Briefly provide a description of the incident/event:	<p>Plaintiff alleges various injuries, including traumatic brain injuries, arising out of a traffic collision involving an on-duty Deputy Sheriff.</p> <p>On March 12, 2018, the involved Deputy Sheriff was driving in a marked Ford Crown Victoria patrol vehicle. The Deputy Sheriff was attempting to make a left turn from a private driveway on the eastside of Atlantic Boulevard in the city of Alhambra across the northbound lanes of Atlantic Boulevard and onto the southbound lanes.</p> <p>NOTE: Northbound Atlantic Boulevard has two travel lanes, with a right and left turn lane just past the driveway the Deputy Sheriff was attempting to pull out of. There is no central turning lane at the driveway and the street is divided by a solid double yellow line.</p> <p>Prior to the collision, vehicles in the marked lanes of traffic on northbound Atlantic Boulevard stopped short of the driveway the Deputy Sheriff was waiting in. Plaintiff was, simultaneously, driving in the center lane northbound on Atlantic Boulevard, prior to the center turn lane's transition into a left turn lane. Plaintiff's estimated speed was 20-30 miles per hour.</p> <p>The Deputy Sheriff proceeded out of the driveway toward the westside of Atlantic Boulevard. Plaintiff, driving in the center lane, struck the patrol vehicle.</p>



- **Employee Risk Assessment** – A comprehensive review of the involved deputy sheriff’s work history was conducted after this incident. This review included uses of force, civil claims, and complaints, as well as traffic collisions.
- **Training** – The involved employee’s unit commander recommended an 8-hour driving course as a result of this incident.



Briefly provide a description of the incident/event:	Plaintiff Kroll alleges that while she was housed at Century Regional Detention Facility (CRDF) a former Custody Assistant entered her cell and engaged in sexual activity with her.

- A Departmental root cause in this incident was the criminal misconduct committed by a member of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department.
- A Departmental root cause in this incident was a male employee supervising female inmates alone.

2. Briefly describe recommended corrective actions:

(Include each corrective action, due date, responsible party, and any disciplinary actions if appropriate)

- Criminal Investigation – After the Sheriff's Department became aware of the employee's alleged conduct, he was relieved of duty and a criminal investigation was opened. The criminal investigation resulted in the filing of four (4) felony charges against the employee. During the course of the investigation, the employee resigned from the Sheriff's Department.
- New Unit Order – A new unit order was published and approved setting strict policies and procedures regarding the supervision of females housed at CRDF.
- Workplace Monitoring – As a result of this incident, areas in and around CRDF are being monitored on a shift by shift basis by staff and management to ensure staff are adhering to the new unit order and that all cameras are operational.
- Training - As a result of this incident, Department executives wanted to reinforce to custody staff the importance of reporting behavior that is criminal and inappropriate for the work place. All custody staff will receive training on the importance of reporting behavior that is criminal and inappropriate for the workplace.




