This is a recommendation to settle for \$1,000,000, inclusive of attorneys' fees and costs, a federal civil rights lawsuit filed by Mark Anthony Brown for alleged violation of his constitutional rights while an inmate at various Los Angeles County jail facilities. Mr. Brown served as an informant for the Federal Bureau of Investigation ("FBI") in August and September of 2011 when that agency was investigating civil rights abuses by deputies against inmates and other corruption in Los Angeles County jails.

Given the risks and uncertainties of litigation, a reasonable settlement at this time will avoid further litigation costs. The full and final settlement of the case in the amount of \$1,000,000 is recommended.

The primary Departmental root cause in this incident was the actions performed by Department members that resulted in the obstruction of a Federal investigation of civil rights violations in the jails.

The third **Departmental** root cause in this incident was the act of a Department member smuggling a cell phone into custody for an inmate.

Oversight and Reform
