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SPOTLIGHT - ReddiNet

ReddiNet is an internet based emergency medical communications network utilized by LA County. It facilitates information exchange among healthcare sectors, EMS agency, EMS providers, dispatch centers, public health, and other health care system professionals in local and regional communities.

ReddiNet is utilized both on a daily basis and during disasters or exercises. It is our preferred communication method with all healthcare sectors.

Daily uses include:

- 1. Patient transfers within the community
- 2. Monitoring emergency department diversion status (for ED saturation, CT scanner down, etc.)
- 3. Hospital bed polling (HAvBED) twice daily
- 4. Information sharing

During a disaster/emergency incident:

- 1. Information sharing related to the incident (can choose to send messages to all users, to a certain area or to an individual agency or facility)
- 2. Multiple casualty incident (MCI) management with on scene EMS providers
- 3. Service level polling of all registered medical and health entities (Hospitals, ambulatory surgery centers, home health & hospice agencies, etc.)

- 4. Requesting resources. ReddiNet has a resource request module where healthcare sectors can request resources such as supplies (e.g. IV fluids), equipment (e.g. ventilators) and medical personnel.
- 5. Family Reunification Center (FRC) module utilized by the County to assist in reuniting family members ReddiNet is being offered to healthcare sectors within LA County including home health & hospice agencies. The EMS Agency will pay for this service, however, each agency will need to sign a user agreement with the Hospital Association of Southern California (HASC) who owns ReddiNet.

**Service Levels for Home Health/Hospice Agencies (HHH)

If a ReddiNet Service Level poll is sent out, each agency should determine which of the following 4 color categories they fit into based on the current condition of the agency. Respond with one of the following color choices:

Green (Normal Operations): No assistance from the jurisdiction is required. Agency is operational and is in business-as-usual mode. **Can assist with response by accepting additional patients**.

Yellow (Under Control): No assistance from the jurisdiction is required. Agency is operational and is in business-as-usual mode. **Unable to accept additional patients**.

Orange (Modified Services): Some assistance from the jurisdiction is required. Agency has begun to modify their services as they are unable to care for and/or reach all patients.

Black (No Services): **Unable to care for/reach patients.** Assistance from jurisdiction is required to reach patients who have been triaged as high risk. Will be referred to County OEM/EOC.
