I. CONVENE

The November 16, 2023, meeting of the Local Cal-ID RAN Board was called to order by Kyla Coates at 2:16 p.m.

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II. **REVIEW/APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

The minutes of the July 27, 2023, meeting were adopted (moved by Elena Nihoa Asucan, seconded by Adam MacDonald, and approved by a majority of the Board, with two abstentions).

III. REPORT ON THE TECHNICAL SUBCOMMITTEE

Lieutenant Derek Sabatini reported on the status of LACRIS systems and operations for the months of July through October 2023.

1. Report on the Status of the LiveScan Network, Installations, and Enhancements

Livescans were installed inside Edmund D. Edelman Children's Court on August 8, 2023, and inside the Los Padrinos Juvenile Hall on September 29, 2023. No major issues were reported during the timeframe for the months of July through October 31, 2023.

2. Report on the Status of ABIS

From July through October 2023, various LACRIS systems were inoperable and experienced unscheduled downtime for approximately one hundred thirtynine (139) hours and twenty-one (21) minutes. 92 hours and 37 minutes were due to a JDIC outage, details are provided below.

4. Steering Committee

Two Technical Subcommittee meetings were held since the last RAN Board Meeting, on August 16, 2023 and November 8, 2023. The meeting participants were briefed on the status of LACRIS systems and ongoing projects. An update on the status of the Los Angeles Police Department's (LAPD) Piper Tech LACRIS training room was given. The training room was

approved in 2019, but the construction was held up due to building permits. Now the hold-up is because the Piper Tech building may be moving.

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5. General Updates

JDIC Outage

From July 13, 2023, through July 17, 2023, the Sheriff's Department's Justice Data Interface Controller (JDIC) system experienced a system outage. The JDIC outage was due to hardware failure at the Sheriff's Communication Center.

Pre-Arraignment Release Protocols

On October 1, 2023, LACRIS emailed a response letter to Chief Fairfield regarding the Pre-Arraignment Release Protocols (PARP) letter he authored on behalf of the Los Angeles County Police Chief's Association (LACPCA). In summary, LACRIS advised the law enforcement community to seek clarification regarding compliance with PARP and State law.

IV. ACTION ITEMS

A. Authorization to Approve the LACRIS Incidental Expense Policy

LACRIS requested RAN Board approval of a LACRIS-specific Incidental Expense Policy (IEP). The LACRIS IEP mirrors the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department IEP, Fiscal Notice #181, which was approved by the County Board of Supervisors on January 7, 2022.

ACTION:

THE ITEM WAS MOVED BY BRIAN WILLIAMS, SECONDED BY BRIANE GREY, AND UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED TO AUTHORIZE THE USE OF THE LACRIS INCIDENTAL EXPENSE POLICY.

B. <u>Authorization To Hire Gartner Consulting to Update LACRIS Strategic</u> <u>Plan</u>

LACRIS requested authorization to hire Gartner Consulting to develop a 10-year Strategic Plan for LACRIS. The selection was carried out under the County of Los Angeles' Enterprise Services Master Agreement (ESMA). Gartner's role will involve assessing the current-state capabilities of LACRIS, defining a new target state, and conducting a gap analysis. This process will help to reevaluate the Organizational Strategic Plan and Roadmap for LACRIS resources.

Discussion: Board members asked if copies of the previously approved 10-Year Strategic plan could be emailed to them after this meeting.

ACTION:

THE ITEM WAS MOVED BY BRIAN COSGROVE, SECONDED BY NATASHA BUTLER, AND UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED TO AUTHORIZE 100% FUNDING TO HIRE GARTNER TO DEVELOP A 10-YEAR STRATEGIC PLAN FOR THE APPROXIMATE COST OF \$295,000.

Discussion: At the end of the meeting, Brian Williams asked why the FR access was turned off for 18 agencies. The Board requested an update at the next meeting.

V. PUBLIC COMMENTS

There were no members of the public present.

VI. ADJOURNMENT

The meeting was adjourned at 3:10 p.m. The next meeting is scheduled for January 25, 2024, at 2:00 p.m.
