The SARS—19 Pandemic has changed education as we knew it, but it has not halted the endeavors of the Los Angeles County College of Nursing to prepare the future frontline essential workers. Despite the mandates by the governor, the CDC, and the County Public Health Department the College implemented alternative teaching methods. The skills lab coordinator secured personal protective equipment (PPE) so that students would have the required PPE to continue clinical in the face of a nation wide shortage of PPE supplies. The college transitioned from face to face learning to distance learning implementing the use of voice over recordings for lecture. In July students were able to resume hands on learning in the skills lab after the skills lab coordinator reconfigured the skills labs to accommodate for 6 ft distancing and initiated the use of technology for students to sign up for skills lab practice.




## BEHIND THE MASK-CONTINUED




#### EBSCO SEARCHING TIPS

As many of you are navigating the electronic resources for the first time, listed are several tips for successful searching.



- 1. Set up the search with specific requirements by using the **advanced search** feature of CINAHL, here you will have more options to narrow your search.
- 2. Pre-select the following parameters to ensure that the results comply with the requirements of your grading rubrics. Select **Full Text**, and enter the **Published Date range** i.e. 2015-2020.
- 3. Scroll halfway down and select **First Author is Nurse** if required.
- 4. Now you can proceed with a keyword search of your topic. You will notice that the parameters of your search are selected under the limiters section in the left bar.
- 5. With the limiters in place you can continue to narrow your search by selecting **Academic Journals.**
- 6. You might want to review the breakdown of topics under **Subject: Major Heading.** The number inside the parenthesis tells you how many articles you will find in that topic. This may be helpful if you are unsure of your topic as it conveniently separates the articles by subject matter.
- 7. You can continue to narrow the search based on your topic by selecting **Age** and/or **Gender**.



## Don't Forget!


Your local public library is a great resource for digital content. You can download free e-books and audiobooks with a library card.

## **ZOTERO**


What is it? Why should you use it?

Writing your paper in APA style can be a challenge. Zotero is a citation management software that works with your word processing platform.

Zotero allows you to transfer all of your saved EBSCO references and drag and drop webpages into its storage. When it comes time to enter an in-text citation you can scroll through the Zotero interface and it will drop the correct citation wherever you placed the cursor.

BUT WAIT...THERES MORE! When you are ready to create the Reference page, Zotero will use all citations used in your paper and will alphabetize and insert in the APA 7th edition format, the list of your references in the correct formatting.

Zotero is free to download and works with most operating systems and word processing software. For more information visit www.zotero.org
