d. Lecia L. Shorter v. County of Los Angeles, et al. United States District Court Case No. 2:21-cv-03347

This federal civil rights lawsuit alleges jail staff at Century Regional Detention Facility subjected Plaintiff to unconstitutional group strip-searches between 2010 and 2015.

Action Taken:

The Claims Board approved settlement of Item 4(d) in the amount of \$99,999.

e. <u>Emmett Brock v. County of Los Angeles, et al.</u> United States District Court Case No. 8:24-cv-00565

This federal civil rights lawsuit alleges Plaintiff was illegally detained, beaten, and arrested by a Sheriff's Department deputy.

Action Taken:

The Claims Board recommended to the Board of Supervisors settlement of Item 4(e) in the amount of \$3,000,000.

f. Frank Gutierrez, et al. v. County of Los Angeles, et al. United States District Court Case No. 2:21-cv-08238

This lawsuit alleges civil rights violations against the Department of Children and Family Services resulting in the death of a minor.

Action Taken:

The Claims Board approved settlement of Item 4(f) in the amount of \$100,000 for economic reasons.

g. <u>Jessica Castillo v. County of Los Angeles Department of Public Health</u> Los Angeles Superior Court Case No. 23STCV00176

This lawsuit concerns allegations of race discrimination, disability discrimination, and retaliation by the Department of Public Health.

Action Taken:

The Claims Board approved settlement of Item 4(g) in the amount of \$70,000.

h. Heather Skopik v. County of Los Angeles Los Angeles Superior Court Case No. 20STCV29045

This lawsuit concerns allegations that an employee of the Department of Health Services was subjected to discrimination and retaliation based on gender.

The Claims Board approved settlement of Item 4(h) in the amount of \$99,000.
