III. AB 109 ONE-TIME FUNDING RECOMMENDATIONS FOR CONSIDERATION AND POTENTIAL ACTION OF SUPPORT

a. Alternate Public Defender's Office (APD)

1. Partners for Justice – support and expansion of the Partners for Justice (PFJ) Advocate program, which provides case management, client engagement, service navigation, and resource coordination (\$6.3 million over 5-year period)

b. Anti-Racism, Diversity, and Inclusion (ARDI) Initiative

1. Los Angeles County Neighborhood Topology Tool – a countywide resource that classifies neighborhoods according to their unique characteristics, assets, vulnerabilities, opportunities, service environments, and trajectories (\$500,000 over 2 to 3 years)
2. Safety and Mobility Harm Reduction Initiative – a 12-month pilot designed to prevent avoidable criminal-legal system contact arising from everyday mobility barriers (\$300,000 for 1-year period)

c. Department of Health Services Integrated Correctional Health Services (DHS-ICHS)

1. Mobile Stat Lab – one-time supplemental funding to bridge an operational gap in the Mobile Stat On-Site Laboratory Services (MSL) contract (\$1.02 million for a 1-year period)
2. Expand the Medications for Opioid Use Disorder (MOUD) program – procure and administer injectable buprenorphine (a long-acting MOUD formulation) that provides continuous therapeutic coverage, improves treatment adherence compared to daily oral alternatives, and establishes a clinical foundation for long-term recovery (\$4,800,000 for a 1-year period)
3. Inmate Reception Center (IRC) Health Information Management (HIM) Digital Infrastructure Upgrade – replacement of two mission-critical document scanners (\$40,000 for a one-time capital hardware acquisition)
4. Operational Facility Infrastructure Support – purchase of one electric vehicle utility truck to internalize and streamline daily interfacility facility services (\$99,615 for a one-time fixed asset allocation)

5. [IT Infrastructure End-Of-Life Hardware Replacement, Upgrade, Expansion, and Break Fix](#) – procurement of IT Hardware that are used around the clock by Mental Health and Medical Providers providing direct patient care (\$550,000 for one-time fixed asset allocation)
- d. Justice, Care, and Opportunities Department (JCOD)
 1. [BB2](#) – intensive, longer-term case management services coupled with an ongoing rental subsidy to former Breaking Barrers participants and/or justice impacted individuals (\$1,311,843 over 2-year period)
 2. [Reentry Interim Housing](#) – supportive, 24-hour temporary housing for single adults experiencing homelessness who are exiting incarceration or experiencing justice system involvement, for 9 months up to a year (\$3,248,865 for FY 26-27)
 - e. Department of Military and Veterans Affairs (MVA)
 1. [Veteran Ready LA County Departments / Veterans Treatment Court \(VTC\) Clinical Support Program](#) – expanded services for justice-involved veterans and increased capacity to identify and serve veterans involved in the criminal justice system (\$500,000 for 1-year period)
 - f. Office of Diversion and Reentry (ODR)
 1. [Skid Row Health Hubs](#) – non-acute outpatient clinic services and 20 community respite beds across both the Skid Row Care Campus and the Maple Health Hub (\$4.65 million over 2-year period)
 2. [Interim Housing Plus \(IH+\)](#) – a post-booking, pre-plea, jail-based diversion initiative designed to provide housing for individuals experiencing homelessness and living with serious and persistent mental illness (\$13.08 million over 3-year period)
 3. [MacArthur Park Health Hub](#) – leasing costs at the MacArthur Park Drop In Center, a site transitioning to be a part of the ODR Harm Reduction Division Network of Health Hubs (\$996,000 over 5-year period)

 1. [Partners for Justice](#) – support and expansion of the Partners for Justice (PFJ) Advocate program, which provides case management, client engagement, service navigation, and resource coordination (\$17.4 million over 5-year period)
