Jared Hagar grew up skating with his twin brother in Tehachapi, California. From skate parks to snowboarding mountains, Jared has always lived life in motion — until a traumatic brain injury stopped everything.

In 2019, Jared slipped and hit his head while skateboarding. He fell into a coma and woke up two weeks later, missing half his skull. As a carpenter working as an independent contractor and without employer-provided health insurance, his first question

wasn't "Will I walk again?" It was, "How will I pay for this?"

**Medicaid was his lifeline.** Especially during the two and a half years he lived without half his skull.

During the hardest months of surgeries and recoveries — Medicaid covered it all: hospital stays, seizure treatment, medications, ambulance rides, and the skull implant that put him back together. He lived at Rancho Los Amigos for months before and after surgery, building not just physical strength, but a deep connection with a healing community.

Today, Jared is living his best life — back on his board, driving again, working with his hands, and dreaming big. He's surrounded by the community that lifted him up and is giving back to others on their own healing journeys. **He's alive. Independent. Thriving.**
