Briefly provide a description of the incident/event:	Summary Corrective Action Plan 2025-286 Details in this document summarize the incident. The information provided is a culmination of various sources to provide an abstract of the incident. On June 20, 2023, Lieutenant One was driving her assigned County vehicle in the County of Los Angeles. Lieutenant One was traveling eastbound on a roadway behind the Plaintiff's vehicle. The traffic signal facing the Plaintiff and Lieutenant One at the next intersection was red. Lieutenant One failed to observe the red traffic signal. She collided with the rear of the Plaintiff's vehicle at approximately 20 to 30 mph. The California Highway Patrol investigated the traffic collision. While interviewing Lieutenant One, the investigating officer perceived an odor of alcohol on her breath and observed her eyes to appear bloodshot. The investigating officer conducted a field sobriety test. The investigating officer determined Lieutenant One was at fault in causing the collision by illegally operating a vehicle under the influence of alcohol with an associated factor of traveling at a speed that is greater than is reasonably prudent pursuant to California Vehicle Code section 22350. Lieutenant One was placed under arrest for driving under the influence of alcohol. The Los Angeles County District Attorney's office filed charges against Lieutenant One. On March 6, 2026, she pleaded guilty for the DUI and was sentenced to three years summary probation. Lieutenant One has since retired from the Department.

1. Briefly describe the root cause(s) of the claim/lawsuit:

A **Department** root cause in this incident was Lieutenant One's consumption of alcohol prior to driving.

A **Department** root cause in this incident was Lieutenant One's unsafe speed prior to, and at the time of the collision.

A **Department** root cause in this incident was Lieutenant One was driving her Department issued vehicle and was in possession of her duty weapon and equipment after the consumption of alcohol.

2. Briefly describe recommended corrective actions:

Traffic Collision Investigation

The incident was thoroughly investigated by representatives from the CHP. The collision investigation concluded that the deputy sheriff caused the collision as she was driving at an unsafe speed towards the intersection while intoxicated. The results of the traffic investigation were presented to Department executives for review and disposition.

Criminal Investigation

The Los Angeles County District Attorney's office filed misdemeanor DUI charges against Lieutenant One. On March 6, 2026, she pleaded guilty and was sentenced to three years summary probation.

Administrative Investigation

This incident will be investigated by representatives from the Internal Affairs Bureau (IAB), to determine if any administrative misconduct occurred before, during, or after this incident. Once the administrative investigation has concluded, the findings will be submitted for Executive review and disposition.

Traffic Collision Assessment and Review

The unit conducted a review and assessment of all traffic collisions for the past four years. Traffic mitigation efforts have been implemented, and the unit has since seen a reduction in collisions.

Safety messages are broadcast to remind personnel of their responsibilities when entering intersections and their duties to drive in a safe manner and clear intersections lane by lane.

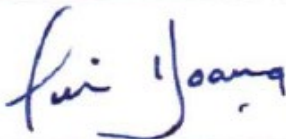
Sheriff Department Announcement - Department Wide Re-brief
