The Skid Row Care Campus is a welcoming, safe space for services, connection and community. The campus offers a place for Skid Row residents to access hygiene care, case management, health care, harm reduction supplies and more.

CAMPUS FEATURES

Safe Services Space

- Community Ambassadors from the community to welcome and support guests
- Onsite recreation areas including stage, pet area, garden, and picnic tables
- Service booths with rotating resources from county and nonprofit agencies
- Case management
- Toilets, showers, laundry, charging stations
- Arts, spirituality, wellness, and community-building activities

Board & Care Facility

- 48 beds in a licensed Residential Care Facility for the Elderly
- Support with activities of daily living, physical and behavioral health needs

Harm Reduction Health Hub

- Space for people to gather safely and receive the services they need
- Drop-in center and access to light-touch health care
- First methadone clinic on Skid Row.
- Respite beds for people who may need medical observation due to withdrawal, medical conditions, or post-overdose reversal.



OUR APPROACH

In June 2022, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors directed the creation of the Skid Row Action Plan (SRAP). SRAP is a community planning initiative that expands access to interim and permanent housing, health care, harm reduction, and other supportive services. The plan addresses systemic racism and disinvestment in Skid Row and supports a thriving community. The Skid Row Care Campus is envisioned as the long-term home for many components of SRAP.

WHO WE ARE

The campus is a collaborative effort among LA County Departments of Health Services, Mental Health and Public Health. The community organizations running the campus include Homeless Health Care Los Angeles, Wesley Health Centers and Social Model Recovery Systems.
