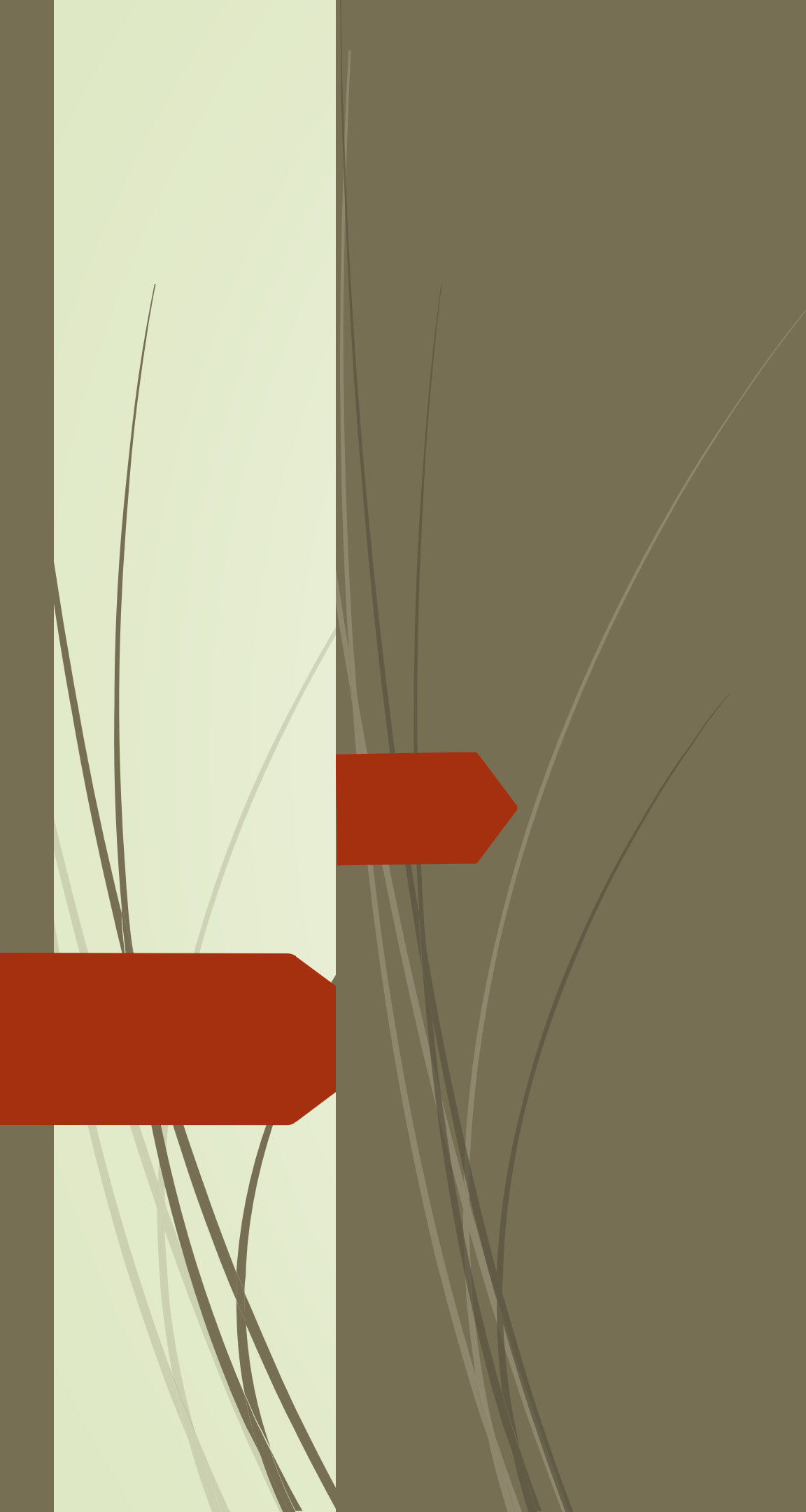

The Current Landscape

- For the last year, the Trump Administration has attacked communities across the country by increasing ICE operations and targeting immigrant families
- On June 9, 2026, Republicans in Congress passed a \$70 billion budget package that funds both ICE and CBP through 2029
- This brings the total funding levels for ICE and CBP to \$246 billion since the start of the Trump Administration

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Congresswoman Judy Chu's Actions to Support Immigrant Families

- Voted against any additional funding to ICE and CBP.
- Conducted oversight of immigration detention facilities, including visits to the Adelanto ICE Processing Center.
- Raised concerns regarding detention conditions and access to legal services.
- Spoke out against enforcement actions that undermine due process and community trust.
- Advocated for transparency, accountability, and humane treatment of detained individuals.
- Continues working with community organizations, legal advocates, and local leaders to support immigrant families.

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Family Preparedness Before an Emergency

- Develop a family communication plan
 - Identify trusted emergency contacts
 - Gather important documents and store in a safe place
- Designate temporary caregiver for children
 - Complete a Caregiver Authorization Affidavit
 - Allows a parent to designate an adult over the age of 18 as a "person in parental relation" and authorizes that person to make health and educational decisions for the child for periods of up to twelve months
- Memorize important phone numbers

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Important Documents Checklist

- Passports and IDs
- Birth certificates
- Medical records
- School records
- Immigration paperwork
- Financial documents
- Attorney and consulate contact information
- ICE Privacy Waiver: Form 60-001
- Place all these documents in a safe place that is easy for friends and family to find.

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Know Your Rights – ICE is at my Door

- Stay calm, take a breath and remember your rights.
- Keep your screen door closed or open a window to address the officers and answer as little questions as possible. The less they know about you, the better.
- Demand a legally binding warrant if they insist on having the right to enter your home. They can only enter your home if you open the door to them or have a signed judicial warrant. Remain silent
- Do not sign documents without legal advice

KNOW YOUR WARRANTS



Ask ICE to present a warrant. DO NOT OPEN THE DOOR without a VALID warrant.

A valid warrant is a judicial warrant SIGNED by a U.S. Judge

Know Your Rights - If ICE Comes to Your Workplace

- It's important to stay as calm as possible. Take a deep breath and **remember your Constitutional rights.**
- Do not try to run away as this can be used against you.
- Ask if you are being detained or are free to leave
- Say as little as possible and state you are exercising your rights. ICE will use tactics to scare or threaten you into answering questions. You do not have to say or sign anything without an attorney present.
- Carry a red card
 - ilrc.org/redcards

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I do not wish to speak with you, answer your questions, or sign or hand you any documents based on my 5th Amendment rights under the United States Constitution.

I do not give you permission to enter my home based on my 4th Amendment rights under the United States Constitution unless you have a warrant to enter, signed by a judge or magistrate with my name on it that you slide under the door.

I do not give you permission to search any of my belongings based on my 4th Amendment rights.

I choose to exercise my constitutional rights.

- Licensed attorney
- Accredited Representative at a recognized nonprofit organization
 - No one else!

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Cheaper Alternative?

- Avoid “notarios”, immigration consultants, tax preparers for all immigration matters! They cannot give you legal advice:
 - Am I eligible?
 - How do I answer this question on the immigration form?
 - Should I apply? What are my risks?

FRAUD PREVENTION



PROTECTING COMMUNITIES FROM IMMIGRATION FRAUD



Beware of online services: WhatsApp & Facebook ads, “attorneys” in other states or abroad

- Never respond directly to online ads - verify law license and attorney contact information on your own

Evaluation only.

Do not give money or personal info to anyone who calls, texts, or emails claiming there is a problem with your immigration matter.

- Immigration officers will not ask for money or financial information.
- Immigration officers do not call to warn immigrants that they are going to be detained or arrested.

Never hire anyone who:

- Says they have special connections with Immigration officials
- Asks you to sign blank forms, keeps your original documents
- Tells you to provide false information, refuses to provide a written contract
- Acts as an intermediary who claims to work with attorneys

Constitutional Policing Principles & Immigration Enforcement

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- LASD's focus is enforcing state and local laws. Immigration enforcement is the job of the federal government.
- LASD does not engage in immigration enforcement per SB 54:
 - We do not ask immigration status.
 - Immigration status does not influence how we respond to calls for service.
 - We **can not** arrest someone solely for being undocumented.
- LASD's priority is to **build trust** and foster **strong relationships** with the communities we serve, while **ensuring the safety** of all individuals in Los Angeles County.
- We strive to serve every individual with fairness, dignity, and respect.

Compliance with Constitutional Standards, Due Process, Equal Protection, and Jurisdictional Boundaries

- LASD ensures adherence to these principles by:
 - Building them into clear, legally sound policies in line with the U.S. Constitution, State Law (MPP, FOD).
 - Training our personnel (Newsletters, FODs, Briefings, Classes)
 - Supervision & Accountability (BWCs, PLEs, Admins, Discipline, Corrective Action)
 - Regularly update policies as needed (Quick Immigration enforcement policy and scenarios.)

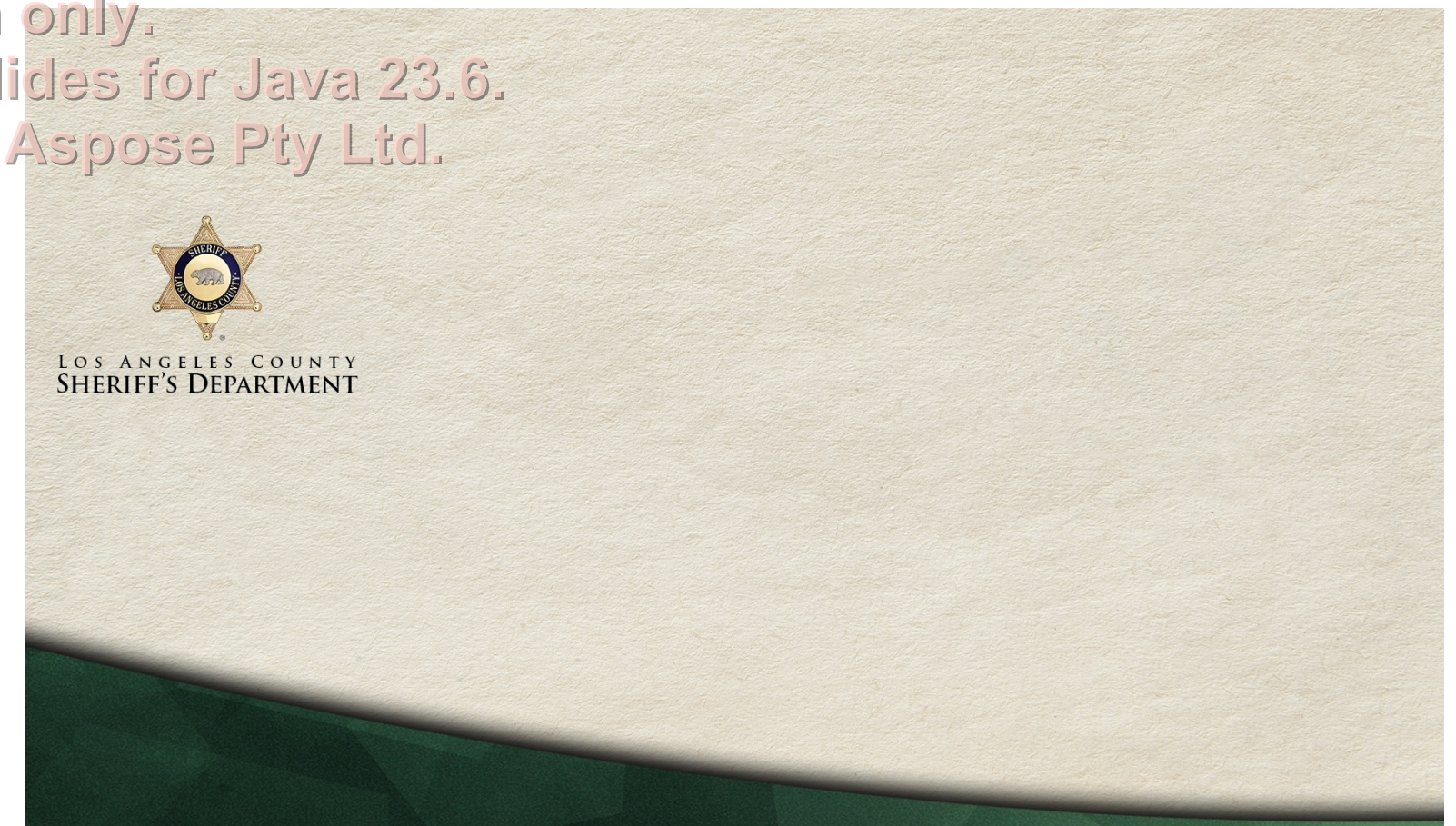
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Right to Film Law Enforcement Officers & Lawful Observation vs Interference

- The public has a First Amendment right to film law enforcement officers in public spaces.
- U.S. Courts have recognized this right as protected expressive authority.
- Lawful Observation = Public street, sidewalk, parks, conducting traffic stops or arrests in public view. Some public buildings; courthouses although public generally do not allow filming inside.
- Interference = Physically obstructing officer, crossing an established police line, close enough to touch officer or evidence.
- Suggestions if filming: Stay calm and respectful, keep a reasonable distance, do not physically insert yourself into the scene, follow lawful commands, do not tamper with evidence.



LASD Uniforms

What to Look for:

- The primary uniform worn by patrol deputies is known as the Class A uniform.
 - Olive green pants
 - Tan shirt with shoulder patches reading “Los Angeles County Sheriff”, and the Department’s iconic six-pointed star badge.
 - Deputies will also display their name or badge number and do not wear face coverings while on duty.
- Deputies may wear an outer duty vest that is olive green and is clearly marked “Sheriff” on the front and back, along with the deputy’s name and badge.
- If the identity of someone claiming to be an LASD deputy is in question, ask for a name or badge number-or request that a supervisor respond to the scene.

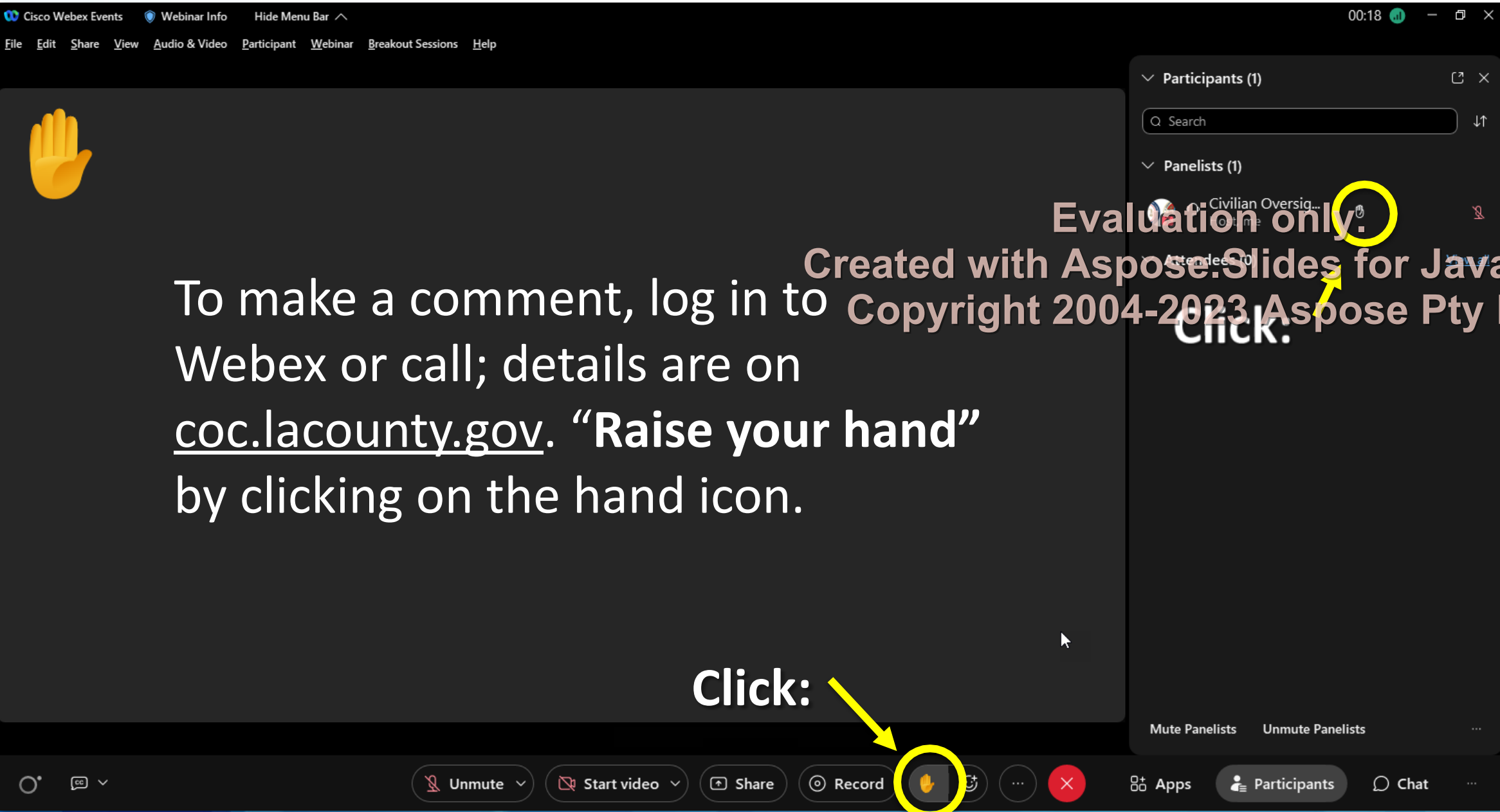

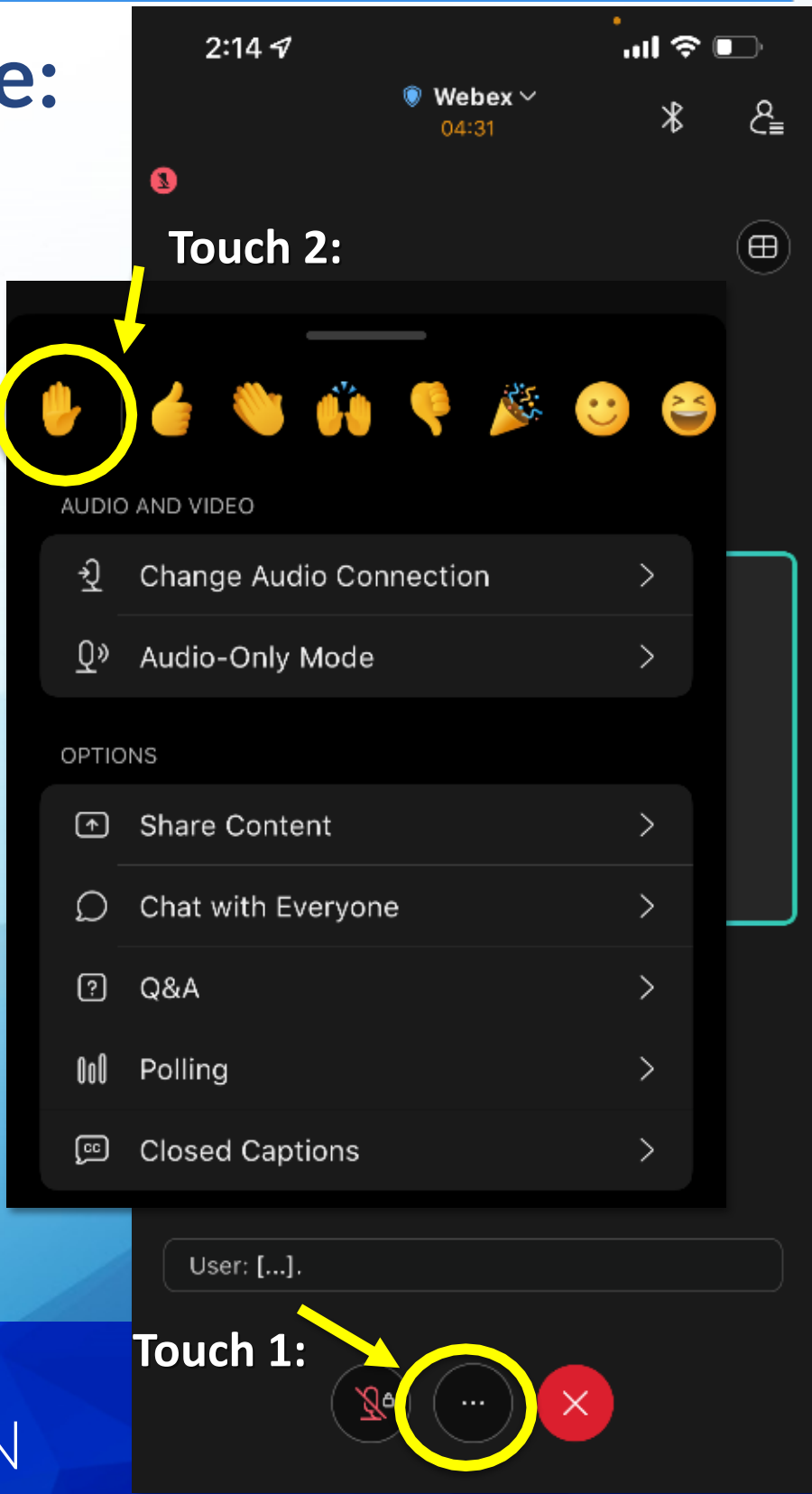
