Briefly provide a description of the incident/event:	 On January 23, 2020, at approximately 9:25 AM, the plaintiff was traveling northbound on Orange Grove Boulevard in a 2014 Nissan Sentra and was struck by a 2018 Toyota Prius operated by the employee. The employee, traveling southbound on Orange Grove Boulevard, entered the intersection of Orange Grove Boulevard and Madeline Drive on a green light. The plaintiff also had a green light. While making a left turn onto Madeline Drive, the employee struck the plaintiff's vehicle. The vehicle operated by the plaintiff sustained damage to the front driver's side. The vehicle operated by the employee sustained front-end damage. The employee explained that the plaintiff approached at a high rate of speed and the employee was unable to see the plaintiff in time to stop. According to the vehicle incident report there was no traffic collision report from a law enforcement agency. 	

1. Briefly describe the root cause(s) of the claim/lawsuit:

The root cause of this lawsuit was due to the County driver (employee) failing to yield to incoming traffic before making a left turn.

This is a liability case because left-turning drivers are required to yield the right of way to approaching vehicles before turning.

A non-associated root cause is that the Department did not investigate the incident.
