I would like to formally request an investigation into members of a Los Angeles County Deputy clique gang who have been violating my civil rights in San Pedro and Hawthorne since 2000. This group has committed numerous hate crimes and claims to be composed of sheriff deputies. In 2009, they set fire to my business in San Pedro, and they have continued to harass me in Hawthorne. The violations include stalking, the use of drones for surveillance, and continuous harassment by at least 25 individuals. They use electronic audio devices to issue threats and attempt to blackmail me into giving up my property and leaving the area.

Despite my attempts to seek assistance, I have received no support. I am requesting to speak with an investigator as this group is utilizing devices that emit microwave energy and radiation, causing severe health issues such as skin burns, bone cancer, and skin cancer to at least eight individuals. They are specifically targeting Hispanic people, and the devices they use are also causing sterilization.

Acknowledging that time is of the essence here, I am curious if the commission could use this Ad Hoc to examine the MOU as a whole and it's impact on public safety and county spending on LASD. The revision of the Collective Bargaining Agreement between the County and ALADS is done behind closed doors outside of public view. We hear time and time again at these meetings how the threat of litigation by ALADS thwarts oversight and transparency, and how ALADS uses the meet and confer to delay implementation of reforms and oversight. This outdated ratio provision that undermines the 2012 Commission's on Jail Violence recommendations is likely one of many provisions that allows LASD to justify it's bloated budget and frustrates this commission's ability to perform its

oversights duties. We ask that the COC puts energy into examining the MOU in its entirety in light of this limited window to influence this document that has a profound effect on public safety.

The revision of the County's Collective Bargaining Agreement with ALADS should involve public participation and transparency. These negotiations are crucial to public safety and directly impact how billions of county dollars are spent. These proceedings should not be happening behind closed doors - the public has an interest in being a part of this process. ALADS continues to weaponize its position as a police association to effectively block all efforts at oversight, reform, and transparency at the county and state level, and in the courts. Allowing the Collective Bargaining Agreement to be updated in secret, away from public scrutiny or community input undermines the goals of this Civilian Oversight Commission and the spirit of the transparency ordinance adopted by the Board of Supervisors on March 15, 2022. These negotiations have too great of an impact on the community to be held in secret without any meaningful avenue for public input or participation.

Further, while we are in favor of any effort that could result in shrinking LASD's presence in the community, we have seen time after time how ALADS will use the "meet and confer" process—more aptly referred to as "meet and defer" by advocates—to obstruct and delay reform efforts, including new state laws. Because of "meet and defer," it took nearly three years for LASD to adopt a state-mandated policy

B. Report on Article 29 of the County's Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) with Association for Los Angeles Deputy Sheriffs (ALADS). (10 mins) • Bikila Ochoa, Deputy Executive Officer, COC Action Item: Motion to allow the Commission to recommend to the Sheriff and the County that the provision mandating a 65-35 ratio of deputies to custody assistants be removed as part of the re-negotiation of the CBA with ALADS. It is further moved that the Chair of the Commission be directed to form a new Ad Hoc Committee, to be called the Jail Staffing Ad Hoc Committee, to examine what is the ideal ratio of deputies to custody assistants and make any appropriate recommendations to the Sheriff regarding jail staffing.

Measure R and Measure J are both still caught in ALADS' "meet and defer" web years after the people of Los Angeles County voted for this Commission to have subpoena power and to invest in alternatives to the criminal legal system. This strategic exploitation of state labor laws is all the more reason why the County's negotiation's over the Collective Bargaining Agreement with ALADS must ensure a public and transparent process. We need sunlight on ALADS' role in undercutting the public's demand for sheriff accountability and this Commission's ability to do its job.
