 - a) Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO)
 - MacArthur Park Street Cleaning and Litter Abatement Workforce
 Development Program \$2,000,000 to provide justice-involved individuals with workforce development training and employment placement while providing a critical service
 - The Second District Community Beautification Workforce Development
 Program \$600,000 to provide justice-involved individuals with workforce development training and employment placement to clean and maintain public spaces and beautify the public realm
 - Skid Row Action Plan (SRAP): Economic Mobility Program for
 Entrepreneurs and Job Seekers \$1,715,000 to increase access to
 permanent and interim housing and boost economic opportunity through
 various services, including an Economic Mobility Program that includes
 Entrepreneurship Academy and Social Services Training program
 - b) Department of Health Services Integrated Correctional Health Services (DHS-ICHS)
 - ICHS Computer Upgrades for Mental Health Services \$343,000 to upgrade computers for security compliance for mental health staff
 - <u>ICHS Operations / Space Renovations</u> \$1,000,000 to renovate space to support the operational and infrastructure needs of increased staff and expansion of programs
 - ICHS Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) Migration and Phone
 Replacement \$103,000 to support the move from the LASD Call
 Manager to the DHS Call Manager, which would serve to upgrade the
 telecommunications infrastructure

- c) Department of Public Health Substance Abuse Prevention and Control (DPH-SAPC)
 - <u>Recovery-Oriented Permanent Housing</u> \$2,200,000 to create housing units for recovery-oriented, low-barrier, abstinence-based permanent housing environment for justice-involved individuals who are in recovery from SUD and at risk of experiencing homelessness
- d) Department of Military and Veterans Affairs
 - <u>Justice-Involved Veteran Services Enhancement Initiative</u> \$625,000 to improve services and access for justice-involved veterans, addressing systemic barriers that hinder reintegration and recovery
- e) Office of Diversion and Reentry (ODR)
 - <u>Crocker Harm Reduction Health Hub</u> \$1,000,000 to fund expanded operating hours for the drop-in center component of Crocker Harm Reduction Health Hub on Skid Row from 8 hours a day to 14 hours a day, 7 days a week
