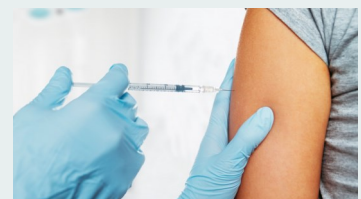


HIT ME WITH YOUR BEST SHOT

As nurses begin to celebrate national nurses week, and teachers national teachers month, the nation continues to battle the COVID 19 virus globally. California is able to celebrate as the first Covid 19 vaccines that rolled out in December has supported the reopening of several of California's counties. Since the initiation of vaccines the numbers of Covid 19 positive clients has decreased. At the time of this publication Los Angeles County's numbers have decreased so much that they are now in the yellow tier. LAC+USC published their Covid19 positive cases this week and there were a total of 23 Covid19 positive clients in the hospital with only 4 of them being treated in the ICU. Compare that with the numbers that were seen in December, over 230 Covid19 positive cases with 60 in the ICU, it is evident that the right shots in the arms has made a difference. CONAH restrictions will certainly be changing soon to align with the State's recommendations. As a result of the lowered numbers CONAH will be hosting an in-person graduation for the Spring 2021-I graduates on May 27, albeit with masks and social distanc-

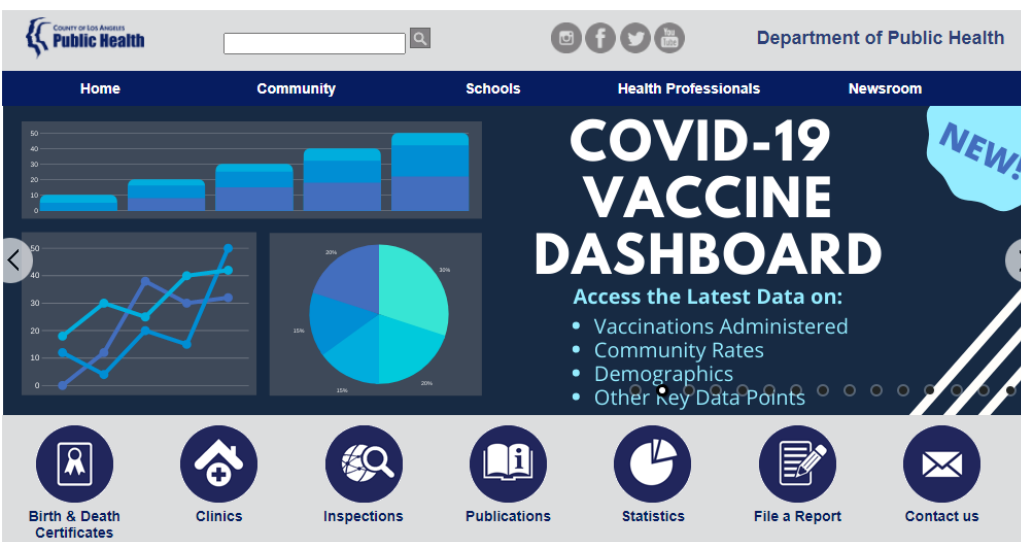

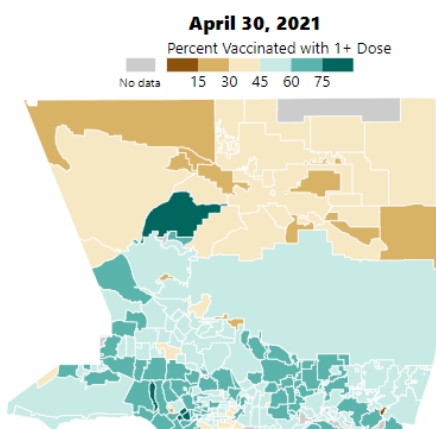

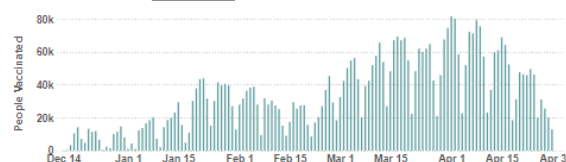

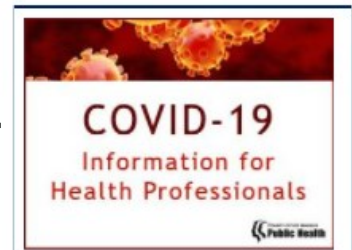
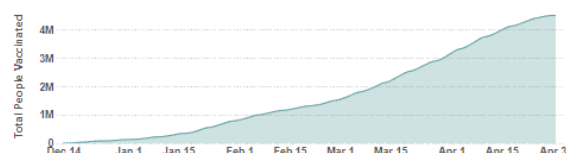
Track vaccinations over time with this interactive tool.

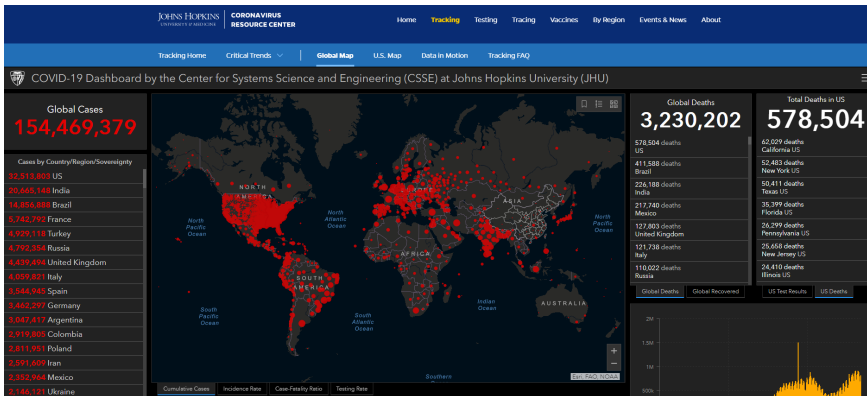

Pay

The median annual wage for registered nurses was \$73,300 in May 2019. The median wage is the wage at which half the workers in an occupation earned more than that amount and half earned less. The lowest 10 percent earned less than \$52,080, and the highest 10 percent earned more than \$111,220.

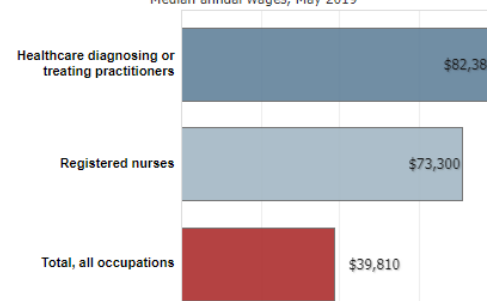
In May 2019, the median annual wages for registered nurses in the top industries in which they worked were as follows:

Government	\$79,790
Hospitals; state, local, and private	75,030
Ambulatory healthcare services	70,330
Nursing and residential care facilities	66,250
Educational services; state, local, and private	63,690

Nurses who work in hospitals and nursing care facilities usually work in shifts to provide round-the-clock coverage. They may work nights, weekends, and holidays. They may be on call, which means that they are on duty and must be available to work on short notice. Nurses who work in offices, schools, and other places that do not provide 24-hour care are more likely to have regular business hours.
