- 5 Board Appointees (selected and appointed by the Board)
- 10 At -Large Members (selected by the Commission and appointed by the Board)

YOUTH COMMISSION'S PURPOSE (VIA ORDINANCE)

Los Angeles County Code Chapter 3.66 - Youth Commission

- Provide a platform for policy, practice, and service delivery to be <u>informed and shaped by the lived experiences</u> of people impacted by the child welfare and juvenile justice systems.
- Provide <u>leadership to effect transformative change</u> for youth in Los Angeles County
- Focus on the policies, practices, budgets, and programs of the Los Angeles County child welfare and juvenile justice systems, which include the Department of Children and Family Services, the Probation Department, and all other youth and family-serving County departments.

YOUTH COMMISSION'S FOCUS AREAS (2024)




