The Department's Russell Walker WATER Program honors the late Assistant Chief Lifeguard who founded the program 1986. Inspired by his own journey as LA County's first Black lifeguard in 1965, he aimed to encourage youth from diverse backgrounds to pursue ocean-related careers. Since its inception, the program has expanded significantly, reaching up to 6,000 youth annually. It focuses on teaching ocean safety skills through engaging ocean activities catering to underserved, and special needs populations.
