This federal civil rights lawsuit alleges malicious prosecution after the California Court of Appeal reversed Plaintiff's 2007 conviction, resulting in his release from State prison; settlement is recommended in the amount of \$1,500,000.

This claim against the Department of Public Works alleges that Plaintiffs suffered real property damage caused by a backflow of sewage due to a mainline blockage; settlement is recommended in the amount of \$27,200.05.

This lawsuit alleges that an employee with the District Attorney's Office was subjected to discrimination, harassment, retaliation, and failure to accommodate; settlement is recommended in the amount of \$35,000.

This claim alleges that an employee of the Department of Children and Family Services was subjected to disability discrimination; settlement is recommended in the amount of \$60,000.

Briefly provide a description of the incident/event:	This matter arises out of a federal civil rights complaint filed Sept. 14, 2018 naming, former Public Defender Ronald Brown, former Chief Deputy Public Defender Kelly Emling, Public Defender Division Chief Michael Suzuki, Chief Deputy Jenny Brown, Assistant Public Defender Ruben Marquez, former Deputy Public Defender Daniel Kuperberg, Supervisor Ridley-Thomas, the Office of the Los Angeles County Public Defender and the County as defendants. Vasquez alleges that he was jailed as a civil detainee for 17 years awaiting trial to deem him a Sexually Violent Predator ("SVP"). In violation of his constitutional rights, he was never brought to trial. A Los Angeles Superior Court judge removed the Public Defender and appointed the same attorney in the Zavala matter and then dismissed the SVP petition finding that his 17 year pre-trial detention was presumptively prejudicial violating Vasquez' due process rights.

1. Briefly describe the root cause(s) of the claim/lawsuit:

Staffing reductions in the special unit resulted in continuances by attorneys who believed they had insufficient resources to take the cases to trial; failure to obtain clear time waivers from clients who preferred to remain at the state hospital during court appearances.

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

At 9:38 a.m., the Chair convened the meeting into Closed Session to discuss the items listed as 4(a) through 4(i).

**4. Report of actions taken in Closed Session.**

At 10:56 a.m., the Claims Board reconvened in open session via public teleconference line and reported the actions taken in Closed Session as follows:

**a. Andre McClelland v. County of Los Angeles, et al.  
United States District Court Case No. 2:19-CV-6755-SVW**

This federal lawsuit alleges that Plaintiff's civil rights were violated while he was incarcerated at Men's Central Jail.

Action Taken:

The Claims Board recommended to the Board of Supervisors the settlement of this matter in the amount of \$450,000.

b. **Jane Doe, a minor v. County of Los Angeles, et al.**  
**Los Angeles Superior Court Case No. 19STCV29320**

This lawsuit alleges that a minor was sexually assaulted by a Detective of the Los Angeles Sheriff's Department.

Action Taken:

The Claims Board recommended to the Board of Supervisors the settlement of this matter in the amount of \$5,500,000.

c. **Claim of Cynthia Maluto**

This claim by a former employee of the Fire Department alleges gender discrimination, harassment, failure to accommodate, and retaliation.

Action Taken:

The Claims Board approved the settlement of this matter in the amount of \$99,999.

d. **Ruchika Bharadwaj v. County of Los Angeles, et al.**  
**Los Angeles Superior Court Case No. BC 650281**

This lawsuit alleges that an employee of the Auditor-Controller was subjected to disability discrimination, failure to accommodate and retaliation.

Action Taken:

The Claims Board recommended to the Board of Supervisors the settlement of this matter in the amount of \$325,000.
