NATURE OF CASE This is a recor

This is a recommendation to settle for \$400,000, inclusive of attorneys' fees and costs, this federal civil rights and wrongful death lawsuit filed by decedent Sean West's parents, Tim and Monique West, and his two children, Jesse Vella and I.W., a minor by and through his Guardian ad Litem ("Plaintiffs"), against the County and four Sheriff's Department ("LASD") Deputies. Mr. West died from acute methamphetamine intoxication after he was arrested for possession of methamphetamine during a traffic stop. Plaintiffs claim the Deputies were negligent and deliberately indifferent in not calling for medical help quickly enough after they suspected Mr. West had ingested methamphetamine.

Given the risks and uncertainties of litigation, a

reasonable settlement at this time will avoid further litigation costs. Therefore, a full and final settlement

of the case in the amount of \$400,000 is

recommended.

Briefly provide a description of the incident/event:	Estate of Sean West, et al. v. County of Los Angeles, et al. Summary Corrective Action Plan 2019-047
	On Thursday, May 25, 2017, at approximately 6:44 p.m., a uniformed deputy sheriff assigned to Temple Station was driving a marked black and white Crown Victoria patrol vehicle, in the city of Duarte. The first deputy sheriff observed two occupants in a Toyota Avalon driving northbound on Mountain Avenue near Hamilton Road.
	A license plate inquiry of the Avalon revealed the registered owner had two outstanding warrants for his arrest. The first deputy sheriff observed that the driver of the vehicle (the decedent) matched the physical description of the male associated with the outstanding warrants. The first deputy sheriff initiated a traffic stop of the vehicle. The plaintiff pulled over and stopped in the Walmart parking lot, at 1600 North Mountain Avenue, Duarte.
	The first deputy sheriff contacted the vehicle's occupants and identified the decedent as the named warrant suspect. The decedent was detained in the backseat of the deputy sheriff's patrol vehicle.
	The front passenger of the decedent's vehicle was identified. The female passenger admitted to illegally possessing and selling prescription drugs, which she advised were in the decedent's vehicle. She also admitted to possessing methamphetamine in her undergarments. The first deputy sheriff requested a female deputy for a search. The second deputy sheriff (a female) responded to assist in conducting the narcotics search. Two additional deputy sheriffs assigned to the Duarte area, also responded to assist the first deputy sheriff.
	The second deputy sheriff recovered methamphetamine that had been concealed in the female's undergarments. The female was arrested for possession of a controlled substance for sales and placed in a separate patrol vehicle than the decedent.
	After being detained, the decedent also admitted to possessing methamphetamine in the center console of his vehicle. The first deputy sheriff searched the center console and recovered the methamphetamine. The decedent was arrested for possession of methamphetamine.
	As the traffic stop progressed, the decedent began to display symptoms of being under the influence of a central nervous system stimulant. The deputy sheriffs asked the decedent several times if he had ingested methamphetamine, which he denied. As the decedent's symptoms

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became more pronounced, the deputy sheriffs became more concerned for his health and safety, and again asked him if he ingested methamphetamine.

The decedent eventually admitted he had swallowed methamphetamine as they were getting pulled over, presumably to conceal the narcotics from law enforcement.

Upon learning the decedent ingested methamphetamine (at approximately, 7:17 p.m.), the deputy sheriffs immediately requested emergency medical services respond to the scene to provide emergency medical treatment for the decedent.

At 7:31 p.m., Los Angeles County Fire Department personnel arrived at the scene. The decedent was transported via ambulance to the Queen of the Valley Hospital for emergency medical treatment. Although lifesaving efforts were performed, at 8:24 p.m., on May 26, 2017, (approximately 26 hours after the initial traffic stop) the decedent succumbed to his medical injuries and was pronounced dead at the hospital. The cause of death was determined to be acute methamphetamine intoxication.

1. Briefly describe the **root cause(s)** of the claim/lawsuit:

A **Department** root cause in this incident was though the deputy sheriffs took quick action to provide emergency medical treatment for the decedent, he still died due to an unintentional narcotics overdose.

A **non-Department** root cause was at some time during a lawful traffic stop, detention, and/or arrest, the decedent intentionally swallowed a lethal amount of methamphetamine, in an apparent attempt to hide the narcotics.

2. Briefly describe recommended corrective actions: (Include each corrective action, due date, responsible party, and any disciplinary actions if appropriate)

Criminal Investigation

The incident was investigated by the Sheriff's Department Homicide Bureau and the Los Angeles County Coroner's Office (Coroner) to determine if any criminal misconduct occurred.

The Coroner determined the decedent's death was accidental methamphetamine overdose. The results of the investigation determined no further action in this matter.

Administrative Assessment

An executive evaluation of all the involved deputy sheriff's actions during this incident, determined no administrative investigation was warranted. No further administrative action was taken.
