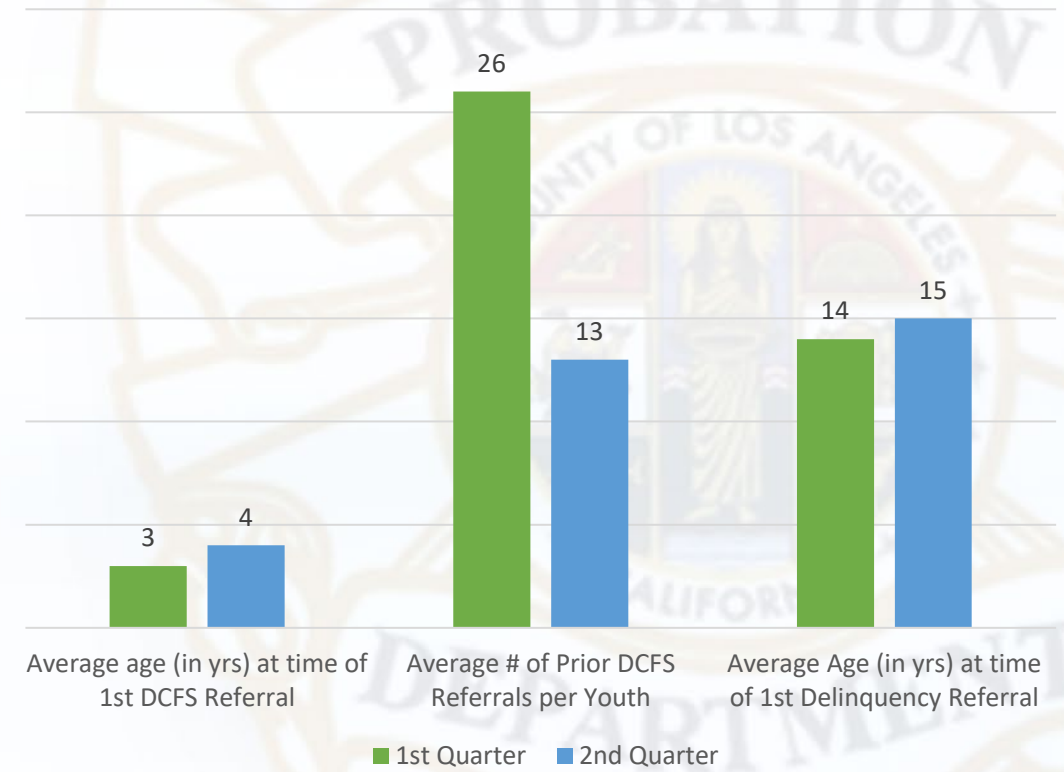




# Special Investigations Unit (241.1 WIC Joint Assessment Referrals)



## Number of WIC 241.1 Referrals Received from Delinquency Court

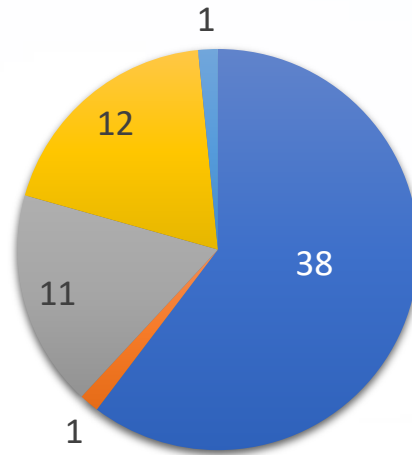

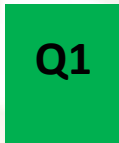

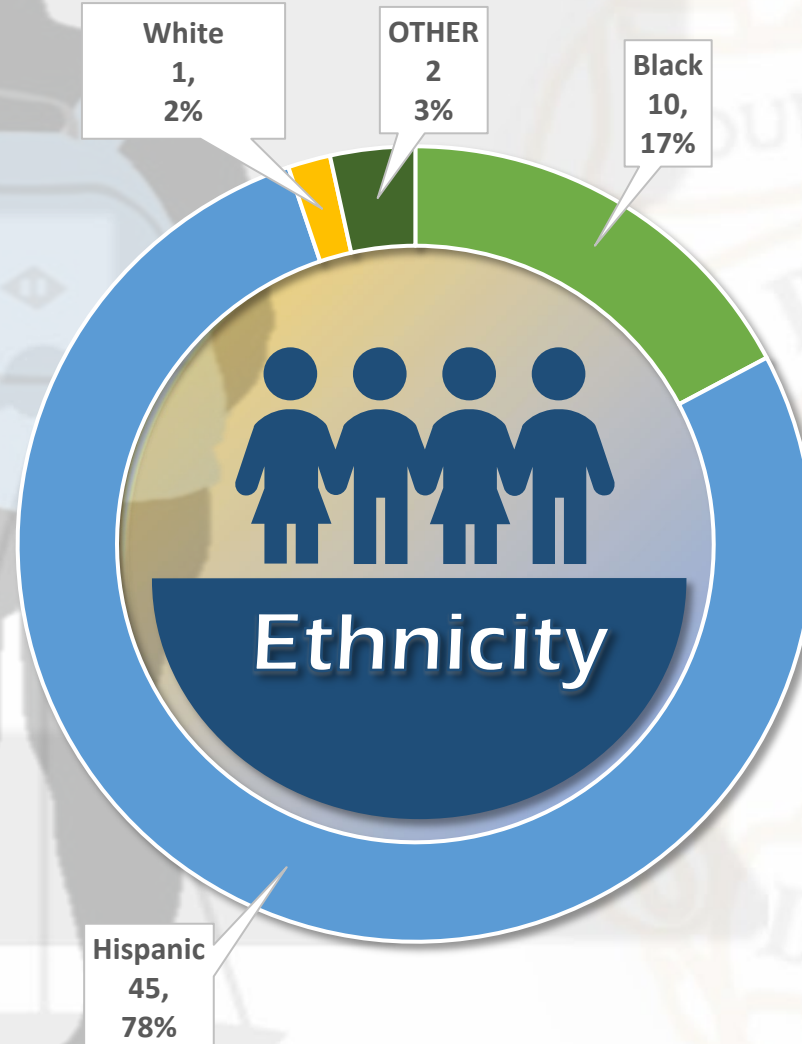

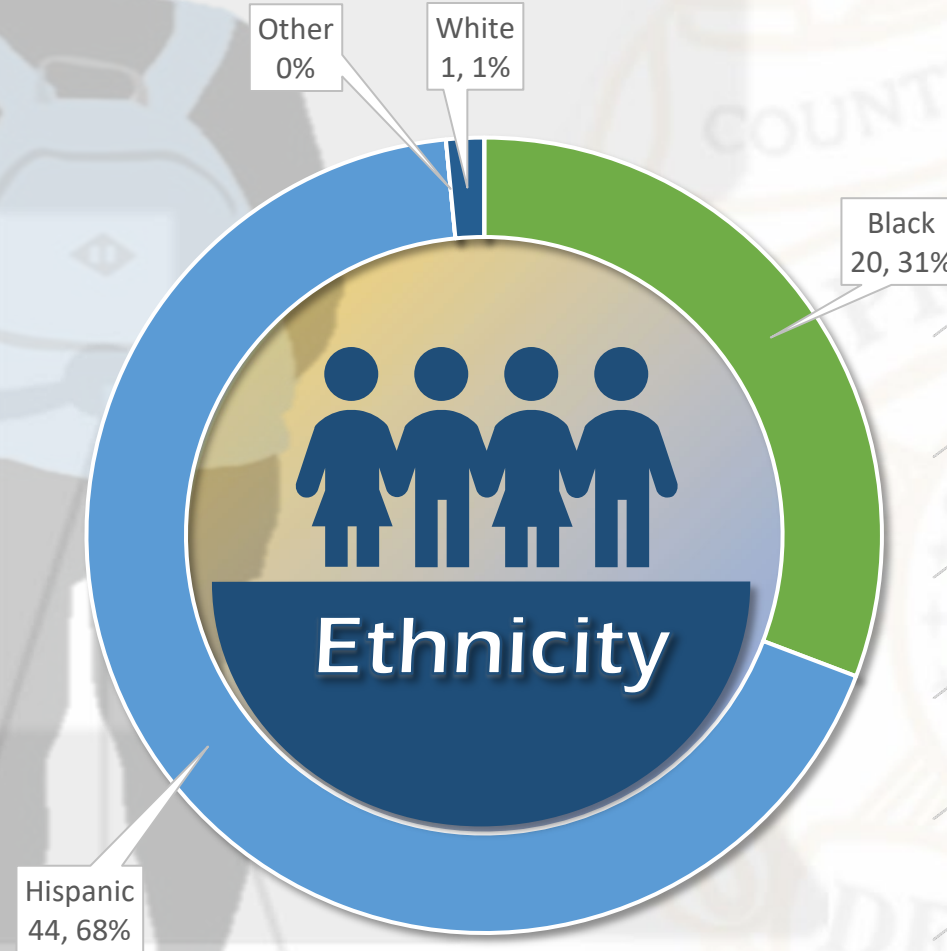

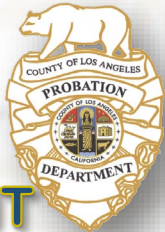

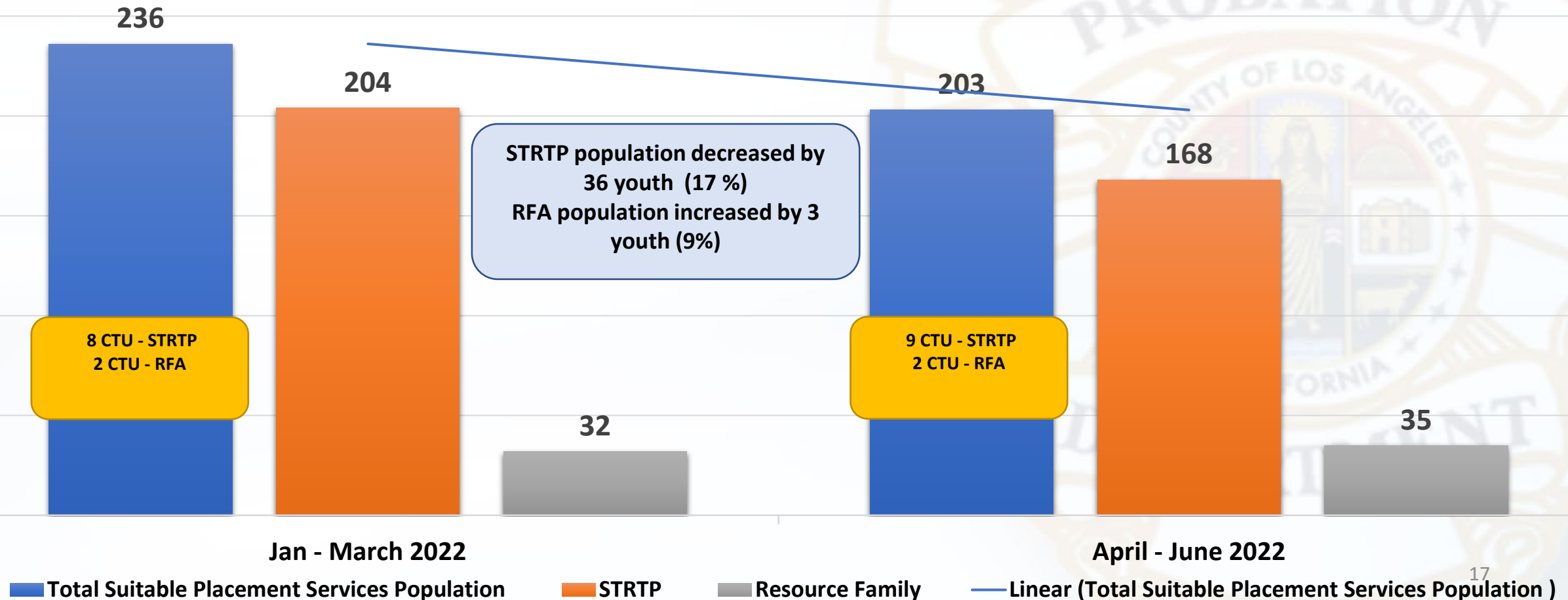


# Short Term Residential Therapeutic Programs (STRTP) and Resource Family Population (Including Child Trafficking Unit (CTU))

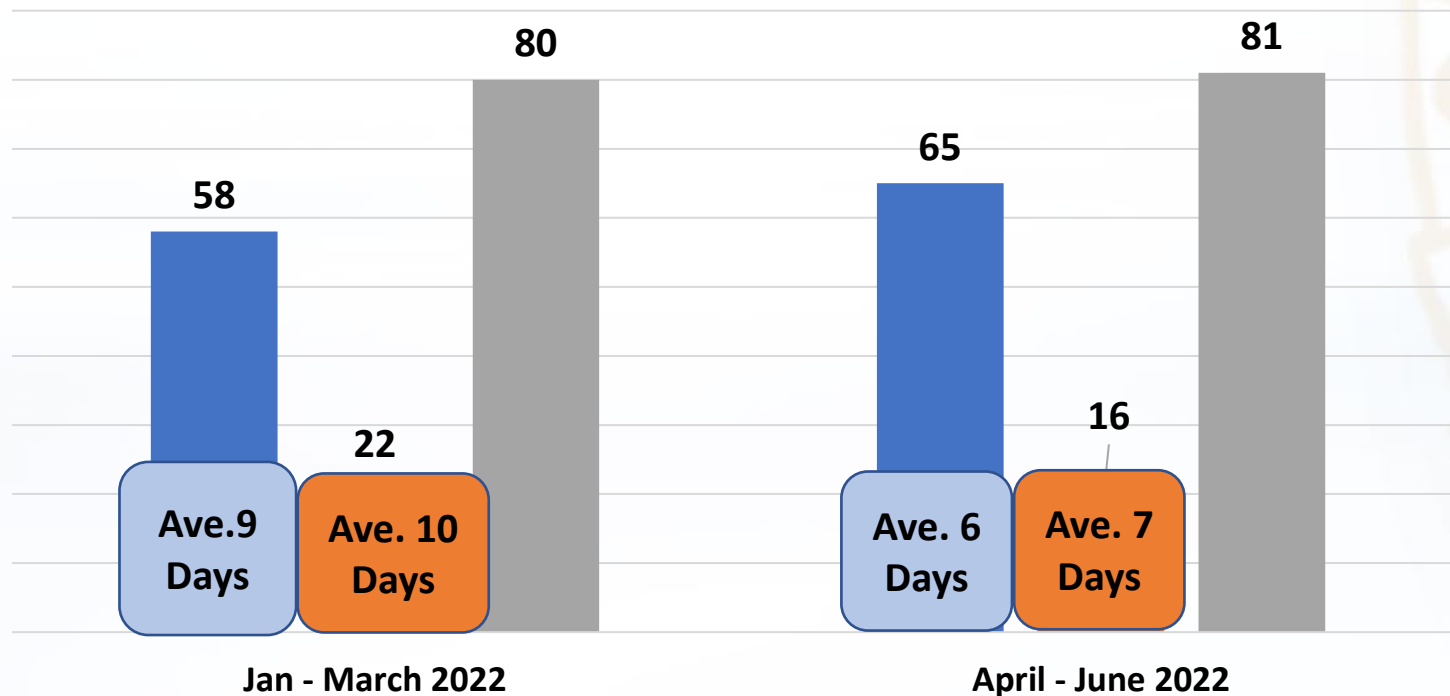

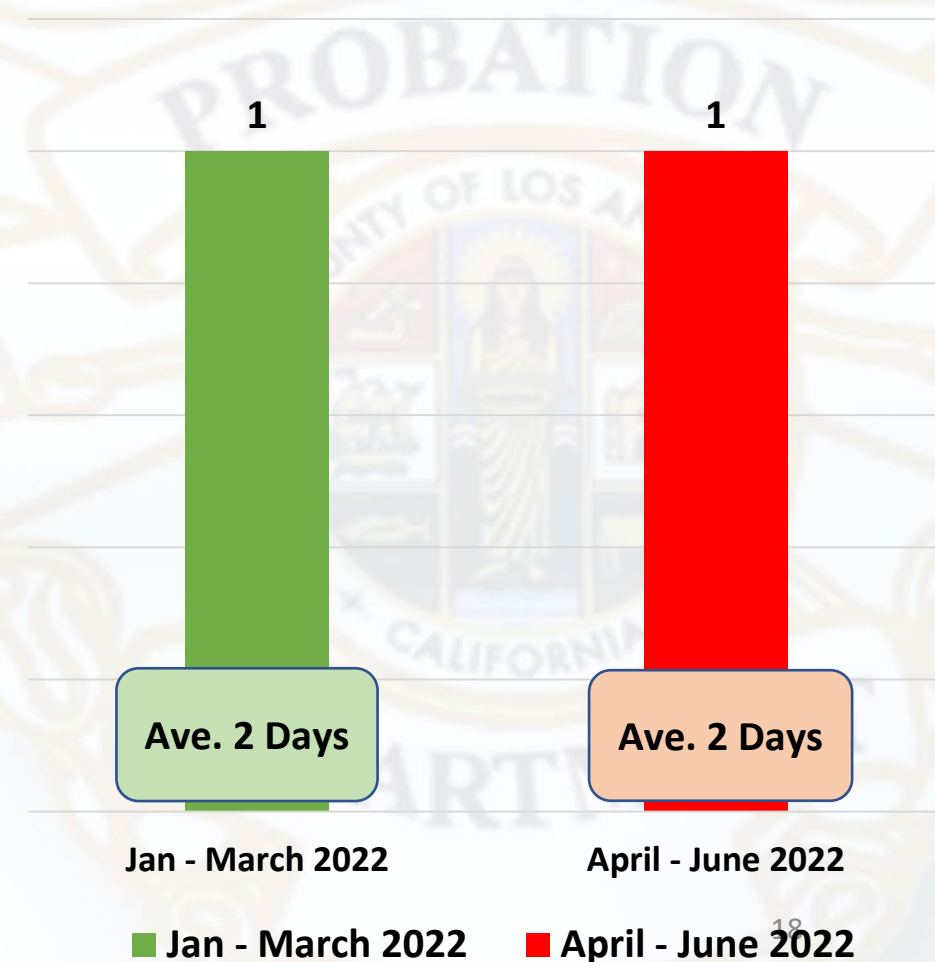

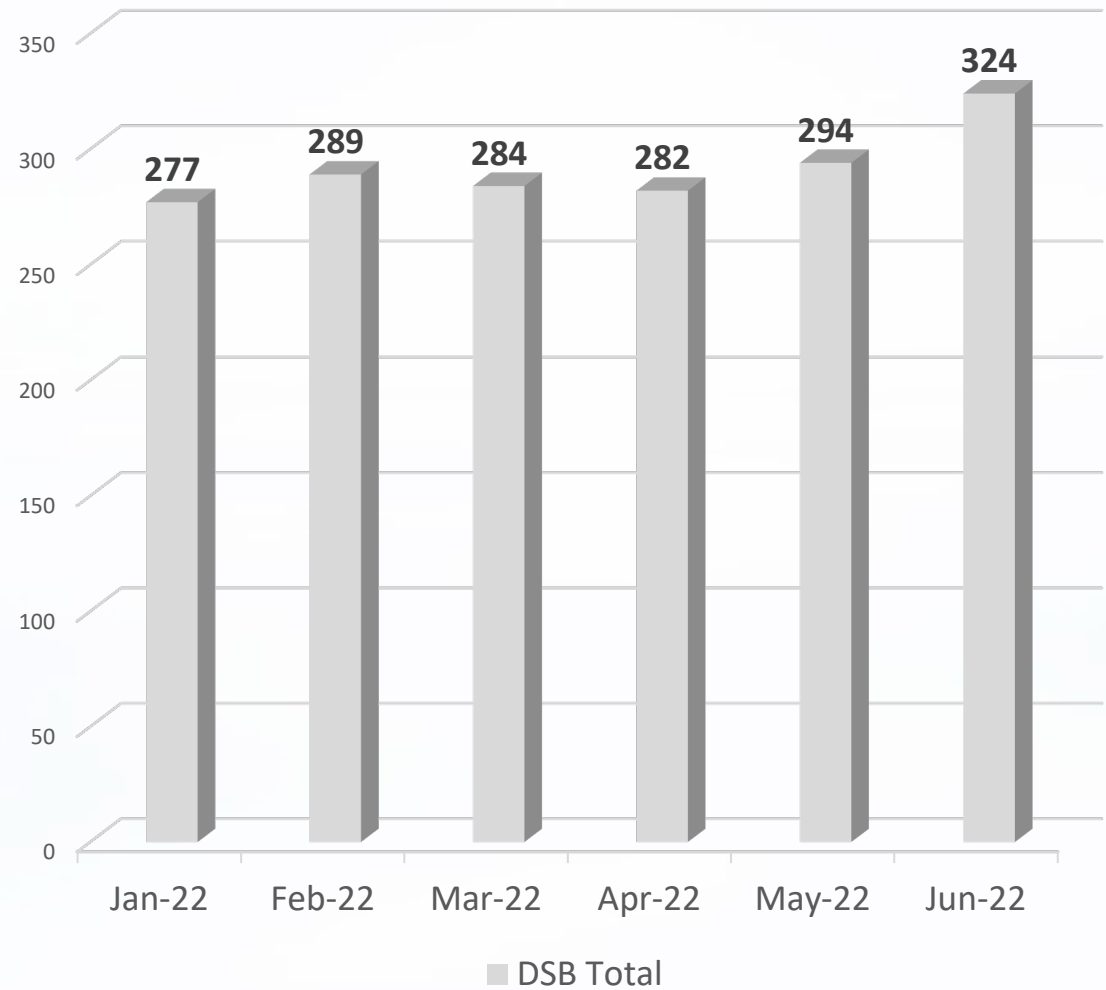

# JH AVERAGE DAILY POPULATION

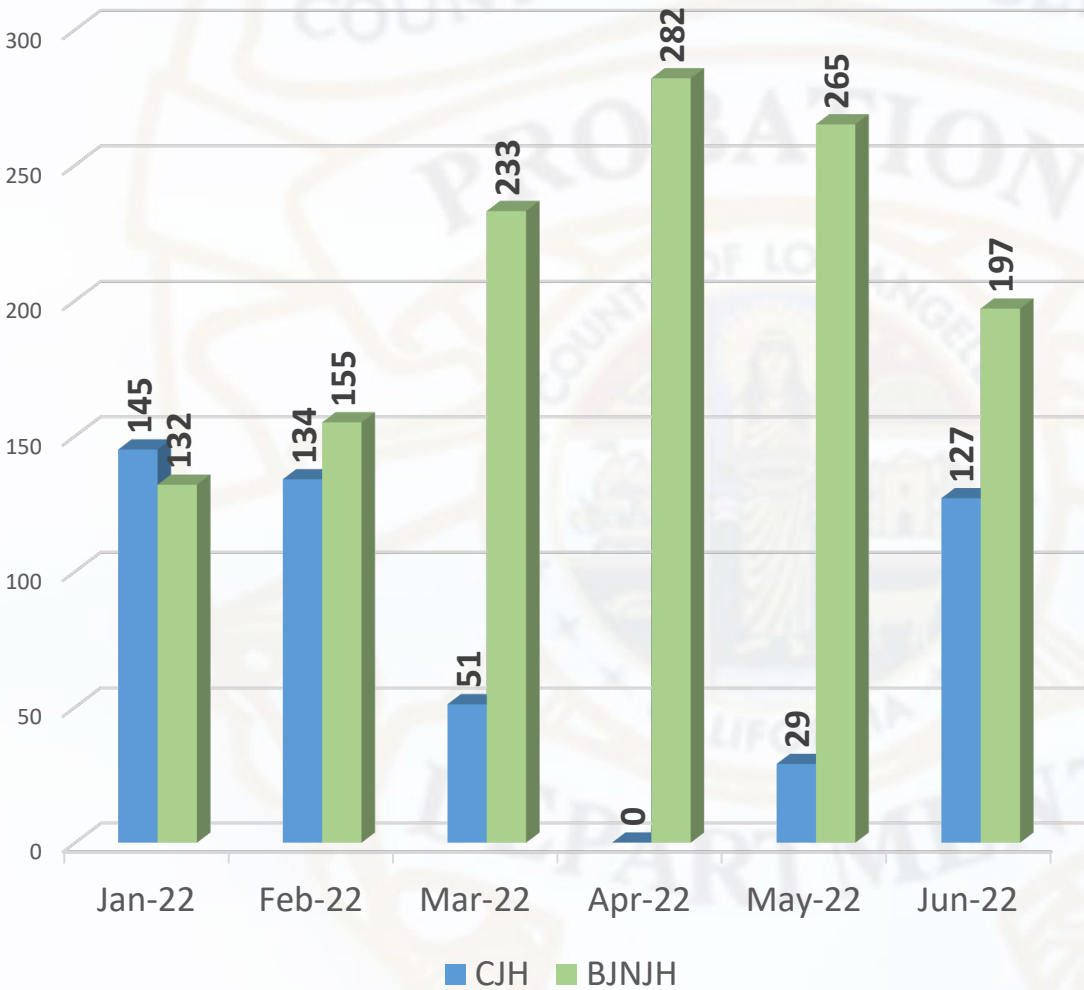

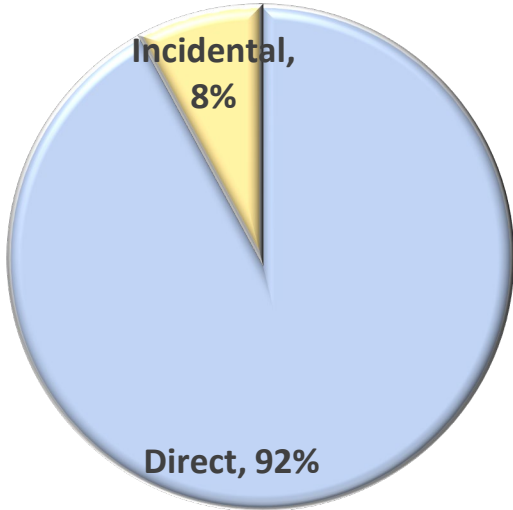

### SCM Intervention Utilized Q1 2022

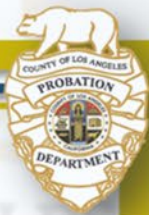

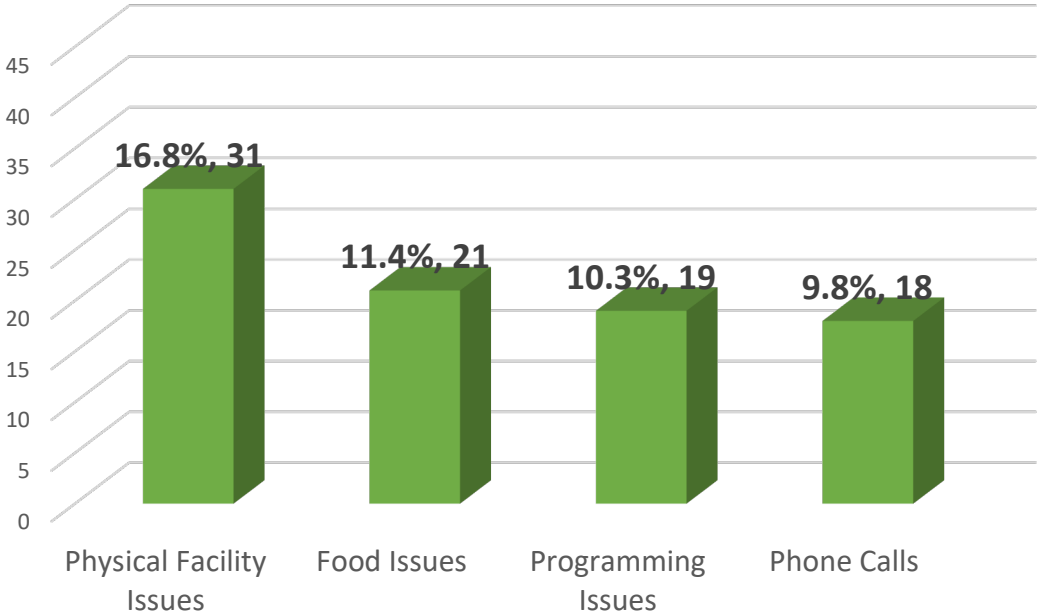


Physical Facility Issues	Youth has complaints concerning the facility. Often involves whether the unit or room is too hot or cold, if showers are too hot or cold.
Phone Calls	Youth has complaints about the frequency or lack thereof phone calls.
Medical/ Dental	Youth has complaints about medical and dental services, or lack thereof.
School Issues	Youth has a general complaint about school staff or programming.
Complaints about Youth	Youth has complaints about another youth.
Staff Concern	Youth has a general complaint about staff, i.e., feels ignored by staff, dissatisfied with how staff runs program, feels singled out by staff, hates the staff, etc.

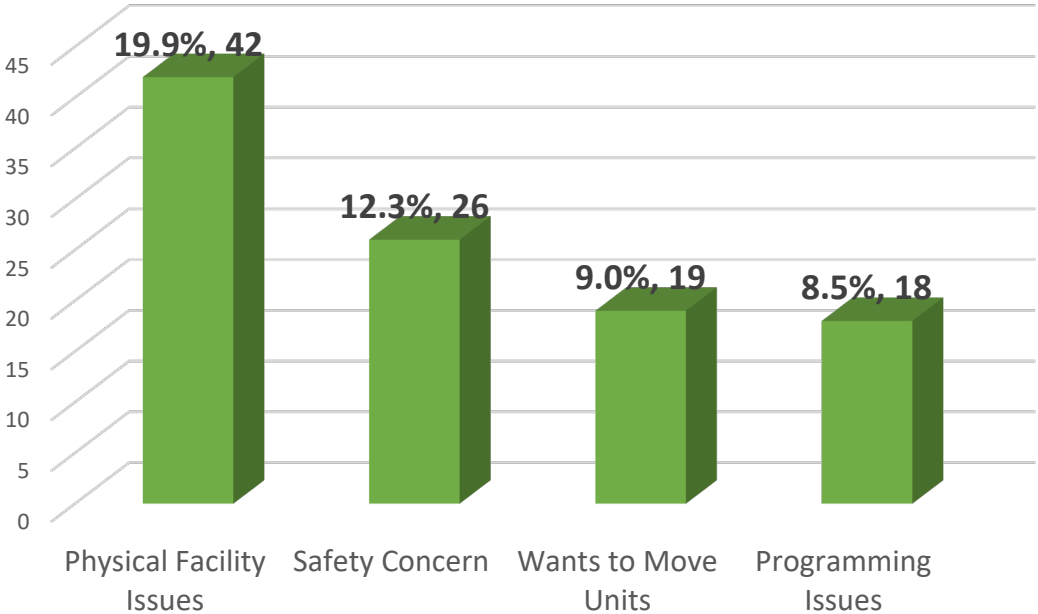

Food Issues	Youth has complaints about the food that is provided. Complaints can include but are not limited to too cold, not enough variety, not enough portions, tastes bad, etc.
Phone Calls	Youth has complaints about the frequency or lack thereof phone calls.
Wants to Move Units	Youth wants to move units.
Physical Facility Issues	Youth has complaints concerning the facility. Often involves whether the unit or room is too hot or cold, if showers are too hot or cold.
Programming Issues	Youth has complaints about how the program is conducted for them, i.e., confined in rooms too long, not enough programs, etc.
Staff Concern	Youth has a general complaint about staff, i.e., feels ignored by staff, dissatisfied with how staff runs program, feels singled out by staff, hates the staff, etc.

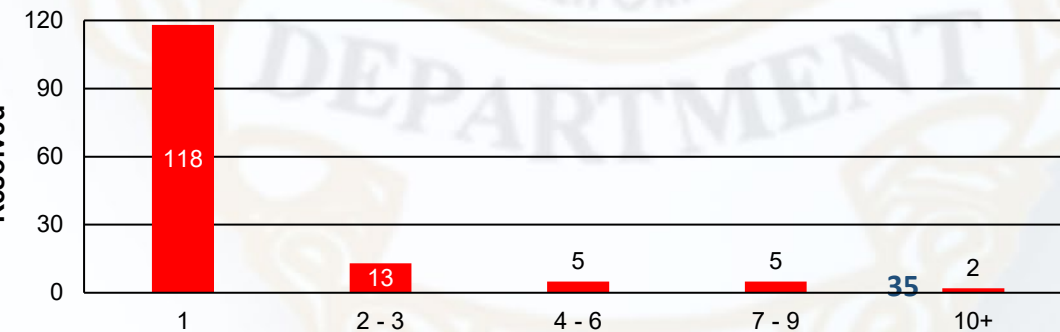

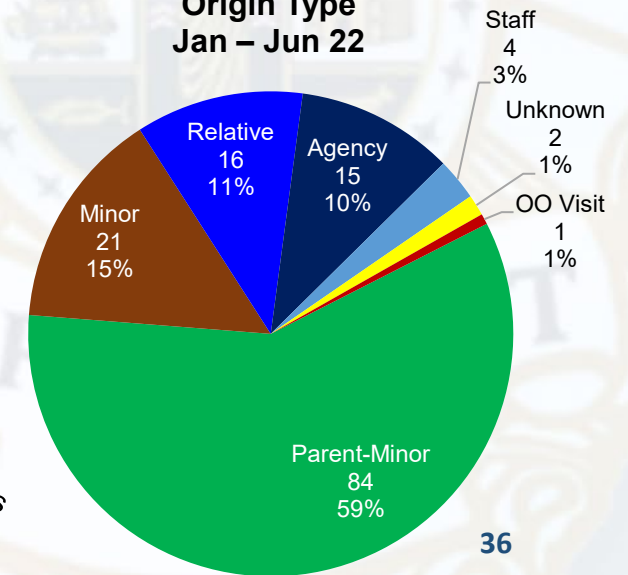
# Total Ombudsman Request by Type

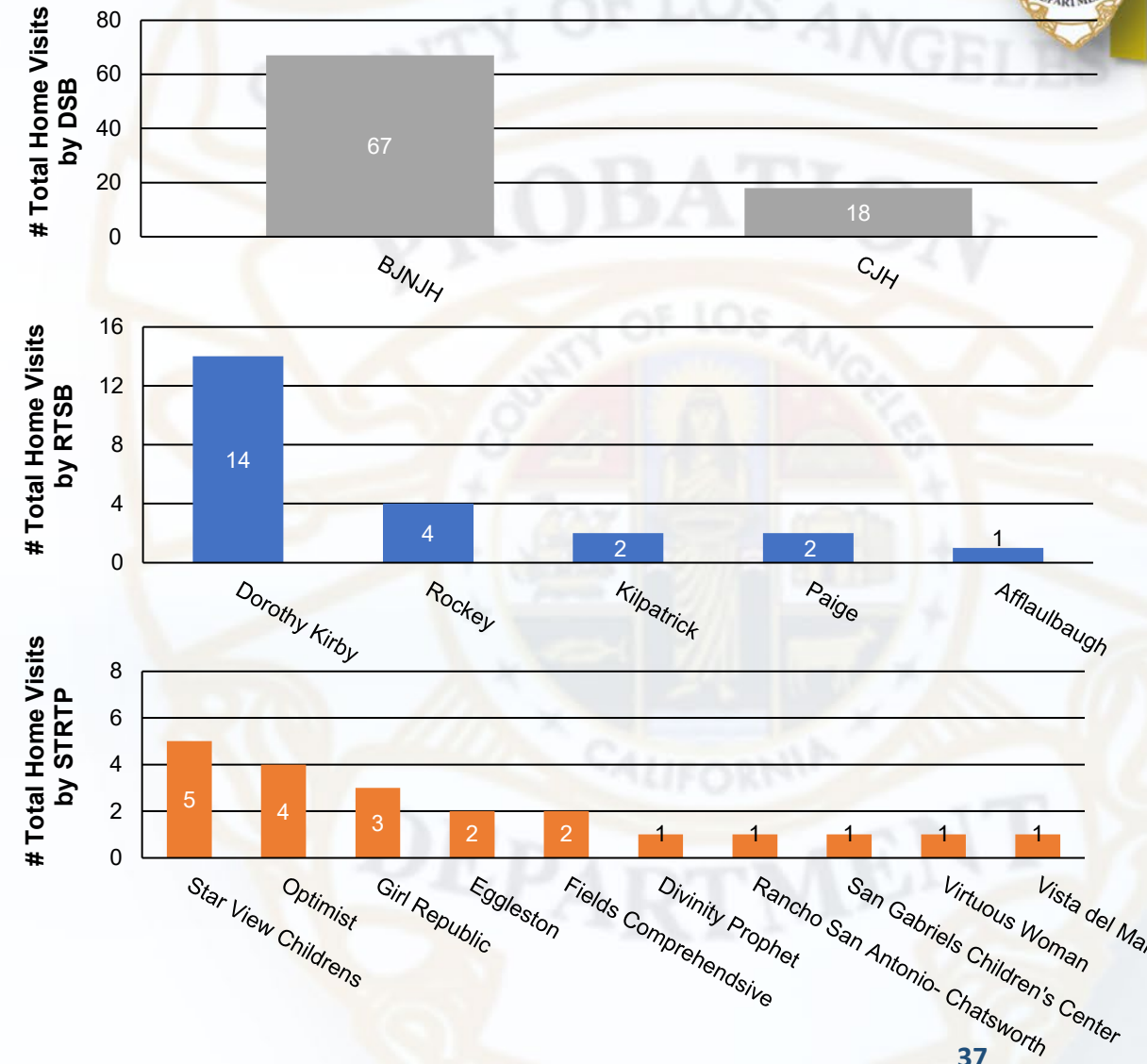
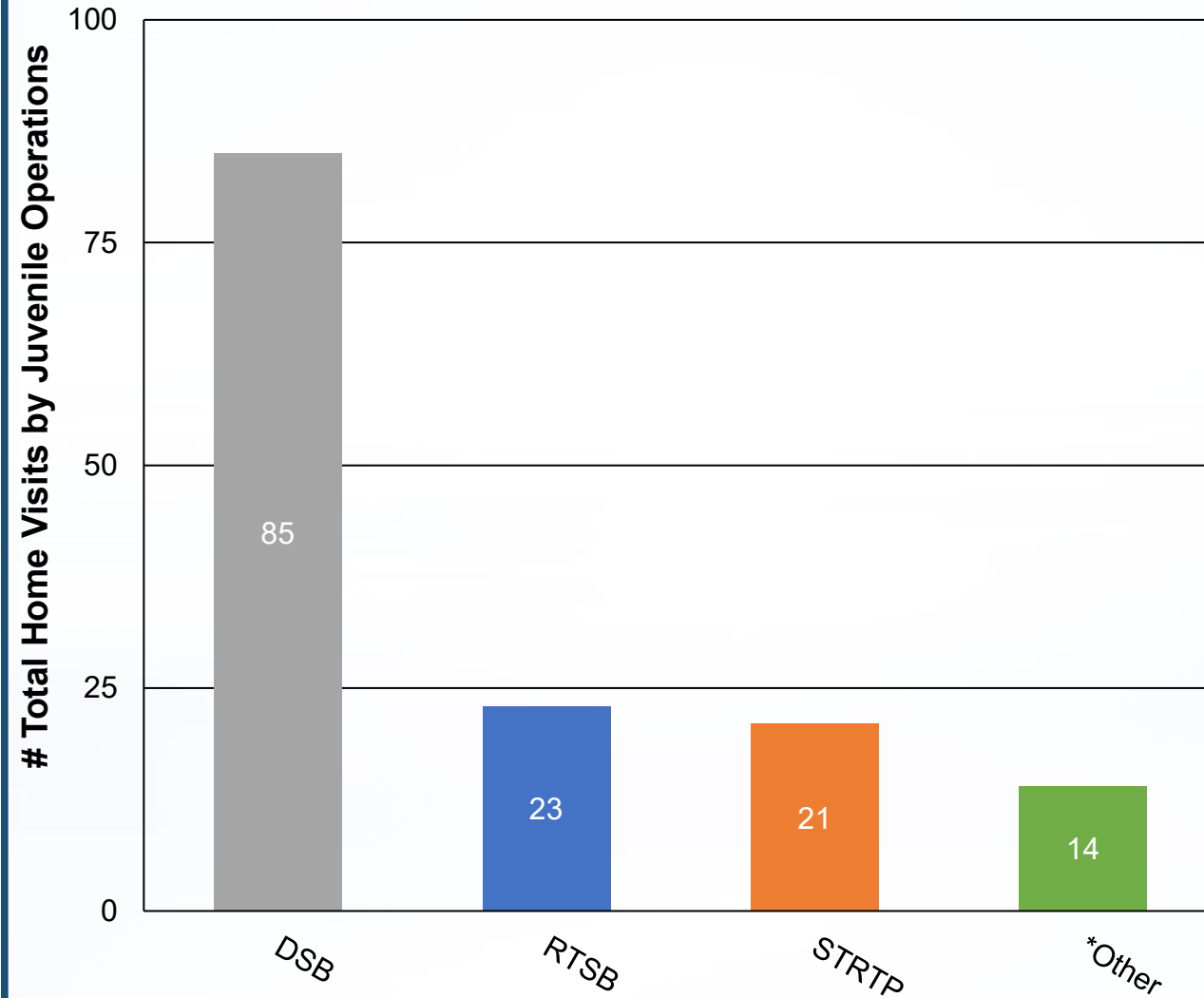
