**Building Los Angeles County's Prevention Infrastructure**

On September 15, 2021, the Los Angeles County (County) Board of Supervisors (Board) unanimously approved a motion calling for the convening of a Countywide Prevention Services Task Force (Task Force). The impetus for that convening was a sobering finding from a 2021 UCLA Pritzker Center report (UCLA report) that, in relevant part, states: "*while the County has invested in a number of prevention efforts, it is not clear that these efforts have been set up to be successfully integrated and coordinated across departments*". Furthermore, the report urged County leaders to consider the use of a centralized leadership structure to streamline, align, and proliferate equitable prevention programming across departments. As the motion described, if our Board seeks to address the racial disproportionality laden within our systems, we need to take the bold step to imagine a transformative coordinated prevention and intervention strategy.

Under the direction of the County's Executive Director of Racial Equity, leaders from the County and community, including key stakeholders and trusted partners, came together to take up the Board's request to convene the Task Force. Following 18 months of meetings - including discussions with more than 100 individual stakeholders, 800 survey responses, conversations with more than 50 subject area table members, and

Establishing the **Prevention and Promotion Systems Governing Committee**, to develop and oversee Countywide coordinating activities and plans

Establishing the **Prevention and Promotion Coordination Implementation Team (PPCIT)**, to convene and facilitate coordination across County departments

Directing all County departments & entities working in prevention to partner collaboratively and transparently with PPCIT and the Committee

Disbanding the Task Force and transitioning any outstanding relevant tasks to the Committee and/or PPCIT

**IDENTIFYING BARRIERS TO BUDGET COORDINATION AND STRATEGIC FUNDING SUSTAINABILITY**

Over the course of the funding streams analysis, the ARDI staff and consultants identified and identified inter-agency barriers to budget coordination and strategic funding sustainability across multiple departments, agencies and programs within the County. This analysis was a key component of the funding streams analysis and was used to inform the findings and recommendations in the report. The County currently lacks several technological, logistical, and staff capabilities needed to conduct multi-departmental budget analysis and strategic planning for prevention and promotion programs.

**DATA AND INFORMATION LIMITATIONS**

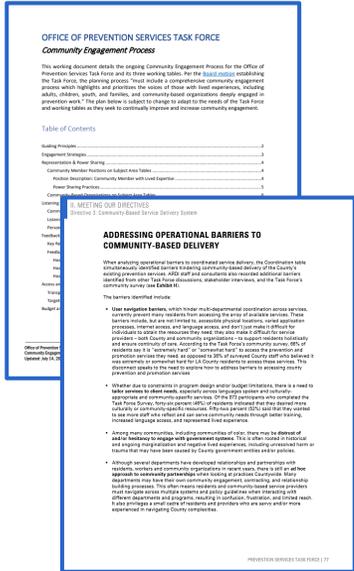
- During discussions on braiding and bundling funding with CEO Budget, department staff and consultants, the ARDI team identified a number of barriers to reporting information to various departments.
- The County's knowledge platform for budget tracking by CEO Budget staff doesn't include information on all funding streams, including state and federal funds, and the ARDI team identified a number of barriers to reporting information to various departments.
- Because this was a new request to departments, gaps exist in requested versus provided information. For example, the ARDI team did not have data on the total number of units or programs in the County's portfolio. There were also gaps regarding how and where the funding sources were reported across the various departments.

**CHALLENGES WITH FUNDING STREAMS EXPERTISE**

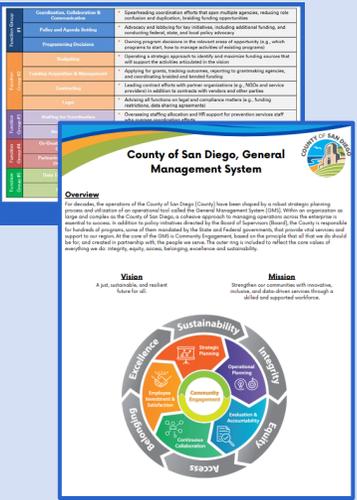
- Currently, limited expertise regarding the various aspects of budgeting, funding, and their uses are fragmented among different individuals.
- In the future, CEO Budget staff will continue to work with departments and programs to ensure that they are aware of the funding sources and how they are used in their programs.
- Program analysis across departments and agencies is a key component of the funding streams analysis and will be used to inform the findings and recommendations in the report. The ARDI team will continue to work with departments and programs to ensure that they are aware of the funding sources and how they are used in their programs.

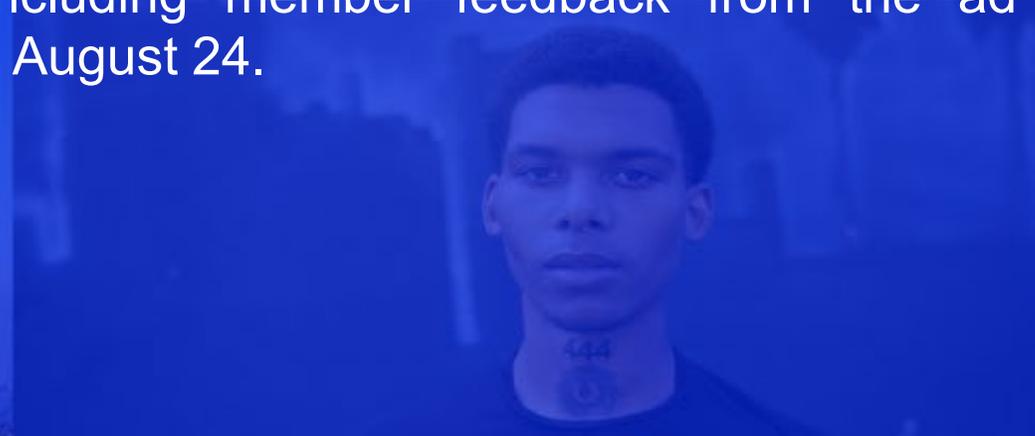




# ITEM 9



Brief overview, discussion, and consideration of necessary actions regarding County dashboard of prevention and promotion outcomes across domains, population groups, and upstream and downstream factors, including member feedback from the ad hoc meeting on Thursday, August 24.



# Background on Dashboard

- ARDI work on Dashboard began in response to a Board directive to reduce health inequities by considering measures to coordinate efforts across County departments and community partners
- TF has expressed desire to have greater holistic information regarding resident well-being, outcomes, and disproportionalities to inform their decision making
- At the June 30 meeting, the Task Force discussed utilizing the Dashboard to help select and refine a set of **prevention and promotion outcomes and metrics**, but to also serve as a public facing portal for County staff and residents to review outcomes in our jurisdiction, including with demographic data cuts (e.g., like San Diego's Live Well Indicators)
- Under the new Board motion, TF sunsets and the Governing Committee will continue this work to develop the outcomes and metrics in partnership with CIO and DPH
- The motion also calls for PPCIT to develop and recommend a **Countywide prevention and promotion services delivery data plan and program**, which includes "[producing] the necessary cross-departmental data sharing reports (e.g., dashboards)."
- Finally, the motion directs the Chair of the Governing Committee to present updates on "Countywide performance based on the established prevention and promotion outcomes and metrics as well as departmental performance" on a semi-annual basis

# Themes and Feedback from Ad Hoc Meeting on 8/24

**ARDI and ISD held an ad hoc meeting on August 24 to seek preliminary feedback on the design and functionality of the Dashboard as a tool to support Committee, PPCIT, and departmental staff**

Represented TF members: AD, DPH, OCIO, LACOE, LACDA, JCOD, OCP, Commission for Children and Families

Inclusion of qualitative data/lived experience to supplement statistics

Clarity on intended audience (County staff vs. community) and accessibility for the latter

Leverage existing County workgroups to support development and selection of indicators and metrics

Transparency: ability to download files and data sets for additional analysis

Inclusion of geographic data when possible

Setting expectations on data availability of specific outcomes (especially "low prevalence" stats)

Designing the dashboard to illustrate the narrative of life course theory and prevention and promotion

Opportunity to supplement certain metrics/outcomes with list of existing programs/policies, (e.g., these are the interventions we're working on)

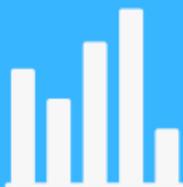

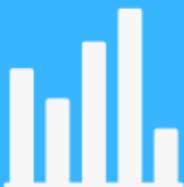

Count / % of homeless individuals by gender: 5 categories



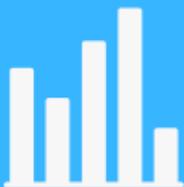
Count / % of homeless individuals by household composition: in households, not in households
