

Encampment Resolution Fund Skid Row Outcomes

The State of California provided Los Angeles County with a \$60 million Encampment Resolution Fund grant to reduce unsheltered homelessness in Skid Row. The County used the Skid Row Action Plan to design an encampment resolution project that leveraged community assets, existing outreach teams, interim housing and permanent housing to reduce unsheltered homelessness. The grant is a three-year grant that started July 1, 2023.


With the combination of grant and leveraged funds, the original grant proposed that, in a three-year period:

- 3,000 people would receive a service from an outreach team, access center or health clinic
- 2,500 people would move into interim housing
- 2,000 people would move into permanent housing

- 9,578 people received a service from an outreach team, access center or health clinic
- 2,590 people have moved into interim housing
- 1,475 people have moved into permanent housing
