LA County College of Nursing LVN to RN Program

Los Angeles County offers one of the strongest public-sector benefits packages in the nation. Some benefits you don't use or need can be converted into cash.

An entry-level LVN hired into CHS this fall can expect to earn a monthly salary of \$6,061 monthly or \$72,734 annually. Benefits for this position depend on family size and plan choices, but in an illustrative example (available in a more detailed handout) total an additional \$20,968 annually.
