SUBJECT

The County, through the Los Angeles County Department of Arts and Culture, provides grants to nonprofit arts organizations to deliver a wide variety of cultural services to County residents and to support arts and culture throughout the region. Grants to nonprofit organizations in artistic disciplines such as visual arts, media arts, literary arts, film, music, and performing arts provide concerts, theatre productions, exhibits, arts education programs, and sustain the core operations of a community-based organizations that reflect and serve our diverse communities, increase access to the arts, and improve quality of life for residents throughout the County.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:

1. Approve grants to 227 nonprofit arts organizations at a cost of \$4,518,000 for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-23 Organizational Grant Program (OGP), as such grants help to meet the needs of constituents by fostering excellence, diversity, vitality, understanding and accessibility of the arts in Los Angeles County.
2. Instruct the Department of Arts and Culture Director to prepare, sign and execute contracts and approve expenditures necessary to implement the 2022-23 OGP after County Counsel approves as to form.
3. Delegate authority to the Department of Arts and Culture to reallocate forfeited grant awards, not to exceed \$100,000 in aggregate, to existing Board-approved grantee organizations and instruct the Department of Arts and Culture Director to amend these contracts accordingly.
4. Find that the proposed actions are exempt from California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) for the reasons stated in the Board Letter and the record.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

The purpose of this recommended action is to disburse grant funds allocated by your Board. This is the annual implementation of the Organizational Grant Program (OGP), LA County's flagship arts sector grant program. All organizations apply for two years of consecutive funding and all award amounts are for two years. The number of recommended grantees in 2022-23 is 227.

Organizational Grant Program 1/Small Budget Organizations

This category provides support for nonprofit arts organizations with budgets up to \$199,999. OGP 1 grant funds will be disbursed to 108 nonprofit arts organizations (see Attachment A Pg. 1-12) at a cost of \$1,099,600.

Organizational Grant Program 2/Mid-Size Budget Organizations

This category provides support for nonprofit arts organizations with budgets between \$200,000 and \$999,999. OGP 2 grant funds will be disbursed to 81 nonprofit arts organizations (see Attachment A Pg. 13-20) at a cost of \$1,704,100.

Organizational Grant Program 3/Larger Mid-Size Budget Organizations

This category provides support for nonprofit arts organizations with budgets between \$1,000,000 and \$14,999,999. OGP 3 grant funds will be disbursed to 32 nonprofit arts organizations (see Attachment A Pg. 21-24) at a cost of \$1,250,400.

Organizational Grant Program 4/Large Budget Organizations

This category provides support for nonprofit arts organizations with budgets of \$15 million and greater. Grants must be used for programs that increase access to cultural services for County residents. OGP 4 grant funds will be disbursed to 6 nonprofit arts organizations (see Attachment A Pg. 25-26) at a cost of \$463,900.00.

Grant amounts are awarded based on a formula adopted by the Arts Commission. This year, the 227 recommended organizations requested a total of \$9,536,274 in grant funding, which exceeded the available funding of \$4,518,000. Therefore, the final awards across all OGP categories were reduced to 47% of the fundable request amount (score multiplied by total amount requested) consistent with the adopted formula. Scores are determined by evaluating the organization's artistic quality and accomplishments, quality of standards-based K-12 arts education services (if applicable), services to community/audience, evaluation methodology, and fiscal and administrative competence.

Since funding is over two years, organizations that receive grants apply every other year. For your information, also attached is a list of 231 grants that were made last year in FY 2021-22 (Attachment A Pg. 27-30) to provide you with a full perspective of all arts and cultural organizations that are supported through this program. A total of \$4,518,000 was allocated in FY 2021-22 for 231 grants as follows: 114 organizations received funding in the OGP 1/Small Budget category, 73 organizations received funding in the OGP 2/Mid-Size Budget category, 39 organizations received funding in the OGP 3/Mid-Size Budget category, and 5 organizations received funding in the OGP 4/Large Budget category. Combined, this is the largest group of awarded organizations in the program's history at 458 organizations.

IMPLEMENTATION OF STRATEGIC PLAN GOALS

The recommended actions support Countywide Strategic Plan Goal II: Foster Vibrant and Resilient Communities, as arts and cultural resources support healthy and vibrant communities and the proposed organization's contracts will help to meet the needs of constituents by providing direct access and

increased opportunities for quality arts activities and programming that is often free or low cost throughout Los Angeles County.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

Funding for the OGP is included in the Department of Arts and Culture's FY 2022-23 Adopted budget.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

The Department of Arts and Culture utilized peer panels grouped by artistic discipline to review and score all applications and to make recommendations to the Arts Commission. The Arts Commission reviewed these scores and allocations at their meeting on June 13, 2022 and voted to approve the funding recommendations for submission to your Board for approval.

Upon notification of a forfeited FY 2022-23 OGP grant award, the Department of Arts and Culture will reallocate the forfeited funds to existing Board-approved grantee organizations. The reallocation will be approved by the Arts Commission.

For FY 2021-22, there were no reallocations made as no grantees forfeited funding.

The County is authorized to contract with any firm or corporation for artistic services for the residents of Los Angeles County pursuant to Government Code sections 25562 and 26227. The contractor (grantee) will be governed by the policy and guideline requirements of the Department of Arts and Culture. Grantees are defined as nonprofit 501(c)(3) organizations with missions to provide arts services for the benefit of the public.

ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION

The recommended actions are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to sections 15301, 15304(e), 15322, and 15323 of the CEQA Guidelines. The OGP programs 1) utilize existing facilities making either minor or negligible alterations to the environment; 2) make minor alterations to land having negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; 3) involve educational or training programs with no physical outdoor alterations to the environment; or 4) consist of normal operations of facilities for public gatherings. In addition, based on the proposed projects records, they will comply with all applicable regulations, and they are not in a sensitive environment, and there are no cumulative impacts, unusual circumstances, damage to scenic highways, listing on hazardous waste site lists compiled pursuant to Government Code section 65962.5, or indications that they may cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of a historical resource that would make any of the exemption inapplicable.

CONTRACTING PROCESS

The County will pay the contractor (grantee), in consideration of services to be performed and fulfillment of matching requirements, a specific grant award sum (see Attachment A Pg. 1-30).

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)

This program ensures that a wide variety of diverse cultural services will continue to reach County residents. These services will positively impact residents, neighborhoods and communities by providing direct access and increased opportunities for quality arts activities and programming that is often free or low cost, while also supporting a cornerstone of our region's creative economy. The proposed grantee organizations are located throughout LA County with offices in 37 of the County's 88 municipalities with programs and services provided in all five supervisorial districts.

**RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING
2022-23 AWARDS FOR COMMUNITY IMPACT ARTS GRANTS
(ALL DISTRICTS) (3 VOTES)**

SUBJECT

The County of Los Angeles (County), through the Los Angeles County Department of Arts and Culture, invests in diverse communities through the Community Impact Arts Grant (CIAG). In this seventh year of awards, and the first year as an ongoing program of the Department of Arts and Culture, CIAG provides arts programming grants to advance the organizational missions and values of County nonprofits and municipalities and enables these organizations to deliver a wide variety of cultural services to County residents that support arts and culture throughout the region. Grants to organizations providing mental health, disability, environmental, homeless, immigrant rights, youth and veteran services broaden the contexts in which arts are accessed for County residents who may not receive arts programming through traditional outlets, offering the opportunity to experience a range of artistic disciplines including, but not limited to, visual and media arts, performance, dance and music.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:

1. Find that the proposed projects are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act, for the reasons stated in this Board letter and in the records of the projects.
2. Approve the CIAG program grants to 75 nonprofit organizations at a total cost of \$750,000 for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-23, as approved by the Arts Commission.
3. Find that the expenditure of said funds is necessary to meet the social needs of the County and the programs funded thereby will serve a public purpose.
4. Delegate authority to the Department of Arts and Culture Director, or her designee, to prepare, execute, and amend, as necessary, contracts, approved as to form by County Counsel, to implement the 2022-23 CIAG program.
5. Delegate authority to the Department of Arts and Culture Director, or her designee, to reallocate forfeited grant awards, not to exceed \$50,000, to existing Board-approved grantee organizations and instruct the Department of Arts and Culture Director, or her designee, to amend these contracts accordingly.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approval of the recommended actions will find that these projects are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act and allow the Los Angeles County Department of Arts and Culture (Department of Arts and Culture) to disburse the \$750,000 grant funds allocated by your Board. 76 eligible organizations applied for project funding totaling \$1,275,730 in requests. In concluding the application and selection process, 75 organizations are recommended for awards totaling \$750,000 which is the total funding allocated to the CIAG program. All award amounts recommended as part of this action are for one year.

The Department of Arts and Culture has found that CIAG grants are serving a wide variety of populations and communities underserved by the arts as measured by specific populations, race and ethnicity, and poverty rates. Moreover, the constituencies reached through CIAG and Organizational Grant Program (OGP) are distinct and, combined, both programs serve LA County residents. CIAG grantees serve diverse communities in terms of race and ethnicity and significantly more communities where more than a quarter of the population earns less than the federal poverty level. Additionally, CIAG reaches a large number of communities living in zip codes not reached by OGP. Foster youth, homeless individuals, currently or formerly incarcerated individuals, individuals with disabilities, and low-income individuals are all being served by CIAG grantees, and many CIAG organizations are located in areas identified by the Portrait of LA County as “struggling” or “precarious” as evidenced by the level of local disparities.

The Board’s ongoing investment in the CIAG program ensures that a wide variety of cultural services reach County residents in ways that are distinct and complementary to the services provided by OGP grantees. Additionally, the program supports the meaningful role of arts and culture in social service and social justice organizations in our most underserved areas. Overall, the findings show that CIAG is achieving a critical goal set out by the Board of Supervisors to expand the ways we serve and invest in our communities, particularly those that have been historically and systemically marginalized.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

Funding for the CIAG is included in the Department of Arts and Culture’s FY 2022-23 Adopted budget.

IMPLEMENTATION OF STRATEGIC PLAN GOALS

The recommended actions support Countywide Strategic Plan Goal II: Foster Vibrant and Resilient Communities, as the proposed organizations’ contracts will help to meet the needs of constituents by advancing their access to arts, culture, and creativity in Los Angeles County.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

The Department of Arts and Culture utilized peer panels organized by communities served to review and score all applications and to make recommendations to the Arts Commissioners. The Arts Commission reviewed these scores and allocations at their meeting on April 25, 2022 and voted to approve the funding recommendations for submission to your Board for approval.

Grant amounts are awarded utilizing a formula adopted by the Department of Arts and Culture that factors in panel scores. Scores are determined by evaluating the proposed program’s artistic merit, services to community, evaluation methodology and fiscal and administrative competence. Applicants were able to request \$5,000 to \$20,000 for projects. Given available funding, organizations that scored 70 or higher out of a maximum possible score of 100 points will receive an average of approximately 59% of their request amounts. This is notably less than the 73% organizations received in the prior funding cycle, due to a 19% increase in fundable applications in the program this year.

Upon notification of a forfeited FY 2022-23 CIAG grant award, the Department of Arts and Culture will reallocate the forfeited funds to existing Board-approved grantee organizations. The reallocation will be approved by the Arts Commission.

The County is authorized to contract with any firm or corporation for artistic services for the residents of Los Angeles County pursuant to Government Code sections 25562 and 26227. The contractor (grantee) will be governed by the policy and guideline requirements of the Department of Arts and Culture. Grantees are defined as nonprofit 501(c)(3) organizations, municipalities, or municipal departments with missions to provide arts services for the benefit of the public.

ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION

The recommended actions are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to sections 15301, 15304(e), 15322, and 15323 of the CEQA Guidelines. The CIAG programs 1) utilize existing facilities making either minor or negligible alterations to the environment; 2) make minor alterations to land having negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; 3) involve educational or training programs with no physical outdoor alterations to the environment; or 4) consist of normal operations of facilities for public gatherings. In addition, based on the proposed projects records, they will comply with all applicable regulations, and they are not in a sensitive environment, and there are no cumulative impacts, unusual circumstances, damage to scenic highways, listing on hazardous waste site lists compiled pursuant to Government Code section 65962.5, or indications that they may cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of a historical resource that would make any of the exemption inapplicable.

CONTRACTING PROCESS

The County will pay the contractor (grantee), in consideration of services to be performed and fulfillment of matching requirements, a specific grant award sum (see BOS Attachments Pg. 1-12).

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)

The Community Impact Arts Grant program expands the County's services to reach diverse constituents and recognizes the value of the arts as a vital tool for cross-sector and civic problem solving across a range of issue areas and supports arts programming taking place at nonprofit social service, social justice, health organizations and municipal departments as part of their larger missions to provide services to individuals and communities. This program ensures that a wide variety of cultural services will continue to reach County residents and positively impact them through increased opportunities for arts activities in various contexts, such as mental health, homelessness, youth and social justice. The proposed grantee organizations are located throughout LA County with programs and services provided in all five supervisorial districts.

Teachers, school district staff, mental health clinicians, social workers, and caregivers who are trained and equipped to implement healing-informed arts instruction will be better able to support the mental health and wellbeing of youth they serve. In fiscal year 2022-2023, \$425,000 from the Hilton Foundation will allow the collaborating agencies to build foundational components of the Creative Wellbeing approach (replication, partnership-building, and evaluation), in preparation for future growth and expansion.

**ACCEPTANCE OF GRANT AWARD OF \$425,000 FROM THE
CONRAD N. HILTON FOUNDATION
(ALL DISTRICTS) (3 VOTES)**

SUBJECT

The Los Angeles County Department of Arts and Culture (Arts and Culture) has been awarded a \$425,000 grant from the Conrad N. Hilton Foundation (Hilton Foundation), to support the mental health and resilience of foster youth and caregivers through the Creative Wellbeing approach.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD:

1. Find that the proposed actions are not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), for the reasons stated in this Board letter and the record.
2. Approve and authorize the Director of Arts and Culture to accept the grant award of \$425,000 from the Hilton Foundation, to support the mental health and resilience of foster youth and caregivers through the Creative Wellbeing approach.
3. Approve and authorize the Director of Arts and Culture, or her designee, to sign and execute a Grant Agreement, substantially similar to Attachment I, with the Hilton Foundation.
4. Delegate authority to the Director, or her designee, subject to prior review and approval as to form by County, to prepare, sign, and execute future amendments to: 1) extend the term; 2) add, delete, modify, or replace terms, including the Statement of Work; 3) allow for the rollover of unspent funds; and 4) reflect regulatory and/or policy changes.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

In 2002, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors launched the Los Angeles County Arts Education Collective (Arts Ed Collective) as a regional effort to restore the arts in public education. Coordinated by the Los Angeles County Department of Arts and Culture, the Arts Ed Collective is recognized as a

national model of collective impact in arts education. Starting with just one school district in each Supervisorial District nearly two decades ago, the Arts Ed Collective now includes a robust coalition – that represents 74 school districts, five charter school networks, a half-dozen County agencies, and hundreds of community-based arts organizations, teaching artists, educators, philanthropists, and advocates – all working toward the shared goal that every young person in LA County engages in the arts all year, every year, because the arts are fundamental to human growth and development.

On October 13, 2020 the Board of Supervisors unanimously adopted Los Angeles County's New Regional Blueprint for Arts Education (Arts Education Blueprint). Building on nearly two decades of work and drawing input from over 600 stakeholders, the Arts Education Blueprint presents an expanded approach with strategies that reach beyond school to include:

- arts instruction for all students, across all grade levels, in all public schools;
- expanded opportunities for arts education after school;
- year-round community-based arts learning;
- access to careers in the creative economy;
- arts-based programs and services, provided in collaboration with multiple County departments, that support children, youth and families; and
- a prioritization of historically underserved populations.

During the 2019-2020 fiscal year, Arts and Culture began partnering with the Department of Mental Health (DMH), Children & Family Services (DCFS), Office of Child Protection (OCP), and the Arts for Healing and Justice Network (AHJN) to implement Creative Wellbeing, an approach to positive youth development that uses arts and mental health strategies to increase protective factors like coping skills, sociability, and community supports. Creative Wellbeing provides system-involved youth with culturally relevant, healing-centered arts education while establishing a network of service providers, caregivers, and educators who implement, share, and sustain practices for self-care, community-care, and social-emotional supports that address trauma and promote healthy families. Services are offered to youth and adult staff at Short Term Residential Therapeutic Programs (STRTP), Temporary Shelter Care Facilities (TSCF), Foster Family Agencies (FFA) that support resource families and foster youth, school districts with high numbers of system-involved youth, and as a part of suicide prevention networks. The approach has also been introduced to County staff at DMH and the Department of Health Services (DHS) to promote resiliency among County employees who support system-involved youth.

Through decades of arts-based programming, research, and experience, the Department of Arts and Culture has seen first-hand how arts education provides youth with an opportunity to learn new skills and express their thoughts and ideas in creative ways. Teachers, school district staff, mental health clinicians, social workers, and caregivers who are trained and equipped to implement healing-informed arts instruction will be better able to support the mental health and wellbeing of youth they serve. In fiscal year (FY) 2022-23, \$425,000 from the Hilton Foundation will allow the collaborating agencies to build foundational components of the Creative Wellbeing approach through replication, partnership-building, and evaluation, in preparation for the County to support this work ongoing to sustain it for the benefit of systems impacted youth, and then support future growth and expansion.

Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

This action supports County Strategic Plan Goal No. II (Foster Vibrant and Resilient Communities), Strategy II.2.2 (Expand Access to Recreational and Cultural Opportunities) and Goal No. I (Make Investments That Transform Lives) Strategy I.3.1 (Reduce the Incidence of Involvement with the Justice System Among Vulnerable Populations) as Arts and Culture works to build an infrastructure for positive youth development that addresses large-scale societal inequities, fosters social-emotional development, promotes healing and wellness, builds cohesion and cultural identity, and uplifts

communities through the arts.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

There is no Net County Cost impact. Arts and Culture will submit a request to budget the grant revenue of \$425,000 in the FY 2022-23 Supplemental Changes budget phase.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

This Hilton Foundation grant would be accepted pursuant to the guidelines of Section 9.2.0 of the Fiscal Manual. On June 28, 2021, the Board authorized Arts and Culture to accept grant awards that do not exceed \$250,000.

The proposed actions are not subject to CEQA because they are activities that are excluded from the definition of a project by section 21065 of the Public Resources Code and section 15378(b) of the State CEQA Guidelines. The proposed actions to accept grant funds and execute a grant agreement are organizational or administrative activities of government, which will not result in direct or indirect physical changes to the environment.

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)

Hilton Foundation grant funds will be used to build foundational components of the Creative Wellbeing approach (replication, partnership-building, and evaluation), in preparation for the program to be sustained ongoing with future growth and expansion that will increasingly support the mental health and resilience of foster youth and caregivers through the Creative Wellbeing approach.
