Following the completion of a Pathway Home encampment resolution, data will be collected, reconciled, and posted online. Please allow 72 – 96 hours for updates to occur. Data on Individuals Permanently Housed is updated quarterly.

Pathway Home formally launched on August 9, 2023.

The below data are current as of **June 10, 2024**, except for the data on people permanently housed, which is current as of **April 4, 2024**.

This Pathway Home dashboard excludes data from our encampment resolution partnership with the City of Los Angeles.



Pathway Home Operation Highlight: Monrovia and Duarte

- Brought 52 people experiencing homelessness off the streets and into safe interim housing
- LA County's 16th Pathway Home encampment resolution since the program's inception in August 2023
- Took place on June 5, 2024, in partnership with:
 - Office of Supervisor Barger
 - City of Monrovia
 - City of Duarte
 - LAHSA
 - Union Station Homeless Services
 - Volunteers of America (VOA)
 - LA County Department of Mental Health
 - LA County Sheriff's Department (HOST)
 - Monrovia Police Department
 - LA Metro Homeless Outreach Teams

Funding Recommendations FY 2025-26: Overview

Based on the **New Framework Principles**:

- Respond, at scale, to the persistently underserved
- Consolidate rehousing system strategies, and streamline program models and practice standards
- Increase exits to permanent housing
- Advance racial equity, and integrate input of people with lived expertise

Prioritizing funding our core homeless and housing system needs:

- Interim Housing
- Permanent Housing
- Intensive Case Management Services

Funding Recommendations FY 2025-26: Listening Sessions

Solicit community and stakeholder engagement to strengthen strategies for addressing and preventing homelessness.

This year, we will conduct 18 listening sessions throughout August and September 2024:

- 8 Service Planning Areas (one in each SPA)
- City/Councils of Government (COG)
- Sessions with People with Lived Experience
- Homeless Service Providers
- Countywide Spanish Language
- Educational Stakeholders (new) and Youth with Lived Experience
- Latinx and Black Advisory Groups and AIAN community (new)

Funding Recommendations FY 2025-26: Listening Sessions

- Solicit community and stakeholder engagement to strengthen strategies for addressing and preventing homelessness.
- In addition to informing our funding recommendations, CEO-HI will consider feedback received during these sessions throughout the fiscal year as we make ongoing systemwide improvements.
- These listening sessions will include an overview of last year's funding recommendations process as well as how Measure H and other funding streams are spent.
- These conversations will help ensure our strategies are responsive to our County communities' unique needs and priorities.
