LA General and County Veterans Affairs Honor Service Members with Luncheon and Green Light Display

Los Angeles, CA — November 7, 2025 — *Los Angeles General Medical Center (LA General)*, in partnership with the *Los Angeles County Department of Military & Veterans Affairs*, honored employees who have served in the United States Armed Forces during its Second Annual Veterans and Active Military Staff Luncheon on November 6. The event celebrated the hospital's veteran and active-duty team members for their continued service—first to the nation, and now to the community they heal every day.

As part of this year's observance, the Historic General Hospital building has been illuminated in green from November 4 through November 11 in recognition of Operation Green Light for Veterans, a national initiative honoring the courage and sacrifice of those who served. To conclude the week-long tribute, the main LA General Medical Center sign will be illuminated in green on Veterans Day, November 11, symbolizing the hospital's enduring commitment to veterans and their families.

"Lighting our medical center in green and gathering for this luncheon gives us a moment to pause and say thank you—to our veterans, those in uniform and those who serve every day at LA General," said Jorge Orozco, Chief Executive Officer at LA General. "Your dedication and courage inspire our entire community of caregivers."

During the luncheon, certificates of appreciation were presented to staff members who have served in the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, and Coast Guard.
