COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course will include a comprehensive review of human trafficking including identifying signs of trafficking such as grooming tactics of exploiters, trauma-informed engagement and awareness of victim-sensitive language when interacting with suspected victims of trafficking; encountering resistance to help; advocacy, community education efforts, and accessing relevant resources.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES: Identify signs of human trafficking, including recognizing grooming tactics of exploiters. Gain an increased understanding of victims not identifying as “victims” and potential resistance to help. Build insight into trauma-informed engagement, including becoming familiar with victim-sensitive language when interacting with potential victims of trafficking. Identify resources in the community for support, information, and engagement.
