	 Symptomatic persons with: Fever or chills, Cough, Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, Fatigue, Muscle or body aches, Headache, New loss of taste or smell, Sore throat, Congestion or runny nose, Nausea or vomiting, and Diarrhea.
	Symptomatic persons who are:
	 Hospitalized Healthcare workers and other first responders Employees and residents in group living settings, and Over 65 years old or with <u>underlying health conditions</u> that place them at higher risk of serious complications
	 Asymptomatic persons: If they are part of a public health investigation If they live or work in high risk settings, such as skilled nursing facilities or homeless shelters
	 If they are a close contact of someone with a confirmed positive diagnosis of COVID-19, or If they are an essential worker.

As of 11/11/2020, Access Services has completed over 279,168 deliveries of means, grocery boxes, and paper goods to people with disabilities and seniors across all current projects. #LetsFeedLACounty is hosting a drive-thru food distribution event on 11/17/2020 at the San Fernando Valley Japanese American Community Center from 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. Total distributed to date at 49 events is 2,836 tons of food which is the equivalent 4.7 million meals provided to 83,237 households. We have now exceeded 5 million pounds of food distributed. #LetsFeedLACounty has secured 400 20-pound boxes of groceries from the LA Regional Food Bank for weekly delivery through the end of December to clients of the DHS Housing for Health program. Issuing additional CalFresh benefits up to the maximum allowed per family and allowing CalFresh recipients to purchase groceries online for delivery from Walmart and Amazon. Great Plates Delivered has a current service population: 7,659 seniors. Total meals served through this program since 5/12/2020: 2,013,087. The Great Plates Delivered Program has contracted with 75 meal providers that are employing 1,755 people. 68% of meal providers are minority-owned businesses.
