	On Saturday, August 22, 2020, at approximately 1:47 p.m., an on-duty Los Angeles County deputy sheriff assigned to patrol at Lancaster Station, was involved in a traffic collision. The deputy sheriff was driving a marked black and white patrol vehicle, eastbound on Avenue L, approaching 20th Street East, in the City of Lancaster.
	The deputy sheriff was driving Code 3 (lights and sirens were activated) to an assistance request. Due to eastbound lanes being congested, the deputy entered the westbound lanes at Avenue L (against traffic). The deputy proceeded straight and decelerated as she entered the intersection. As her vehicle entered the intersection, an unknown vehicle turned in front of her from southbound 20th Street East onto westbound Avenue L. The deputy sheriff's vehicle collided with plaintiff one's vehicle, which was traveling south on 20th Street East. The impact from the patrol vehicle caused plaintiff one's vehicle to travel into the northbound on 20th Street East, where it collided into plaintiff two's vehicle.
	Plaintiff two was transported to Antelope Valley Hospital for medical treatment for their injuries sustained in the traffic collision.

	The deputy sheriff was transported to Antelope Valley Hospital for treatment for her injuries. The deputy sheriff was wearing her seatbelt during the traffic collision.

This incident was thoroughly investigated by Lancaster Station Traffic Unit, who concluded the deputy sheriff caused the collision by travelling at an unsafe speed for conditions (Violation of California Vehicle Code section 22350) and failed to allow other motorists time to yield the right of way to her as outlined in California Vehicle Code section 21806(a).
