	On March 12, 2018, the involved Deputy Sheriff was driving in a marked Ford Crown Victoria patrol vehicle. The Deputy Sheriff was attempting to make a left turn from a private driveway on the eastside of Atlantic Boulevard in the city of Alhambra across the northbound lanes of Atlantic Boulevard and onto the southbound lanes.
	NOTE: Northbound Atlantic Boulevard has two travel lanes, with a right and left turn lane just past the driveway the Deputy Sheriff was attempting to pull out of. There is no central turning lane at the driveway and the street is divided by a solid double yellow line.
	Prior to the collision, vehicles in the marked lanes of traffic on northbound Atlantic Boulevard stopped short of the driveway the Deputy Sheriff was waiting in. Plaintiff was, simultaneously, driving in the center lane northbound on Atlantic Boulevard, prior to the center turn lane's transition into a left turn lane. Plaintiff's estimated speed was 20-30 miles per hour.
	The Deputy Sheriff proceeded out of the driveway toward the westside of Atlantic Boulevard. Plaintiff, driving in the center lane, struck the patrol vehicle.

 - Training As a result of this incident, Department executives wanted to reinforce to custody staff the importance of reporting behavior that is criminal and inappropriate for the work place.
 All custody staff will receive training on the importance of reporting behavior that is criminal and inappropriate for the workplace.
