### **SUBJECT**

Public Works is seeking Board approval to authorize the Director of Public Works or his designee to execute a cooperative agreement and amendments to the agreement between the Los Angeles County and Caltrans. The agreement provides for Caltrans to prepare and deliver a Project Initiation Document to implement a proposed diverging diamond interchange along Rosemead Boulevard at State Route 60 in the unincorporated community of Whittier Narrows.

### IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD:

- Find that the proposed actions are not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act for the reasons stated in this Board letter and in the record of the project.
- Authorize the Director of Public Works or his designee to enter into a cooperative agreement and amendments to the agreement with the State of California through its Department of Transportation, whereby the State will prepare and deliver a Project Initiation Document to implement a diverging diamond interchange along Rosemead Boulevard over State Route 60 for an amount not to exceed \$650,000.

### PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approval of the recommended actions will find that they are not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and authorize the Director to execute a cooperative agreement between the County and Caltrans under which Caltrans will develop a Project Initiation Document (PID) to implement a diverging diamond interchange along Rosemead Boulevard at State Route 60 (SR 60) for an amount not to exceed \$650,000. Preparation of the PID for improvements on Rosemead Boulevard at SR 60 is part of the County's efforts to improve pedestrian and bicyclist access along the Rosemead Boulevard corridor.

### IMPLEMENTATION OF STRATEGIC PLAN GOALS

These recommendations support the County Strategic Plan: Strategy II.2, Support the Wellness of our Communities and Objective II.2.2, Expand Access to Recreational and Cultural Opportunities and Objective II.2.4, Promote Active and Healthy Lifestyles. These actions will lead to improvements to the quality of life for its residents by providing pedestrian and bicycle access to nearby recreational areas.

### FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

There will be no impact to the County General Fund.

Caltrans will develop a PID to implement a diverging diamond interchange along Rosemead Boulevard at SR 60 for an estimated cost of \$500,000 plus \$150,000 in contingency for a total amount of \$650,000. Funding is included in the First Supervisorial District's Transportation Improvement Program in the Proposition C Local Return Fund (CN9 – Services and Supplies) Fiscal Year 2023-24 Budget. Funding for future years will be requested through the annual budget process.

### FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

In October 2015 the County was awarded grant funds in the amount of \$1,000,000 from Caltrans Active Transportation Program for the Rosemead Boulevard Complete Streets Improvements Phase 1 project to develop a scoping document for pedestrian, bicyclist, and transit access improvements along Rosemead Boulevard from Rush Street to Gallatin Road.

The portion of Rosemead Boulevard was a State highway at the time and efforts to relinquish the roadway from the State to the County were already underway. Senate Bill 461 was signed into law in October 2015 which provided for the relinquishment.

In May 2018 the County entered into an agreement with Caltrans to accept the relinquishment of the portion of Rosemead Boulevard. The relinquishment was completed in July 2018 which made the portion of Rosemead Boulevard a County-owned and maintained roadway.

Although the roadway is a County-owned and maintain roadway, the portion over SR 60 is within Caltrans jurisdiction. The project requires the County to enter into cooperative agreements with Caltrans for implementing the improvements within Caltrans jurisdiction at various stages of the project. The first cooperative agreement is to develop a PID.

Under the terms of the proposed cooperative agreement Caltrans will prepare and develop a PID to implement a diverging diamond interchange along Rosemead Boulevard at SR 60. The County is agreeing to fund the preparation and development of the PID for an estimated cost of \$500,000. The County is to deposit with Caltrans the amount of \$100,000 prior to performing work on this project. Thereafter, the County will reimburse Caltrans for actual costs performed under the agreement. Public Works is requesting authority to cover the estimated \$500,000 plus an additional \$150,000 in contingency for a total amount of \$650,000.

Caltrans and the County are authorized to enter into cooperative agreements for improvements to the State Highway System in accordance with the California Streets and Highways Code, Sections 114 and 130, and California Government Code, Section 6586.5. The Director is identified as the Executive Officer for the purpose of the proposed agreement.

The agreement and amendments will be approved as to form by County Counsel.

### **ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION**

The recommended actions are not subject to CEQA because they are activities that are excluded from the definition of a project by Section 21065 of the Public Resources Code and Section 15378(b) of the State CEQA Guidelines. This proposed cooperative agreement is an organizational or administrative activity of government that will not result in direct or indirect physical changes to the environment and a government funding mechanism that does not involve any commitment to a specific project that may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment. The cooperative agreement will allow Caltrans to generate the PID that includes potential project scope, cost, and cooperative elements. Pursuant to the cooperative agreement, Caltrans will conduct preliminary environmental analysis as part of the PID.

By approving this agreement, the County does not commit to or otherwise endorse, authorize, or approve any specific project. Any project developed from this agreement remains subject to the Board's sole discretion to approve. Authorization of any future project activities would occur only following compliance with CEQA and Public Works will return to the Board for consideration of the appropriate environmental documentation.

### **IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)**

This action will result in no impact to current services or projects. The proposed cooperative agreement is of general County interest. It may ultimately result in a project that will improve travel conditions, increase safety, and enhance the mobility of vehicular, bicycle, and pedestrian traffic in the area.

### **SUBJECT**

Public Works is seeking Board approval to award a services contract to Southland Transit, Inc., for Heights Hopper shuttle service in the unincorporated County communities of Hacienda Heights and Rowland Heights.

### IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD:

- Find that the contract work is statutorily exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act for the reasons stated in this Board letter and in the record of the project.
- 2. Find that these services can be more economically performed by an independent contractor than by County employees.

- 3. Award and direct the Chair to execute the contract with Southland Transit, Inc., for Heights Hopper shuttle service. This contract will be for a period of 1 year with four 1-year renewal options and a month-to-month extension up to 6 months for a maximum potential contract term of 66 months and a maximum potential contract sum of \$5,266,120.
- 4. Delegate authority to the Director of Public Works or his designee to renew the contract for each additional renewal option and extension period if, in the opinion of the Director of Public Works or his designee, Southland Transit, Inc., has successfully performed during the previous contract period, and the services are still required; to approve and execute amendments to incorporate necessary changes within the scope of work; and to suspend work if, it is in the best interest of the County to do so.
- 5. Delegate authority to the Director of Public Works or his designee to annually increase the contract amount up to an additional 10 percent of the annual contract sum, which is included in the maximum potential contract sum for unforeseen additional work within the scope of the contract if required.

### PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approval of the recommended action will award a services contract to Southland Transit, Inc., for Heights Hopper shuttle service to the residents in the unincorporated County areas of Hacienda Heights and Rowland Heights. These services will provide residents in these areas with transportation to community centers, shopping centers, senior centers, and other destinations within the defined service areas for \$0.25 or free for seniors, persons with disabilities, and children under age 5, as shown in Enclosure A.

The potential contract sum also includes funds for the cost of major vehicle repair and graphics work to County-provided service vehicles in accordance with the contract.

The current contract has been extended for a maximum of 6 months with a final expiration date of September 30, 2023; however, it will expire upon award and execution of this contract. In addition, if necessary, the current contract has an extension option for a period not to exceed 120 days after the expiration date. The award of this contract will continue the current services by the recommended contractor, which is the current contractor providing this service.

### <u>Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals</u>

These recommendations support the County Strategic Plan: Strategy II.2, Support the Wellness of Our Communities, Objective II.2.4, Promote Active and Healthy Lifestyles; Strategy II.3, Make Environmental Sustainability Our Daily Reality, Objective II.3.5, Support a Clean, Flexible, and Integrated Multi-Modal Transportation System that Improves Mobility, by contracting with the contractor that has the specialized expertise to provide these services accurately, efficiently, timely, and in a responsive manner.

### FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

There will be no impact to the County General Fund.

These amounts are based on Public Works' estimated annual utilization of the contractor's service at the prices quoted by the contractor. The terms, and sums for each term, of the maximum contract period if all optional renewal periods are exercised are as follows:

The sum for the initial term is \$787,836

The sum for the first option term is \$835,607

The sum for the second option term is \$866,532

The sum for the third option term is \$898,798

The sum for the fourth and final option term is \$932,405

The sum for the month-to-month option to extend up to 6 months is \$466,203

The maximum potential contract sum is \$5,266,120 for the maximum contract period of 66 months. The total maximum potential contract sum includes major vehicle repair and graphics work to County-provided service vehicles, and 10 percent of the annual contract sum for unforeseen additional work within the scope of the contract. The County may also authorize an extension of time to the contract's maximum potential term, not to exceed 180 days, with no additional funding.

Sufficient funding for these services is included in the First Supervisorial District's Proposition A Local Return Transit Program in the Transit Operations Fund (CP6 -Services and Supplies) Fiscal Year 2023-24 Budget. Funds to finance the contract's renewal years and 10 percent additional funding for contingencies will be requested through the annual budget process.

### FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

The recommended contractor, Southland Transit, Inc., is located in El Monte, California. This contract will commence upon the Board's approval for a period of 1 year. With the Board's delegated authority, Public Works may renew the contract for four 1-year

renewal options and a month-to-month extension up to 6 months for a maximum potential total contract term of 66 months. The County may also authorize an extension of time to the contract's maximum potential term, not to exceed 180 days, with no additional funding.

County Counsel has approved the recommended contract, which has been executed by Southland Transit, Inc. (Enclosure B). The recommended contract was solicited on an open-competitive basis and is in accordance with applicable Federal, State, and County requirements.

A standard services contract has been used that contains terms and conditions in compliance with the Board's ordinances, policies, and programs. Enclosure C reflects the proposer's utilization participation and Community Business Enterprise program information. Data regarding the proposer's minority participation is on file with Public Works. The contractor was selected upon final analysis and consideration without regard to race, creed, sex, or color.

This work is being contracted in accordance with procedures authorized under County Charter, Section 44.7, Part 3, and Chapter 2.121 (Contracting with Private Business) of the Los Angeles County Code. The mandatory requirements for contracting set forth in the Los Angeles County Code, Section 2.121.380, have been met.

The contractor has agreed to pay its full-time employees the current Living Wage Rate approved by the Board on December 1, 2015, and to comply with the County's Living Wage reporting requirements. The County's Proposition A and Living Wage Ordinance provisions apply to this proposed contract, as County employees can perform these contracted services. The contract complies with all of the requirements of the County Code, Section 2.201.

Using methodology approved by the Auditor-Controller, the Proposition A cost analysis indicates that the recommended contracted services can be performed more economically by the private sector.

### **ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION**

These services are statutorily exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act, pursuant to Section 21080 (b) (10) of the Public Resources Code. This exemption provides for the implementation of passenger or commuter transit services.

### **CONTRACTING PROCESS**

In 2016, 2019, and 2021 notices of the Request for Statement of Qualifications (RFSQ) were placed on the "Doing Business with Los Angeles County" website (Enclosure D), "Do Business with Public Works" website, and Twitter and advertisements were placed in the Los Angeles Daily Journal, Los Angeles Sentinel, and La Opinión. Also, Public Works informed all registered Local Small Business Enterprises; Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises; Social Enterprises; Community Business Enterprises; and independent contractors, various business development centers, and municipalities about this business opportunity. The RFSQ is currently open continuous.

The Statement of Qualifications were first reviewed to ensure they met the mandatory requirements outlined in the RFSQ and were then evaluated by an Evaluation Committee consisting of Public Works staff, utilizing the informed averaging methodology for applicable criteria. The committee's evaluation was based on criteria described in the RFSQ, including experience, work plan, financial resources, performance history/references, and demonstrated controls over labor/payroll recordkeeping. Based on this evaluation from 2016 to present, nine statements received a passing score and were placed on the Qualified Contractors List.

On January 12, 2023, Public Works issued an Invitation for Bids soliciting bids from the nine responsive and responsible vendors on the Qualified Contractors List.

On February 15, 2023, one bid was received. The bid was evaluated based on the price category. Based on this evaluation, it is recommended that this contract be awarded to the responsive and responsible contractor, Southland Transit, Inc., located in El Monte, California. Public Works believes the contractor's price to be reasonable for the work requested. Public Works notified the applicable union on this solicitation.

Public Works has accessed available resources to review and assess the proposed contractor's past performance, history of Labor Law violations, and prior performance on County contracts.

### <u>IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)</u>

The award of this contract will continue the services without disruption to the public and will not result in the displacement of any County employees as these services are presently contracted with the private sector.



# WATER RESOURCES AND TRANSPORTATION CORE SERVICE AREAS AWARD OF SERVICE CONTRACT FOR ON-CALL EMERGENCY REMOVAL OF HAZARDOUS MATERIALS ALL SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS (3 VOTES)

### **SUBJECT**

Public Works is seeking Board approval to award a service contract to Ocean Blue Environmental Services, Inc., a Community Business Enterprise, for on-call emergency removal of hazardous materials from various facilities and locations throughout Los Angeles County.

### IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD:

- 1. Find that the contract work is categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act for the reasons stated in this Board letter and in the record of the proposed activities maintained by Public Works.
- Award a service contract to Ocean Blue Environmental Services, Inc., a Community Business Enterprise, for on-call emergency removal of hazardous materials. The contract will be for a term of 1 year, with four 1-year renewal options and a month-to-month extension up to 6 months, for a maximum potential contract term of 66 months and a maximum potential contract sum of \$18,150,000.
- 3. Delegate authority to the Director of Public Works or his designee to execute the contract, to renew the contract for each additional renewal option and extension period if, in the opinion of the Director of Public Works or his designee, Ocean Blue Environmental Services, Inc., has successfully performed the contract work during the previous contract period and the services are still required to approve and execute amendments to incorporate

necessary changes within the scope of work and to suspend work if it is in the best interest of the County to do so.

4. Delegate authority to the Director of Public Works or his designee to annually increase the contract amount up to an additional 10 percent of the annual contract sum, which is included in the maximum potential contract sum for unforeseen additional work within the scope of the contract, if required, and to adjust the annual contract sum for each option year over the term of the contract to allow for an annual cost-of-living adjustment in accordance with County policy and the terms of the contract.

### PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approval of the recommended action will find that the contract work is categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act and allow Public Works to enter into a service contract for on-call emergency removal of hazardous materials. The work to be performed will consist of emergency collection, transportation, and disposal of hazardous material and contaminated waste at various facilities and locations throughout Los Angeles County. This contract provides a specialty service for which Public Works has no expertise or equipment.

### Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

These recommendations support the County Strategic Plan: Strategy II.2, Support the Wellness of Our Communities; Strategy III.3, Pursue Operational Effectiveness, Fiscal Responsibility, and Accountability; and Objective III.3.2, Manage and Maximize County Assets, by supporting ongoing efforts to maintain public infrastructure assets. The contractor who has the specialized expertise to provide these services accurately, efficiently, timely, and in a responsive manner will support Public Works in meeting these goals.

### FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

There will be no impact to the County General Fund.

The annual contract sum is \$3,000,000 plus 10 percent of the annual contract sum for additional work within the scope of the contract. Any unused authorized amounts up to 25 percent from the previous contract terms will roll over into subsequent renewal terms. Total annual expenditures for these services; however, will not exceed the maximum potential contract sum approved by the Board. This contract amount is based

on unit rates quoted by the contractor and our estimated annual utilization of the contractor's service.

The contract will be for a term of 1 year, with four 1-year renewal options and a month-to-month extension up to 6 months, for a maximum potential contract term of 66 months and a maximum potential aggregate contract sum of \$18,150,000.

Funding for the first year of these services is included in the Road Fund (B03 - Services and Supplies) and Internal Service Fund (B04 - Services and Supplies) Fiscal Year 2023-24 Budget. The Internal Service Fund will be reimbursed by the Flood Control District Fund (B07 - Services and Supplies) for expenditures associated with Flood Control District facilities. Funding for subsequent contract years, including the 10 percent additional funding for contingencies, will be requested through the annual budget process.

### FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

The recommended contractor is Ocean Blue Environmental Services, Inc., located in Long Beach, California. The contract will commence upon the Board's approval and execution by both parties, whichever occurs last, for a period of 1 year. With the Board's delegated authority, Public Works may renew the contract for four 1-year renewal options and a month-to-month extension up to 6 months for a maximum potential total contract term of 66 months. The County may also authorize an extension of time to the Contract's maximum potential term, not to exceed 180 days, with no additional funding.

County Counsel will review the contract as to form (Enclosure A) prior to approval. The recommended contract with Ocean Blue Environmental Services, Inc., was solicited on an open-competitive basis and is in accordance with applicable Federal, State, and County requirements.

A standard services contract has been used that contains terms and conditions in compliance with the Board's ordinances, policies, and programs. Enclosure B reflects the proposers' utilization, participation, and community business enterprise program information. Data regarding the proposers' minority participation is on file with Public Works. The contractor was selected upon final analysis and consideration without regard to race, creed, gender, or color.

Public Works has evaluated and determined that the contracted services are required on an on-call and intermittent basis; therefore, Proposition A (County Code

Chapter 2.121) and the Living Wage Program (County Code Chapter 2.201) do not apply to this contract. In addition, the contractor understands and agrees that the contracted work involves Public Works, as defined by Section 1720 of the California Labor Code. The Contractor represents and warrants that they will perform the contracted work in full compliance with the applicable provisions of the Labor Code relating to payment of prevailing wages.

The contract includes a Cost-of-Living Adjustment provision, which is in accordance with Board Policy 5.070, Multi-Year Services Contract Cost of Living Adjustments, approved on January 29, 2002.

### **ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION**

These services are categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) because they are within a class of projects that have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment, which meets the criteria set forth in Sections 15301 and 15330 of the State CEQA Guidelines and Class 1 of the County's Environmental Document Reporting Procedures and Guidelines, Appendix G.

The Contract work involves the maintenance of existing County and Flood Control District facilities and minor actions to clean up hazardous materials from existing facilities. Based on the project requirements for any proposed work, the work will comply with all applicable regulations, and there will be no cumulative impacts, unusual circumstances, damage to scenic highways, listing on a hazardous waste site compiled pursuant to Government Code Section 65962.5, or indications that the activity may cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of a historical resource that would make the exemption inapplicable.

### **CONTRACTING PROCESS**

On January 25, 2023, a notice of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was placed on the County's "Doing Business with Los Angeles County" website (Enclosure C), "Do Business With Public Works" website, and Twitter. In addition, advertisements were placed in the Los Angeles Daily Journal, Los Angeles Sentinel, La Opinión, The Daily Breeze, The Signal (Santa Clarita), World Journal, Watts Times, The Malibu Times, Press Telegram, and Pasadena Star News. Also, Public Works informed 1,460 Local Small Business Enterprises, 180 Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises, 168 Social Enterprises, 1,013 Community Business Enterprises, 127 independent contractors, various business development centers, and municipalities about this business opportunity.

On March 22, 2023, five proposals were received. The proposals were first reviewed to ensure they met the mandatory requirements outlined in the RFP. Two proposals were disqualified for failure to meet the minimum requirements of the RFP. The remaining three proposals were evaluated by an evaluation committee consisting of Public Works staff. The evaluation was based on criteria described in the RFP, which included price, experience, work plan, references, and equipment utilizing the informed averaging methodology for applicable criteria. Based on this evaluation, it is recommended that the contract be awarded to the highest-rated, lowest-cost, responsive and responsible proposer, Ocean Blue Environmental Services, Inc., located in Long Beach, California.

### **IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)**

The award of the contract will not result in the displacement of any County employees.

### SUBJECT

Public Works is seeking Board approval to award a services contract to Saeshe, a Local Small Business Enterprise and Community Business Enterprise, for the Countywide regional used motor oil and oil filter recycling collection and public education program.

### IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD:

- 1. Find that the contract work is not a project pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act.
- 2. Award the contract for on-call regional used motor oil and oil filter recycling collection and public education program to Saeshe, a Local Small Business Enterprise and Community Business Enterprise. This contract will be for a term of 1 year with three 1-year renewal options and a month-to-month extension up to 6 months for a maximum potential

contract term of 54 months and a maximum potential contract sum of \$2,288,821.

- 3. Delegate authority to the Director of Public Works or his designee to execute the contract; to renew the contract for each additional renewal option and extension period if, in the opinion of the Director of Public Works or his designee, Saeshe, has successfully performed during the previous contract period, and the services are still required; to approve and execute amendments to incorporate necessary changes within the scope of work; and to suspend work if it is in the best interest of the County to do so.
- 4. Delegate authority to the Director of Public Works or his designee to annually increase the contract amount up to an additional 10 percent of the annual contract sum, which is included in the maximum potential contract sum for unforeseen additional work within the scope of the contract if required, and to adjust the annual contract sum for each option year over the term of the contract to allow for an annual cost-of-living adjustment in accordance with County policy and the terms of the contract.

### PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approval of the recommended action will award a services contract to Saeshe to provide public affairs and creative services, including media relations, event planning, logistical support, household hazardous waste disposal management, and program assessment for used motor oil and oil filters recycling public education program. This program, which started in 2002, has been conducted by Public Works as part of an annual oil funding grant, which is received from the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery. The California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery grant is used to educate the public on the proper recycling of used motor oil and oil filters. These services are used on an on-call basis when there are oil filter exchange events and community events scheduled Countywide.

The current contract's expiration date is October 20, 2023; however, it will expire upon award and execution of this contract. The award of this contract will continue the current services by the recommended contractor, which is the current contractor providing these services.

### Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

These recommendations support the County Strategic Plan: Strategy II.3, Make Environmental Sustainability our Daily Reality, Objective II.3.4, Reduce Waste Generation and Recycle and Reuse Waste Resources, by improving the environment

and social well-being of our communities by proper recycling of used motor oil and used oil filters, and by contracting with the contractor that has the specialized expertise to provide these services accurately, efficiently, timely, and in a responsive manner.

### FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

There will be no impact to the County General Fund.

The annual cost is \$462,388 plus 10 percent of the annual contract sum for additional work within the scope of the contract and cost-of-living adjustments in accordance with the contract, including the three 1-year renewal options and a month-to-month extension up to 6 months for a maximum potential contract term of 54 months with an estimated maximum potential contract sum of \$2,288,821. This amount is based on the annual price quoted by the contractor and our estimated annual utilization of the contractor's services. Adjustments will be made to the annual contracts sum for each option year over the term of the contracts to allow for an annual cost-of-living adjustment in accordance with County policy and the terms of the contracts. The County may also authorize an extension of time to the contract's maximum potential term, not to exceed 180 days, with no additional funding.

Funding for these services is included in the Solid Waste Management Fund (GD1, Services and Supplies) Fiscal Year 2023-24 Budget. Funds to finance the contract's optional years, 10 percent additional funding for contingencies, and cost-of-living adjustments will be requested through the annual budget process.

### FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

The recommended contractor, Saeshe, a Local Small Business Enterprise and Community Business Enterprise, is located in Los Angeles, California. This contract will commence upon the Board's approval and execution between both parties, whichever occurs last, for a period of 1 year. With the Board's delegated authority, Public Works may renew the contract for three 1-year renewal options and a month-to-month extension up to 6 months for a maximum potential total contract term of 54 months. The County may also authorize an extension of time to the contract's maximum potential term, not to exceed 180 days, with no additional funding.

County Counsel will review the contract as to form (Enclosure A) prior to approval. The recommended contract with Saeshe was solicited on an open-competitive basis and is in accordance with applicable Federal, State, and County requirements.

A standard services contract has been used that contains terms and conditions in compliance with the Board's ordinances, policies, and programs. Enclosure B reflects the proposers' utilization participation and community business enterprise program

information. Data regarding the proposers' minority participation is on file with Public Works. The contractor was selected upon final analysis and consideration without regard to race, creed, sex, or color.

Public Works has evaluated and determined that the contracted services are required on an on-call and intermittent basis; therefore, Proposition A (County Code Chapter 2.121) and the Living Wage Program (County Code Chapter 2.201) do not apply to this contract.

The contract includes a cost-of-living adjustment provision, which is in accordance with Board Policy 5.070, Multi-Year Services Contract Cost-of-Living Adjustments.

### **ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION**

The recommended action is not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act because it is an activity that is excluded from the definition of a project by Section 21065 of the Public Resources Code and Section 15378(b) of the State California Environmental Quality Act Guidelines. This proposed contract involving public outreach and education is an organizational or administrative activity of government, which will not result in direct or indirect physical changes to the environment.

### **CONTRACTING PROCESS**

On December 5, 2022, a notice of the Request for Proposals was placed on the County's "Doing Business with Los Angeles County" website (Enclosure C), "Do Business with Public Works" website, and Twitter. In addition, advertisements were placed in the Los Angeles Daily Journal, Los Angeles Sentinel, La Opinión, The Daily Breeze, The Signal (Santa Clarita), World Journal, Watts Times, The Malibu Times, Press Telegram, and Pasadena Star News. Also, Public Works informed 1,458 Local Small Business Enterprises; 166 Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises; 160 Social Enterprises; 876 Community Business Enterprises; and 395 independent contractors, various business development centers, and municipalities about this business opportunity.

On January 12, 2023, two proposals were received. All proposals were evaluated by an evaluation committee consisting of Public Works staff. The evaluation was based on criteria described in the Request for Proposals, which included the price, experience, work plan, references, and interview utilizing the informed averaging methodology for applicable criteria. Based on this evaluation, it is recommended that this contract be awarded to the lowest cost, highest rated, apparent responsive, and responsible proposer, Saeshe, located in Los Angeles, California. Public Works notified the applicable union on this solicitation

### **IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)**

The award of this contract will continue the services without disruption to the public and will not result in the displacement of any County employees as these services are presently contracted with the private sector.

SECOND: This AGREEMENT, together with Exhibit A, Scope of Work; Exhibit B, Service Contract General Requirements; Exhibit C, Internal Revenue Service Notice 1015; Exhibit D, Safely Surrendered Baby Law Posters; Exhibit E, Defaulted Property Tax Reduction Program; Exhibit F, Performance Requirements Summary, Exhibit G, Grant Guidelines; Exhibit H, Radio Script; Exhibit I, TV Script; Exhibit J, Flyer/Filter Coupon; Exhibit K, Oil Tip Sheet/Print Ad; Exhibit L, Functional Items; Exhibit M, Stickers; Exhibit N, Banners; Exhibit O, Release and Waiver of Liability Form; Exhibit P, CCC Site Visits; Exhibit Q, CalRecycle664 Form; Exhibit R, Used Oil Certified Collection Center Application Form; Exhibit S, CalRecycle165 Form; Exhibit T, Digital Media Name Instructions; Exhibit U, OPP10 Program Evaluation; Exhibit V, OPP9 Program Evaluation; Exhibit W, Developed Applications or Websites; and Exhibit X, CleanLA Flyer; the CONTRACTOR'S Proposal, all attached hereto; the Request for Proposals; and Addenda to the Request for Proposals, all of which are incorporated herein by reference, are agreed by the COUNTY and the CONTRACTOR to constitute the Contract.

<u>THIRD</u>: The COUNTY agrees, in consideration of satisfactory performance of the foregoing services in strict accordance with the Contract specifications to the satisfaction of the Director of Public Works, to pay the CONTRACTOR pursuant to the Schedule of Prices set forth in the Proposal and attached hereto as Form PW-2, an amount not to exceed \$462,388 per year, or such greater amount as the Board may approve (Maximum Contract Sum).

<u>FOURTH</u>: This Contract's initial term will be for a period of 1 year commencing upon the Board's approval and execution of this Agreement by both Parties, whichever occurs last. The COUNTY will have the sole option to renew this Contract term for up to three additional 1-year period and a six month-to-month extension, for a maximum total Contract term of 4 years and 6 months. Each such option will be exercised at the sole discretion of the COUNTY. SIXTH: Public Works will make payment to the CONTRACTOR within 30 days of receipt and approval of a properly completed and undisputed invoice. However, should the CONTRACTOR be certified by the COUNTY as a Local Small Business Enterprise, payment will be made in accordance with Board of Supervisors Policy No. 3.035, Small Business Liaison and Prompt Payment Program. Each invoice must be in triplicate (original and two copies) and must itemize the work completed. The invoices must be submitted to:

<u>SEVENTH</u>: In no event will the aggregate total amount of compensation paid to the CONTRACTOR exceed the amount of compensation authorized by the Board. Such aggregate total amount is the Maximum Contract Sum.

<u>EIGHTH</u>: . The CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that only the designated Public Works Contract Manager is authorized to request or order work under this Contract. The CONTRACTOR acknowledges that the designated Contract Manager is not authorized to request or order any work that would result in the CONTRACTOR earning an aggregate compensation in excess of this Contract's Maximum Contract Sum.

NINTH: The CONTRACTOR must not perform or accept work requests from the Contract Manager or any other person that will cause the Maximum Contract Sum of this Contract to be exceeded. The CONTRACTOR must monitor the balance of this Contract's Maximum Contract Sum. When the total of the CONTRACTOR'S paid invoices, invoices pending payment, invoices yet to be submitted, and ordered services reaches 75 percent of the Maximum Contract Sum, the CONTRACTOR must immediately notify the Contract Manager in writing. <u>TWELFTH</u>: The CONTRACTOR agrees in strict accordance with the Contract specifications and conditions to meet the COUNTY'S requirements.

THIRTEENTH: This Contract constitutes the entire agreement between the COUNTY and the CONTRACTOR with respect to the subject matter of this Contract and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous agreements and understandings. This CONTRACT may be signed by the Parties hereto in separate counterparts, including both counterparts that are executed on paper and counterparts that are in the form of electronic signatures. Electronic signatures include facsimile or e-mail electronic signatures. Each executed counterpart will be deemed an original. All counterparts, taken together, constitute the executed Agreement.

The Parties hereby acknowledge and agree that electronic records and electronic signatures, as well as facsimile signatures, used in connection with the execution of this Agreement and electronic signatures, facsimile signatures or signatures transmitted by electronic mail in so-called pdf format will be legal and binding and will have the same full force and effect as if a paper original of this Agreement had been delivered and had been signed using a handwritten signature. 3. Delegate authority to the Director of Public Works or his designee to execute the sole source amendment upon proper execution by the contractor and approval as to form by County Counsel.

# PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approval of the recommended action will extend the term of the cafeteria and vending machine services contract on a month-to-month basis for up to 24 months from November 3, 2023, up to November 2, 2025. This contract operates retail concession cafeteria and vending machine services at the Department of Public Works Headquarters located in the City of Alhambra.

Under this amendment, the existing contractor will continue providing cafeteria operations, management, and vending machine services for up to 24 months at the Department of Public Works Headquarters, serving approximately 1,400 employees and visitors, during which time, Public Works will complete the solicitation process to award a new contract. The extension will provide Public Works sufficient time to perform an in-depth analysis of in-person/teleworking policy impacts on cafeteria services, prepare a new solicitation, and canvass interest for this service. The current contract's final expiration date is November 2, 2023.

### Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

These recommendations support the County Strategic Plan: Strategy III.3, Pursue Operational Effectiveness, Fiscal Responsibility, and Accountability, by contracting with a contractor that has the specialized expertise to provide these services accurately, efficiently, timely, and in a responsive manner.

## FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

There will be no impact to the County General Fund.

There is no cost to the County. Under the terms of the contract, the contractor will continue to pay the County \$500 monthly (for an annual amount of \$6,000) for cafeteria services, and 10 percent of its monthly gross receipts derived from vending machine sales. Revenue will be deposited into the Internal Service Fund.

On October 17, 2017, the Board approved Contract No. 003411 with California Dining Services. On November 6, 2017, Public Works entered into a services contract with California Dining Services, for cafeteria and vending machine services at the Public Works Headquarters. The contract was for an initial 1-year period with four 1-year renewal options and a month-to-month extension up to 6 months for a maximum potential total contract term of 66 months. This is a revenue generating contract in which the contractor pays the County \$500 monthly for cafeteria services, and 10 percent of its monthly gross receipts derived from vending machine sales.

On March 26, 2020, a notice of suspension for convenience was sent to the service provider, California Dining Services, per a mutual agreement due to the ongoing circumstances with the COVID-19 outbreak and its impact on cafeteria sales, food supply chain, and overall health concerns for County employees. The services were suspended effective Friday, March 27, 2020, until further notice. The suspension was in accordance with this contract's Exhibit B, Service Contract General Requirements, Section 2.B, Suspension for Convenience and Exhibit B, Section 1, T.1, Force Majeure. The closure of the cafeteria lasted 24 months, between March 26, 2020, and April 4, 2022. The contract's monthly payment to the County was also suspended during this time. On April 4, 2022, the suspension was lifted, and the contract was fully reinstated. California Dining Services has continued to provide services for the fourth and final option year of the 5-year contract, with a 2-year gap in services due to the suspension of services.

On April 17, 2023, Public Works submitted an advance notification to advise the Board of its intent to conduct negotiations for the extension of the cafeteria and vending machine services at the Public Works Headquarters under this sole source amendment with California Dining Services.

This recommended sole source amendment will continue the contract's current requirements, specifications, and conditions and restore the original potential term of the contract awarded to the contractor in 2017. The Director of Public Works will execute the sole source amendment in accordance with the Board's authorization and only upon approval as to form by County Counsel and execution by the contractor.

The contractor has agreed to continue to pay its full-time employees the current Living Wage Rate approved by the Board on December 1, 2015, and to comply with the County's Living Wage reporting requirements.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION**

The recommended actions are not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act because they are excluded from the definition of a project by Section 15378(b) of the State California Environmental Quality Act Guidelines. The proposed action, to extend the term of a services contract for cafeteria and vending machine services at the Department of Public Works, is an administrative activity of government that will not result in direct or indirect physical changes to the environment.

# **IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)**

Approval of the sole source amendment will continue the current contract's services to provide uninterrupted cafeteria services to employees and visitors of the Headquarters complex.
