AUTHORIZATION TO AMEND LEGAL ENTITY AGREEMENT
WITH MARYVALE FOR FISCAL YEAR 2007-08
(SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICT 1)
(3 VOTES)

SUBJECT

Request approval to amend the Department of Mental Health's Legal Entity Agreement with Maryvale to increase the maximum contract amount by \$170,000 to \$3,009,200 for services rendered during Fiscal Year 2007-08.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:

- Approve and instruct the Director of Mental Health, or his designee, to prepare, sign and execute three copies of Amendment No. 5 (Amendment) (substantially similar to the Attachment) to the existing Department of Mental Health (DMH) Legal Entity (LE) Agreement No. MH120166 (Agreement) with Maryvale for Fiscal Year (FY) 2007-08. The Amendment will be effective upon Board approval and will increase the maximum contract amount (MCA) for Maryvale for FY 2007-08 by \$170,000, from \$2,839,200 to \$3,009,200. The increased amount will be funded by Federal Financial Participation (FFP) Medi-Cal revenue of \$85,000, Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (EPSDT) State general funds (SGF) of \$72,556, and matching County general funds (CGF) of \$12,444.
- 2. Delegate authority to the Director of Mental Health, or his designee, to prepare, sign, and execute future amendments to the Agreement with Maryvale to reflect any additional amounts owed as a result of the Federal Certified Public Expenditure (CPE) regulations, and/or Cost Report and State Audit Settlement processes, provided that approval by County Counsel and the Chief Executive Officer (CEO), or their designees, is obtained prior to any such amendment and your Board has appropriated sufficient funds for all changes.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

DMH pays contractors for services provided to Short-Doyle/Medi-Cal (SD/MC) eligible clients based on approved claims from the State. All claims submitted by DMH to the State are accompanied by a DMH certification on a standard State form representing the claims are medically necessary services to Medi-Cal beneficiaries. Until February 2008, the certification also stated that the County had sufficient funds to pay the local match.

Since that time, the State has required DMH to incur the actual expense prior to the State submitting claims for FFP reimbursement. In order to accommodate this change, the State and DMH negotiated a bifurcated process in which DMH signs a second certification after payments to contractors have been made to satisfy the CPE for Medi-Cal claiming purposes.

The bifurcated process, however, requires DMH to verify that all claims contained in the State approval file have been paid. Previously, if a contractor exceeded the MCA, DMH would stop processing payments until the cost settlement process determined the final payment due to the provider and, if necessary at that time, would execute an amendment to the contract under delegated authority or request Board approval of an amendment if the amount exceeded delegated authority.

In order to meet the State's certification requirements, DMH no longer has the option of waiting until cost settlement to pay the providers. Therefore, an amendment to the Maryvale Agreement is required at this time in order for DMH to be able to make the payment to Maryvale for services provided and then certify the CPE on approximately \$195,798,000 of total payments to obtain reimbursement of \$99,066,000 of Federal funds for claims submitted from July 25, 2008, to December 31, 2008. All other providers have been paid for services rendered during that time.

Furthermore, in order to make the additional payments beyond the MCA, DMH has been amending the LE agreements, where necessary, to increase the MCA up to the 20 percent increase allowed under delegated authority from your Board. The last Board-approved MCA for Maryvale of \$2,366,000 for FY 2007-08 has been increased by 20 percent to \$2,839,200 through Amendment No. 4.

Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

The recommended Board actions support the County Strategic Plan Goal 4, Fiscal Responsibility by ensuring that DMH receives Federal reimbursement for Medi-Cal services.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

There is no impact on net County cost.

The Amendment in the amount of \$170,000 is fully funded with FFP Medi-Cal revenue totaling \$85,000, EPSDT SGF totaling \$72,556, and CGF totaling \$12,444. Sufficient appropriation is available in DMH's FY 2008-09 Adopted Budget for the Amendment.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

Maryvale is located at 7600 E. Graves Avenue, Rosemead, California 91770, in Supervisorial District 1, Mental Health Service Area 3. Maryvale is a residential treatment center operated as a nonsectarian, nonprofit corporation by the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul. Founded in 1856 as The Los Angeles Orphan Asylum, Maryvale has continued to adapt to the needs of children and now offers programs for children whose needs cannot be met in their own homes or in foster homes. Maryvale serves children who are dependents of the court and are placed by the Department of Children and Family Services and/or the Probation Department from Los Angeles County and other counties in California. These children may be dually diagnosed as emotionally disturbed and/or neurologically damaged.

The Amendment format has been approved as to form by County Counsel. The CEO has reviewed the proposed actions. Administrative staff of DMH will continue to administer and supervise the Agreement and ensure that the Agreement provisions and Departmental policies are being followed.

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES

This action will have no impact on current services.

AMENDMENT NO. ___5__

THIS AMENDMENT is made and entered into this ____ day of _____, 2009, by and between the COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES (hereafter "County") and Maryvale (hereafter "Contractor").

WHEREAS, County and Contractor have entered into a written Agreement, dated June 12, 2007, identified as County Agreement No. MH120166, and any subsequent amendments (hereafter collectively "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, for Fiscal Year (FY) 2007-08 only, County and Contractor intend to amend Agreement only as described hereunder; and

WHEREAS, for FY 2007-08 only, County and Contractor intend to amend Agreement to increase the Maximum Contract Amount (MCA) to enable County to make additional payments to Contractor to facilitate the State's implementation of the Federal Certified Public Expenditure (CPE) rules; and

WHEREAS, for FY 2007-08 only, County and Contractor intend to amend Agreement to <u>increase</u> Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (EPSDT) - Federal Financial Participation (FFP) funds by \$85,000, <u>increase</u> EPSDT - State General Funds (SGF) by \$72,556, and <u>increase</u> County General Funds (CGF) by \$12,444; and

WHEREAS, for FY 2007-08 only, the MCA will increase by \$170,000 with a revised MCA of \$3,009,200.

NOW, THEREFORE, County and Contractor agree that Agreement shall be amended only as follows:

- Paragraph 4 (FINANCIAL PROVISIONS), Subparagraph C (Reimbursement For Initial Period) shall be deleted in its entirety and the following substituted therefor:
 - B. Reimbursement For Initial Period: The Maximum Contract Amount for the Initial Period of this Agreement as described in Paragraph 1 (TERM) shall not exceed THREE MILLION NINE THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$3,009,200) and shall consist of County, State, and/or Federal funds as shown on the Financial Summary. This Maximum Contract Amount includes Cash Flow Advance which is repayable through cash and/or appropriate Service Function Code (SFC) units and/or actual and allowable costs as authorized by other provisions of this Agreement. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, in no event shall County pay Contractor more than this Maximum Contract Amount for Contractor's performance hereunder during the Initial Period. Furthermore, Contractor shall inform County when up to 75 percent (75%) of the Maximum Contract Amount has been incurred. Contractor shall send such notice to those persons and addresses which are set forth in Paragraph 61 (NOTICES)."
- 2. The Financial Summary for Fiscal Year 2007-08 only shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with The Financial Summary 5 (Attachment I) for Fiscal Year 2007-08 only, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. All references in Agreement to The Financial Summary for Fiscal Year 2007-08 shall be deemed amended to state "Financial Summary 5 for Fiscal Year 2007-08."

- Contractor shall provide services in accordance with Contractor's Fiscal Year
 2007-08 Negotiation Package for this Agreement and any addenda thereto approved in writing by director.
- Except as provided in this Amendment, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
