Briefly provide a description of the incident/event:	On January 23, 2018, M.H.C., a minor male, who was at the Los Angeles County's juvenile detention facility, began experiencing stomach pain. In the course of the next day, M.H.C. was seen and examined by nurses and physicians who were providing care at the juvenile detention facility. Since M.H.C.'s symptoms were changing, the staff was unable to fully diagnose and treat him. M.H.C. was then transferred to a hospital where he was diagnosed with appendicitis. He underwent a surgery whereby his appendix was removed. M.H.C. is suffering from complications resulting from the appendicitis.

1. Briefly describe the **root cause(s)** of the claim/lawsuit:

This is an economic settlement due to contradictory statements shared by one DHS witness. The medical care provided was found to be appropriate and timely.

Nevertheless, we identified opportunities for improvement which include:

- Assessment of the patient was not completed as ordered.
- · Probation staff did not consistently communicate patient's clinical complaints to JCHS staff
- Nursing staff did not communicate the patient's report of vomiting clear liquid and saliva to the physician.
- 2. Briefly describe recommended corrective actions: (Include each corrective action, due date, responsible party, and any disciplinary actions if appropriate)
 - All appropriate personnel corrective actions were taken.
 - The A.C.N. Chair of the Patient Safety and Risk Management Committee referred the lack of communication issue to the Chief Deputy of the Probation Department
 - JCHS Nursing leadership will provide training for nurses covering communication including notification of important findings to the physician.

At 11:32 a.m., the Claims Board reconvened in open session via the public teleconference phone line and reported the actions taken in closed session as follows:

a. Sitha Thatch, et al. v. County of Los Angeles, et al. United States District Court Case No. 2:18-CV-10702

This lawsuit alleges federal civil rights violations and deliberate indifference to safety needs by Sheriff's Department jail staff for the death of an inmate at Men's Central Jail.

Action Taken:

The Claims Board recommended to the Board of Supervisors settlement of Item 4.a. in the amount of \$400,000.
