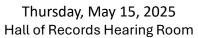

III. COMMISSION/LASD REPORTS	
A. Chair's Report	
<ol> <li>Chair Bonner reported attending the April 30 BOS Public Safety Cluster meeting with ED Moseley to propose amendments to Chapter 3.79, emphasizing the Commission's role in independent oversight of LASD. He also strongly opposed County Counsel's amendments restricting the Commission's access to confidential information in closed sessions.</li> <li>Chair Bonner and Commissioner Calloway attended the April 29 Assembly Public Safety Committee meeting in Sacramento in support of AB 847, which would allow the COC to subpoena and access confidential information in closed sessions.</li> <li>Chair Bonner commented on the enforcement of COC's three subpoenas for documents related to LASD's use of force against Emmett Brock, Joseph Perez, Andres Guardado.</li> <li>He addressed the Sheriff's declaratory relief action, noting it may require a closed session with outside counsel Harv Anand, and called on CoCo Diaz for review.</li> <li>Chair Bonner reported that ALADS requested audio from a COC closed session and anticipates a lawsuit from them.</li> <li>In closing, Chair Bonner announced that Commission meetings will be held at St. Anne's Conference Center starting in June through the rest of the year.</li> </ol>	34:31
B. Executive Director's (ED) Report	
<ol> <li>ED Moseley reported on mandatory training for Commissioners and provided an overview of the County policy requirements.</li> <li>ED Moseley highlighted Commissioner and staff activities, including internal operations, trainings, upcoming events, and meetings, and noted the Commission's mandate to conduct a self-evaluation every three years.</li> <li>ED Moseley reported that the annual report is being reviewed by Chair Bonner and should be completed ahead of the COC's June meeting.</li> <li>ED Moseley provided stats on news coverage of COC as well as analytics of COC's social media and noted an overall increase in engagement.</li> <li>ED Moseley shared upcoming events, including a virtual listening session on deputy gangs, a special hearing, and the COC annual conference. She also noted vacant staff and commissioner positions and highlighted County budget constraints.</li> <li>Chair Bonner inquired if staff could conduct the self-assessment and generate a report rather</li> </ol>	48:31
than hire from outside. Chair requested that the Commissioner training be focused on items relevant to oversight duties.  Regarding training, ED Moseley said Commissioner training is mandated by the County and is separate and apart from LASD training.
