# READOUT OF TASK FORCE & TABLE ACTIVITIES

The Disproportionality Table has adopted the following North Star Life Course Outcomes as they move toward recommendations for Prevention Metrics:

ORANGE: Carried over from LA County's [Racial Equity Strategic Plan](#)

↓ Infant Mortality

↑ % of Families w/ Incomes at 250%+ FPL

↑ Attainment of Postsecondary Credentials w/ Labor Market Value

↑ Stable Employment at 250%+ FPL

BLUE: Newly proposed, with particular emphasis on early childhood, older adults, and health outcomes

↓ Adult First-Time Felony Convictions

↑ School Readiness (cognitive, socioemotional)

↑ Age-Appropriate Cognitive/ Socioemotional Proficiency in middle childhood

↑ Good physical/behavioral health/well-being (among adults, adolescents)

Note: exact wording and definitions are still to be formalized

↑ Independent Living (older adults)

↓ Child Maltreatment (both within families & systems)

↑ Financial Well-Being

# READOUT OF TASK FORCE & TABLE ACTIVITIES

- The Coordination Table:
  - Discussed user experience and care coordination challenges; formed an ad hoc working group of four members who will be reviewing the County's existing user experience inventory/knowledge base and recommending next steps for User Journey Mapping
  - Will be discussing and identifying Emergent Opportunities
- Funding Streams Analysis:
  - In coordination with CEO Budget staff and County Counsel, Ernst & Young are midway through their review of programs and prevention funding streams and will provide preliminary findings at the Task Force's August 19 meeting
  - ARDI staff will reach out to departments/agencies for additional information if needed



# READOUT OF TASK FORCE & TABLE ACTIVITIES

- Upcoming Framework Table:
  - We will continue to discuss Vision and Governance Structure at the August 16 Framework Table meeting, including analyzing and reviewing the governance structures of other benchmark jurisdictions conducting similar prevention alignment efforts
  - The Task Force is about to deploy a Community Survey to receive input and feedback on the vision and the status quo of LA County prevention and promotion services
    - Open to all LA County residents and County staff (who are encouraged to provide their perspectives)
    - We ask all table and Task Force members to assist in sharing the survey link with your colleagues and community networks
- Overall, Task Force and Tables are moving toward the first set of recommendations to the Board to be delivered in October

# Selecting Guiding Principles

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# Adopted Guiding Principles as Amended

- Reduce racial disparities and increase equitable life outcomes for all races/ethnicities as well as close disparities in public investments to shape those outcomes
- Authentically engage residents, organizations, and other community stakeholders **early** to inform and determine interventions (e.g. policy and program) and investments that **emphasize long-term prevention and promotion**
- Develop and implement strategies that identify, prioritize, and effectively support the most disadvantaged geographies and populations
- Collaborate to align funding investments and promote systems change to reduce barriers to achieve effective family-centered services
- Use data and community-defined evidence to effectively assess and communicate equity needs and support timely assessment of progress
- Work collaboratively and intentionally across departments as well as across leadership levels and decision-makers
- **Seek to provide early and tailored support to** improve long-term outcomes, both intergenerationally (i.e. parent to child) and multi-generationally (i.e. grandparent to grandchildren)
- Act urgently, boldly and innovatively to achieve tangible results
- Disaggregate and **streamline data collection** as well as conduct analysis for different racial/ethnic and other demographic subgroup categories
- Be transparent about our goals and our impact

# Process for Selecting Guiding Principles

- The 8 principles with the highest average ranking will be adopted

- A vote will be held to affirm final principles
