LA County Oversight Model

PURPOSE AND SCOPE

- Facilitate public transparency and accountability with respect to the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department.
- Provide robust opportunities for community engagement.
- Ongoing analysis and oversight of LASD's policies, practices, and procedures.
- Advise the Board of Supervisors, the Sheriff and the public.
- Investigate through the OIG or its own staff and issue subpoenas for production of records and attendance, as needed.
- Function as a bridge between LASD and the community.
- Seek Sheriff's input prior to completing its recommendations.

- Measure R
- Government Code section 25303.7

LEGAL CHALLENGES

- Power to compel production and attendance
- Time consuming
- Labor unions / collective bargaining challenges

STRATEGIES

Engage labor early

Access to Information

LEGAL CHALLENGES

- Per Los Angeles County Code, the COC:
- o May not access confidential information
- May direct the OIG to issue a subpoena, but OIG may only share public information with the COC
- Per Measure R:
- Meet and confer process has delayed its use

STRATEGIES

- Engage LASD
- Streamline oversight, where feasible
- Include safeguards when sharing information

Other Legal Challenges

- Brown Act Compliance
- Concurrent Investigations
- Legal Counsel

BROWN ACT

- Meetings are open and public.
- Closed session is limited.
- Subcommittee meetings.

CONCURRENT INVESTIGATIONS

- · Competing priorities.
- · Resources spread thin.
- Pending criminal investigations.

LEGAL COUNSEL

- · Ethical walls.
- No conflict as a matter of law.
