Briefly provide a description of the incident/event:	Plaintiffs allege various claims against the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS), including violations of their civil rights resulting from the removal of their children from their custody.

#### 1. Briefly describe the **root cause(s)** of the claim/lawsuit:

The Department's handling of the two Emergency Response referral investigations were in line with its policies, and practice deficiencies were not identified upon review. Further, the matter was tried before a U.S. District Court in 2021, and the jury reached a defense verdict by unanimous decision.

With the appellate court's ruling, the Department's decision to avoid protracted litigation and seek resolution was based on a cost-benefit analysis considering a multitude of factors.

2. Briefly describe recommended corrective actions: (Include each corrective action, due date, responsible party, and any disciplinary actions if appropriate)

The Department handled this matter in accordance with its policies and practices. Nevertheless, following the Court of Appeal's ruling, DCFS consulted with attorneys to discuss warrant protocols and practices, and whether any changes were necessary given the Court's orders. The review did not identify any practice gaps.

Additionally, County Counsel and Department trainers, managers, and supervisors continue to emphasize the importance of case documentation during consultations and other meetings (including general staff and unit gatherings) to reiterate the need to keep thorough and comprehensive records.
