Update on Enforcement Related to Illegal Breeding in the Antelope Valley

ILLEGAL AND BACKYARD BREEDING ENFORCEMENT

DACC reported back to the Board in January 2025 with a plan to address illegal breeding with public education, enforcement, outreach events and special programs.

OCTOBER 2023 - NOVEMBER 2024

- 55 violation orders were issued to those in violation of meeting general requirements, as required by Los Angeles County Code Title 10.
- 75 citations were issued to those in violation of mandatory spay/neuter, breeding without a permit, or general requirements for keeping animals.
- 10 individuals were warned when enforcement was non-applicable.
- 14 individuals were found not to be in violation after investigating.
- 25 dogs were impounded, mostly from owners who were incapable of providing care for their animals that were unintentionally breeding.







DECEMBER 2024 - APRIL 2025

- 8 violation orders were issued to those in violation of meeting general requirements, as required by Los Angeles County Code Title 10.
- 10 citations were issued to those in violation of mandatory spay/neuter, breeding without a permit, or general requirements for keeping animals.
- 3 individuals were warned when enforcement was non-applicable.
- 5 individuals were found not to be in violation after investigating.
- 0 dogs were impounded







ENFORCEMENT 2023 - 2025

- 1. 500+ TIPS OF BREEDING REPORTED TO DACC SINCE IMPLEMENTATION IN OCTOBER 2023
- 2. 310+ INVESTIGATIONS INITIATED
- 3. 63 ORDERS + 85 CITATIONS ISSUED

While we may not always be able to identify those responses immediately, data is being collected, and future connections will be more easily identifiable.









DANGERS OF ILLEGAL BREEDING


