### APRIL IS ARMENIAN AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH



On March 27, 2018, LA County Supervisors Kathryn Barger and Janice Hahn authored a motion, unanimously approved by the Board of Supervisors, to proclaim the month of April as Armenian History Month.

Los Angeles County is home to the greatest number of Armenians outside of Armenia. Each year, during the latter part of April, this Board commemorates the Armenian Genocide that began on April 24, 1915, and resulted in the tragic loss of 1.5 million innocent lives. Since 2017, this Board has also declared the month of April as Armenian History Month in recognition of the rich history of and tremendous contributions by this resilient community.

Celebrate the heritage, culture, and contributions of Arab Americans and Arabic-speaking Americans. The Arab American Institute reported that about 15,000 Middle Eastern immigrants from Egypt, Jordan, Palestine, and Iraq migrated to the U.S. yearly in the 1960s. The celebration of the holiday has previously been observed sporadically in various states and at different times of the year since the 1990s until 2017 when Arab America began a national initiative to coordinate all states under National Arab American Heritage Month. # THE HEALTHY FOOD KICKSTARTER PROJECT GRANT APPLICATION

LA County is partnering with Community Services Unlimited Inc. to provide grants to qualifying organizations and businesses that wish to launch or expand equitable food distribution programs in specifically identified target areas within the County. Nonprofits and private/for-profit enterprises are eligible to apply for these funds. Applications seeking to serve communities that have been historically underfunded and resourced will be prioritized.

LOS ANGELES REFORMS FOR EQUITY AND PUBLIC ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF INSTITUTIONAL RACISM (L.A. REPAIR) PARTICIPATORY BUDGETING



L.A. REPAIR is the first <u>participatory budget pilot program</u> that will distribute roughly \$8.5 million directly to nine L.A. City neighborhoods, called REPAIR Zones which can be located using the online address search tool.

### GUARANTEED INCOME PROGRAM FOR SINGLE MOMS IN EL MONTE



The City of El Monte has a new <u>financial assistance program</u> for single mothers impacted by the Coronavirus. **Eligible applicants will be randomly selected to receive \$500** a month for one year.

# Eligible participants:

- · Must live within El Monte city limits.
- . Be a single female head of household with no spouse or partner present.
- · Have children living in the household between ages of 0-17
- Have a verified income at or below the federal poverty line (according to the 2023 U.S. Department of Commerce guidelines).
- Be able to show a need for financial assistance due to being impacted by the Coronavirus pandemic.
- Must be able to submit documents verifying school enrollment, proof of residency, proof of income, and a government issued ID.

LADRP helps with landlord-tenant disputes (rent, utilities, deposits), financial disputes (credit card bills, payday loans, personal loans, medical debt) and many other disputes.
