This action arises out of a California Public Records

Act ("CPRA") request from an investigative journalist seeking disclosure of a confidential report prepared by the County's third party consultant, Slalom

Consulting, following the March 3, 2020 Presidential Primary Election ("Report"). In response to the CPRA request, the County invoked exemptions and did not disclose the Report. The journalist, Kim Zetter, filed a petition for writ of mandate to seek the

disclosure of the Report. The Court partially granted the writ petition, and ordered the County to

submit a redacted version of the Report.

Given the likelihood of Petitioner recovering approximately \$115,000 or more in attorneys' fees and costs, plus additional attorneys' fees and costs associated with a motion for attorneys' fees, a full and final settlement of the case in the amount of

\$72,500 is recommended.

	Details provided in this document summarize the incident. The information provided is a culmination of various sources to provide an abstract of the incident.		
	On Wednesday, August 14, 2019, at approximately 12:25 p.m., an onduty Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department deputy sheriff, assigned to Risk Management Bureau, (Civil Litigation Unit), was driving an unmarked county vehicle, a 2012 Chevrolet Impala. The Deputy Sheriff was traveling southbound on Mednik Avenue at Third Street in the city of Los Angeles. While making a left turn onto Third Street, the Deputy Sheriff was involved in a traffic collision.		
	The Plaintiff (sole occupant) was traveling in a 1993 Chevrolet Suburban northbound on Mednik Avenue in the number one lane, traveling approximately 20 Miles Per Hour (M.P.H.). As she approached the traffic signal on Third Street, the traffic signal turned green, and she proceeded through the intersection. The Plaintiff saw the Deputy Sheriff's vehicle turn left in front of her but did not have enough time to avoid colliding into the front portion of her vehicle.		
	The Deputy Sheriff (sole occupant) was traveling southbound on Mednik Avenue. She was traveling approximately 25 M.P.H. when she approached Third Street and entered the left turning lane. The Deputy Sheriff saw the left turn arrow was green and entered the intersection, then turned left. The Deputy Sheriff saw the Plaintiff's vehicle, applied he vehicle brakes but was unable to stop, and collided into the front left wheel well of the Plaintiff's vehicle. The Deputy Sheriff stated the left turn green arrow may have turned red upon making the left turn.		
	After the collision, the Deputy Sheriff checked the Plaintiff's welfare, and made proper notifications of the incident.		
	The Plaintiff stated she did not sustain any injuries due to the collision. Medical services were not requested.		
	A Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department sergeant from East Los Angeles Station was notified of the traffic collision, and responded to the location. The sergeant conducted a Supervisor's Report of Incident, and Damage to County Vehicle investigation.		
	Medical services were not requested. A Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department sergeant from East Los Angeles Station was notified of the traffic collision, and responded to location. The sergeant conducted a Supervisor's Report of Incident,		

A California Highway Patrol (CHP) officer handled the traffic collision investigation. The Plaintiff did not report any injuries to the CHP officer. The CHP officer determined the Deputy Sheriff was the primary cause of the traffic collision in violation of California Vehicle Code Section 21801(a) – failure to yield the right of way to oncoming traffic when turning left.

A Department root cause for this incident was the Deputy Sheriff's failure to yield the right of way.

Traffic Collision Investigation

This incident was thoroughly investigated by California Highway Patrol Officer.

The collision investigation concluded the Deputy Sheriff caused the collision by failing to yield right of way – California Vehicle Code section 21801 (a).

Administrative Investigation

This incident was investigated by representatives of Risk Management Bureau to determine if any administrative misconduct occurred before, during, or after this incident.

The evaluation of this incident found the Deputy's actions were in violation of Department policy. Appropriate administrative action has been taken.

Station Traffic Collision Assessment and Review

As a result of this collision, Risk Management Bureau conducted an assessment of employee involved traffic collisions from January 01, 2018, to December 31, 2022. The audit revealed the following.
